First International Conference on Circulating Fluidized Beds

Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, 18–20 November 1985

ORGANIZED by the Technical University of Nova Scotia and sponsored by the Canadian Society of Chemical Engineers and Nova Scotia Power Corporation.

Circulating Fluidized Beds are being increasingly favoured by utility, chemical and metallurgical industries for generation of steam and a range of other processes. A large number of commercial Circulating Fluidized Beds are in operation and the list of commercial installations is growing. The First International Conference on Circulating Fluidized Beds will provide an opportunity for practitioners and researchers in industry, government, consulting, laboratories, and universities to exchange current information and to discuss trends in this new technology.

Papers are invited on the following aspects of Circulating Fluidized Beds:

- Hydrodynamics
- Heat and mass transfer
- Combustion of coal and other fuels
- Non-combustion processes
- Commercial applications and operating experiences
- Component developments
- Environment.

Papers accepted for presentation must not have been published elsewhere and will be available for publication in the formal proceedings.
