



by Walter Brueggemann





Who Will Be Saved?

“Who will be saved?” is almost always a question about *them*, and rarely about *us*. Thinking itself wrapped securely in the everlasting arms, the church has spent much of its history speculating on whether God will allow anyone else to join the party.

- One of today's most respected theologians contends that the church should stop asking “Who will be saved?” and ask instead “How is God calling me to participate in the redemption of the world?”

Q Who was the first Christian martyr?

He was arrested and stoned to death. His last words were a prayer asking God to forgive the men who were about to kill him. Paul stood by and watched him die.

Peter sent all the weeping women away and prayed for her. Then he turned to Tabitha and asked her to get up. The woman opened her eyes and sat up, completely healed.

Q What job did Cornelius do?

A He was a Roman centurion.

Cornelius had lived and served God for some time but he did not know Jesus. God told him in a vision to send men to get Peter to come to him.

Peter talked to Cornelius, his friends and family, explaining that Jesus had been sent by God. Jesus had been crucified and then resurrected from the dead so that anyone who believed in him could have their sins forgiven. The Holy Spirit came to all those in the house who believed and they were baptised, the first Gentiles to become baptised Christians.
