A review of the principal developments in the important chemical producing countries, as well as many of the major and some of the minor chemical-consuming markets.

This annual report of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research of Great Britain gives the progress of research in all projects of the department.

These include fuel, food, building, roads, forest products, metallurgy, water pollution, radio, illumination, lubrication, atmosphere pollution, X-ray analysis, and a number of miscellaneous problems.

For the interest of the readers the report on food investigation contains studies of the following: acidification in muscle post mortem, variation of the glycogen content in pork flesh, effect of irradiation on bacteria, the rotting of eggs, factors controlling the quality of hams, bacon, and pork, distribution of Vitamin A in certain fish, the storage of fish under various conditions, storage and freezing of fruits and vegetables, canning, thermal properties of butter and water relations of dried food packages.—C.
