1960 Short Course Approved

MONG THE ACTIONS taken by the Governing Board of the American Oil Chemists' Society in session September 27, 1959, at the Statler Hilton hotel in Los Angeles was approval of a 1960 short course on edible oils at the University of Illinois, upon the recommendation of the Education Committee, of which J. C. Cowan is chairman.

Other actions included adoption of a record \$108,000 budget for 1960; permission to Maria Jakab of Brazil to translate portions of the Methods of Analysis into Portuguese; appointment of C. L. Hoffpauir as chairman of the 1962 annual meeting in New Orleans; and selection of New Orleans and Chicago for the spring and fall meetings of 1964, respectively.

Approved for emeritus membership were the following: J. T. R. Andrews (1930); A. E. King (1925); Lamar Kishlar (1935); T. L. Rettger (1921); and Procter Thomson (1933). Kishlar was president of the Society in 1943, and Thomson in 1953. Andrews had been a member of the Uniform Methods Committee since 1937 and chairman since 1949. The others had been active in committee work.

N. D. Embree, president of the Society, presided at this fall meeting of the Governing Board. The next meeting will be in Dallas on April 3.
