"TONY SWAIN 1922-1987: TEN YEARS ON"

This mini-symposium was held in the Jodrell Laboratory, Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, Richmond, Surrey on Thursday, 3 July 1997, under the chairmanship of Dr David Cutler (Kew). It was held in conjunction with the annual Editorial Board meeting of *Phytochemistry* and was attended by Board members, former colleagues and friends. Gilbert Richards, former managing director of Pergamon Press and a close friend, was also present.

Professor Tony Swain, who ran the ARC Unit in Biochemistry at Kew from 1970 to 1976, was the founding editor of both *Phytochemistry* and *Biochemical Systematics and Ecology*. He was an inspiring and brilliant research scientist, who contributed immensely to the advancement of knowledge in many areas of phytochemistry.
