The Phytochemical Society of North America (PSNA) is a nonprofit scientific organization with membership open to those interested in phytochemistry and the role of plant substances in related disciplines. Annual meetings featuring symposium topics of current general interest and contributed papers by conference participants are held throughout Canada, the United States, and Mexico. PSNA meetings provide participants with exposure to cutting-edge research presented by prominent international scientists, but remain intimate enough to allow interaction and collegiality. The 2003 annual meeting was held in Peoria, Illinois and featured several symposia on secondary metabolism in model plant systems. The 2004 meeting in Ottawa, Ontario, 25–29 July, will be held jointly with the International Society of Chemical Ecology. A biannual Society newsletter keeps members informed of new developments, and provides a forum for the exchange of information and ideas. *Phytochemistry* publishes many of the membership's papers.
