*Johann Pramberger Sr. patents new type of piano called a Sirenion*

**1824**

*Pramberger receives patents for design work on  
piano strings and metal soundboard*

**1867**

*Pramberger piano receives Bronze Medal at Paris exposition*

**1873**

*Pramberger piano receives Medal for Technical Excellence in Vienna*

**1913**

*Pramberger family members begin working at  
Steinway & Sons®, NY*

**1950**

*Anton Pramberger family immigrates to New York City.  
Anton begins work at Steinway & Sons®*

**1958**

*Joseph J. Pramberger begins work at Steinway & Sons®, NY*
