

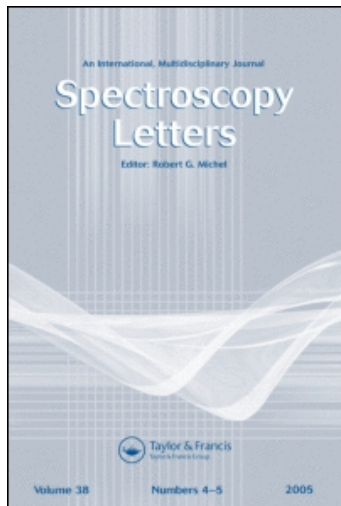
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Books Available

SOLAR NEUTRONS THE FIRST THIRTY YEARS edited by John N. Bahcall, Raymond Davis, Jr., Peter Parker, Alexei Smirnov, Roger Ulrich pub Addison-Wesley Pub. Reading, MA, Hardback 1995 440p+ XXIII

This is a new volume in the series 'Frontier in Physics.' It attempts to summarize the development and status of this field through the past thirty years. It is split into five main sections 1. Standard Model Expectations 2. Solar Neutrino Experiments 3. Nuclear Fusion Reactions 4. Physics Beyond the Standard Model 5. Helioseismology, each section being divided into numerous subsections. Each section is introduced by an acknowledge expert in that field who tries to write it for the non-expert and expert alike-a different task. Each subsection is written by a difficult author or group of authors.

The book represents a monumental piece of work and is an excellent reference book for all associated with this field.
