club, Morecombe's courses have to be changed from time to time, but this is an expensive and risky business, no one knowing how the course will play until it is completed.

By using Superior's construction set he was able to edit the course, playing the new design and working out the yardage and so on. He found some problems with the out of bounds hazard, but even the background scenes were incredibly apt for the Morecombe course.

With redesign and expansion on the cards for the Morecombe club, they could be the first golf club to use an innovative and cost effective way of developing their course.

#### Tiny talk

A PROGRESS report on Smalltalk 80 from Smalltalk Express (081-200 0220) came our way this month. Not only can education users obtain a 50 per cent discount on the £540 price, but a slightly curtailed version is available now which will work on an Archimedes with 2Mb and a hard drive.

In addition they also had news on the Active Book. Brainchild of Acorn founder Herman Hauser, the Active Book is a portable computer which will read your handwriting. It should be available early in 1991.

Using Acorn's Risc set, Smalltalk is the power behind the handwriting recognition software.

Still on the Smalltalk front comes news of an exciting development from ParcPlace Systems, US authors of Smalltalk 80.

They are working on a unified Smalltalk system which will work under any windowing environment, whether the Archimedes Risc OS, the Apple Macintosh, Windows 3 on the PC or XWindows on a Unix machine.

In theory you'd be able to write a program on any machine sure that it would work equally well under a different system – as long as it was written in Smalltalk.

There is a long way to go yet, and whether this will mean in reality simplified porting or just taking a disc from one machine to another remains to be

#### Interest rates hit Acorn

ACORN'S net profit on normal trading for the first six months of this year was 50 per cent down on the comparable period in 1989 even though sales revenue remained the same. High interest rates were blamed.

Ordinary activities for the six months to June 30 produced a net profit of £42,000 (£80,000 in 1989) but this was knocked down to a net loss of £242,000 by the failure of Torus Group.

Acorn held a 25.3 per cent share of Torus and has had to write off its £242,000 investment.

Announcing the disappointing results, Acorn played up the fact that sales had not dropped dramatically. The first half of 1990 brought sales revenue of £22,074,000, just slightly lower than the £22,102,000 achieved for the same period last year.

Hefty interest charges lopped £319,000 off the operating profit of £361,000.

The latest figures show a dramatic fall compared with the first half of 1989 when the net profit was £2,049,000. This was helped by extraordinary income of £1.2 million from Olivetti and Networks OSN for sales and marketing rights.

For the first time, A3000 and Archimedes computers

became the group's biggest selling products during this period. Almost 100,000 units have been sold since 1987.

Continuing research and development has produced new Acorn products this year and Acorn has also invested in its own trading operations in Australia and New Zealand.

"In a difficult economic climate, the board believes that tightly controlled overheads, the policy of delivering high quality products and the maintenance of investment in product development, sales channels and staff enable Acorn to face the future with confidence", said the company's head, Sam Wauchope.

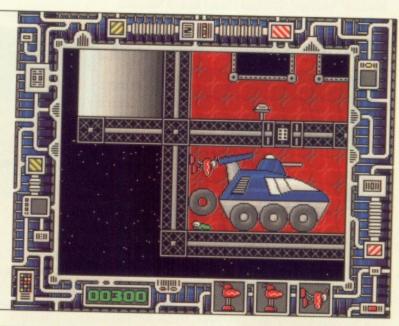

Traditionally this is a very difficult concept to put across, and ESM's approach was praised at the Historical Association's annual conference.

Available for the BBC Micro, Time Traveller allows pupils to record and interpret historical data which can then be printed as a visual timeline of specific events.

By studying and interpreting their chosen timelines, students will be able to gain a better understanding of chronology and such terms as years ago and consequence.

Children are encouraged to add the dates and events them-

selves into a simple time framework from 9999BC to AD2100. Entered in chronological order the information is then displayed in years, decades or centuries.

The National Curriculum requires that "pupils should ... employ appropriate chronological conventions by using timelines". Time Traveller aims to help in the understanding of the sequencing of events, making comparisons and examining cause and effect.

Also ideal in cross-curricular activities as it encourages pupils to build up a library of data on a whole variety of subjects.

Initially Time Traveller comes with a sample data disc, 100 Years of History 1891-1990, and the usual guides as well as guidance on use with the National Curriculum.

#### **Schools** video cost cut

INTERACTIVE video has been slow reaching schools because it cost too much, says Dr Colin Wormand of Eltec Computers. Now, in conjunction with the British Nuclear Forum, they have announced a claimed lowest price ever for a complete computer-driven interactive

schools video system.
Costing £1,899 for orders placed before December 31, the system consists of a 2Mb BBC A3000, Philips Laservision 406 disc player, Allied Interactive genlock and a set of three double-sided science and maths discs.

The discs, aimed at the secondary school, were designed by the Interactive Learning Project at Newcastle University. Covering the National

Curriculum to GSCE level, they have been tested over the past year in 70 schools.

BNF stress that they have exercised no editorial control over the content of the discs, which cover energy, radiation, statistics and probability.

#### **DTO** update

HAVING reviewed Desktop Office from Minerva (0392 437756) last month it seems that some useful suggestions made by users have caused Minerva to update the software free of charge to all registered

Changes include visible page breaks in DTOWord, and the print sub-menu now offers the facility to to select, print or preview a selected block. Previewing is much more friendly as it stops at the end of each screen.

There are extensive additions to the spreadsheet, including a size increase, and there is a labels option in DTOChart as well as improvements to the DTOBase program. All in all if you haven't registered now may be the time to do so.

#### **Authoring Arc**

AS The Micro User went to press, Westland System Assessment (0935 24545) was poised for the major launch of a new authoring system based around the Archimedes.

Called Avanti, it is designed to produce training programs using text, video, audio and CD rom. An offshoot of Westland Helicopters, the company produces computerbased training packages.

It specialists in programs for aviation and military use, but the new system will lend itself to much wider markets.

Based on a Windows system, Avanti allows users to move easily between text and graphics and to go down to basic code with equal ease. It has already been tested on a number of flight training applications.

"The ease of use and scope of the system makes it ideal for any kind of training application", said a Westland spokesman.

#### **Festive breaks**

ELECTRON, BBC Micro and Archimedes owners can expect the Christmas offering from Superior Software (0652 58585) in the shops by the end of November.

Called Masterbreak, it is a combination of trivia quiz and snooker with more than 1,500 questions covering music, science and nature, geography,

history, sport, passtimes and the arts.

Masterbreak throws up multiple choice questions in a snooker format. Players go for a red ball question and if they answer it correctly, they can go on to a colour. The Archimedes

version has been written by Superior Golf author John Bell.

"The advantage of Masterbreak over games like Trivial Pursuit is that it can be played by one person", said Superior boss Steve Hanson.

"You can challenge yourself

to achieve a break of 147 and because of the structure of the game, you can't cheat. It can also be played by up to four people and should be a popular package for Christmas"

#### Wetlands conservation

BRITAIN'S ponds and wetlands are increasingly being sacrificed on the altar of urban development. Now, BBC Micros and Archimedes machines are being used to educate the next generation in the importance of preserving these vital environmental assets.

Mercury Educational Products (071-287 5060) and Granada Television have linked with The Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust to produce a key datafile supporting the nationawide Pondwatch survey co- ordinated by the Trust. The Key datafiles are used by schools in conjunction with ITV's schools programs and to date, 30,000 have been sold in this country.

This latest datafile inloudes the results of the Pondwatch survey which started in 1989. More than 500 groups and individuals – a total of 2,500 people – have been involved in the survey throughout the UK. They have monitored local ponds and canals by "dipping" the water over a nine month period.

From this, they have recorded the location of the water source, its physical makeup, its age and its use by man plus the animal and plant life in and around the water.

The huge wealth of results has been entered into the ITV Schools Key datahandling package and a specially written mapping and graphics package has been created to enable schools to analyse and display the results on regional and national maps. A further package will also allow results of schools' own surveys to be displayed and compared with the nationwide results.

"Yuppie urban developments are increasingly draining the wetlands and marshes which are some of our most fertile areas", said Dominic Johnson of Mercury Educational Products. "These areas are micro-communities in their own right and it is vital to the environment that they be preserved. The best way to do that is by starting at the bottom level and educating the children who will be responsible for the environment in years to come."

Software for the Pondwatch Key Datafile is now almost complete. Some final readings will be added in the Spring and it will be available to schools by the end of March next year. Price, £12.

Working with Granada Television, Mercury Educational Products are also to produce a datafile on nitrate pollution in Britain's watercourses.

#### **Computer Britannica**

A MASSIVE project with scope to make the majority of human knowledge available through Archimedes computers has been undertaken by AVP Computing working in conjunction with Somerset Local Education Authority.

Called Freedom, it uses hypermedia to present teachers and students with powerful

programs combining text, graphics, animation and sound.

"This is not just another computer program. It is a major carrier of information which in due course will provide ready made lessons and worksheets for the entire National Curriculum", said Robin Drewett of AVP. "You could view this as a computer version of The Encyclopaedia Britannica but it is even more than that. All human knowledge could be funnelled through this."

The initiative has started with science subjects which have had input from most of the heads of science in Somerset LEA and members of Somerset TVI plus AVP's own education writers. Five AVP programmers are working full-time to produce the first topics due out in January. They will cover Food Technology, Energy, Food and Fitness and Human Anatomy.

"These are just the tip of the iceberg", added Robin Drewett. "Freedom will be like opening the gates of the British Library but most important of all will be its ease of use. Within one minute of a new users seeing this program, we would expect them to be able to have a useful science lesson on their desks. It is absolutely straightforward.

"Freedom is also a tool and a servant to teachers, not the tyrannical slavemaster which is what computers are for a lot of teachers."

Lessons covering specific subjects, statements of attainment or any other criteria can be easily extracted from the programs then altered or adapted to suit individual needs. Any page of text or illustration can be easily printed out.

Freedom modules will cost £50 and will only be available from AVP (0291 625439).

They will be provided on floppy disc but because of the large amount of material involved, future plans are to use CD rom.

#### **English update**

EDUCATION software house LCL (0491 579345) have announced updated versions of their Micro English and Reading Writing Course programs for BBC Micros plus new Master Compact and Archimedes versions of Micro English.

# Reading modern Languages

NTEGRATING computers into the modern language side of the curriculum isn't easy, but now there's a book to help you. Taking the form of a report on a project in five Hertfordshire schools where computers were introduced into the modern language curriculum, it starts by explaining what equipment and software was used, where it van be obtained, and irs cost.

Straight away you know you are reading about real school situations and leave behind the thought "That's all very well, but what do I actually DO" that so many more theoretical books generate.

The setting out of the report cannot be faulted. It states clearly the initial considerations, including access to machines and the use of trolleys. It then goes through the planning stage, considering the uses and misuses of the machine and the obstacles that have to be overcome.

All the programs used are described and evaluated in detail as are the more exotic uses of the machine like Audio Enhanced Computer Assisted Learning and remote access to the French Teletel database.

Sections like *Is it worth it?* get to grips with the reality of the situation, and the overall conclusions are enthusiastic but qualified. The section on wordprocessing with Pen Friend is particularly useful.

Appendices are provided on all aspects of using the machine from switching on to

accessing Teletel, so teachers with no previous experience of computers can confidently tackle the activities described.

There are examples of students' work and the support materials the teachers produced, while the text is broken up with comments from students and staff. Overall the book is friendly and refreshingly self-critical – it's about real teachers in real classrooms with real students and real problems.

#### Summing up

This is just the sort of thing you need if you are going through the same process and want to avoid the pitfalls others have already discovered.

You are dealing with a wimp-style environment the program will let you use an AMX mouse if you have the relevant chip installed. As an aside here I think it's worth having a little moan about the fact that the program does not have its own mouse driver. This would have made it more flexible in schools with machines spread about but few with the relevant chips.

Even without the mouse, the environment is very friendly. The pointer moves smoothly and accurately and can be speeded up by holding down Shift. Selecting small countries can be difficult, so there is an enlarge icon which will give you a map of just one continent – you switch back by selecting the World icon.

Once you have chosen your country you can see a selection of relevant statistics. These have been carefully chosen to provide a range of social and economic indicators that allow comparison of the state of one country with another.

To start with there is the expected area, population and GNP per capita information that is always needed.

Then comes military spending as a proportion of GNP and the proportion of the population employed in the military. To balance this we have the proportion of doctors and teachers. All these figures are per thousand, and already we can begin to compare and contrast the outlook and priorities of different nations.

Figures on urban population naturally indicate urbanisation, and child population will be some indication of human resources and future demography.

The health data is short and to the point. There are two figures for infant mortality – for 1960 and 1981which give a dynamic view of a country's ability to care for its population. To fill out the health picture there are figures on life expectancy and access to clean water.

Finally, separate male and female literacy figures give indications, not only of the extent of education, but of the society's attitude to gender. The care with which this data has been chosen is central to the package's success—it manages to cover the maximum of factors with the computer-imposed minimum of file space.

Choose the graph icon and you see what these figures mean in terms of different countries.

Information may be displayed in three forms. The first is to use shading on a map of the world or any given continent using two or five steps generating two or five levels of shading. You can use this for comparing countries from the point of view of one field – try plotting GNP per capita on the world map and you will straight away have the basis for lively discussion.

Bar charts can be selected in a similar way, using data for one continent or the world. But the use of scattergraphs really gets things going as your students get to grips with connections between GNP and

life expectancy, or find out which poor countries are spending valuable resources on arms.

Each of the graph options will allow the computer to construct the scale or let you do it. The only niggle here is that scales must always start with zero, which restricts your ability to examine one part of a graph closely.

The manual is quite straightforward about the reliability of the data and provides an editor which will get you over the problem of information becoming out of data.

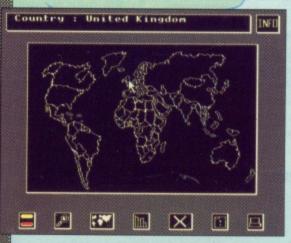
You can change the name of a country and its capital as well as updating any of the fields. You can't change its borders, but this would be asking too much of the software. So you'll have to find more creative ways of dealing with the unification of Germany, for instance.

The lack of a network version will cause problems in some schools, but special deals on multiple copies are available from ESM.

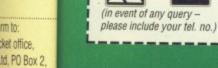

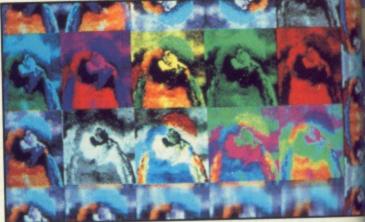

UMBER in the National Curriculum is well catered for, but there is always room for more. So here's a collection of Anita Straker's maths programs published by ESM in three separate packs: Getting Ready for Maths, Place Value Activities and Number Games.

Described by ESM as "a new series of maths programs.....designed to sit in with the needs of the Maths National Curriculum" most, if not all, were written some years ago. Although occasionally updated, they will still be familiar to some teachers and children.

Their age is not a problem - the programs are well thought out, mathematically sound, and offer experiences at different levels within the National Curriculum. Their age is apparent in the extensive use of simple graphics and jingles.

There is some advantage in keeping things simple. All of the menus and key presses are consistent and this helps pupils to learn how to use the programs quickly and easily, but simplicity in graphics often detracts from their value.

I am not too sure that today's pupils will view them in quite the same way, especially if they have experience of some of Sherston Software's usually dramatic offerings.

Getting Ready for Maths explores some basic concepts. The six programs include games and puzzles based on matching, sequencing, investigating patterns and recognising numerals.

They are a useful addition to the Reception and Year 1 teacher's collection, and children working in groups of two or three will find them interesting and enjoyable.

Cubes is a simple program concerned with patterns. Children are encouraged to look carefully at eight cubes of various colours before using the spacebar and Return to match the sequence on a line below. At more difficult levels the cubes are presented in piles of two or three.

Beads 1 uses the same keys and methods of working as Cubes, but this time shapes - triangles, diamonds, hexagons and circles - as well as colours must be matched. Again, there are differing levels of difficulty within the program.

Instead of asking for a pattern to be copied, Beads 2 asks the children to continue one. It is fairly simple at the easiest of the three levels, but at the hardest the pattern can prove quite difficult. Careful working is essential.

Interesting and valuable work based on this program can be done away from the computer. Children using beads and card can simply mimic the program, but to extend their experiences, seeds, for example, may be glued on to paper to continue patterns set by the children themselves.

Some of the patterns I have seen when working with Year 1 classes are testimony to the way in which the computer and uncomplicated programs such as Beads 2 can make some children to work at a much higher level than may have been anticipat-

Matching and Number Snap are based on matching. In the first, which has two levels of difficulty, the child is presented with a number of shapes at the top of the screen. Pressing the spacebar puts a matching number of shapes at the bottom - at the easier level each shape has a guide line at the bottom.

The second of the two displays a number of simple pictures with three large numbers. The spacebar and Return key allow the child to choose the appropriate numeral to match the number of pictures. Unfortunately, the pictures are very simple and the motivation is not high, despite Podd making a guest appearance.

For children who have a grasp of numbers to nine, Line Up lets two children practise their knowledge. A 6x4 grid is shown onscreen and the trick is to be the first to fill a column of four.

Between one and nine spots are shown on what is loosely described as a rolling die. The number displayed can be used as it is or as the result of adding two numbers, for example, a seven is rolled and is the result of three and four. By choosing the number or pair carefully players can fill the numbered squares on the grid to get a completed column.

Place Value, the second pack, contains seven games and puzzles at levels two, three and four of the National Curriculum. Six of the programs support the concept of place value, but the seventh, Shape Hunt, involves the search for a square and is described as "a little light relief"

The first four programs are variations on a theme and use the rolling die again. Depending on the game, points are awarded if the larger numbers form number sentences or sums and include the less than and greater than signs.

The programs achieve their goal but the instructions and scoring are difficult for young children to understand even if they

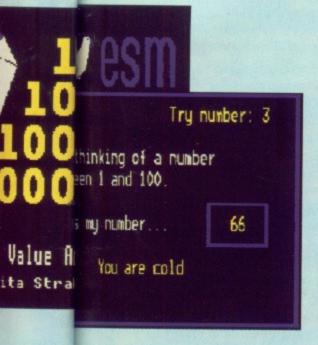

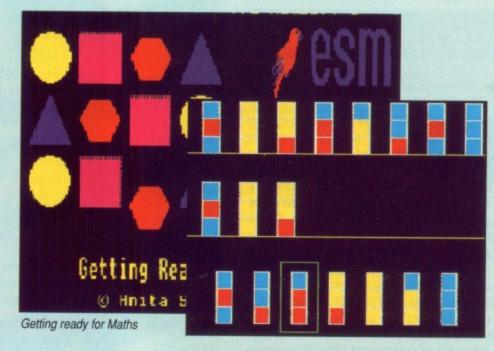

The concept of probability was neglected by many published maths schemes until recently, when the National Curriculum gave it the status it deserves.

A child with an understanding of probability will have an advantage when deciding where to place the numbers shown on the die, and it would be possible to use the programs to reinforce the concept with those who are relatively new to it.

Find Me is a guess the number game. In all the three versions the computer selects a number between 0 and 100. The differences between the games lie in the clues which the computer gives. In the simplest game clues are of the too big or too small variety while the hardest asks for you to decide before you start, how hot 'hot' should be and when 'cold' should become "freezing'.

Another game with three levels of difficulty is **Counting Words**. A number is displayed in words and you must enter the equivalent in figures. Different levels offer larger numbers.

If mistakes are made you are taken through the process digit by digit.

The object of **Shape Hunt** is to find a large blue square within a grid by colouring it in square by square. Described as a diversion, it is just that, but a useful one for all that. If a child really understands what it is that makes a square a square then success will be quick. If that understanding is not there using the program may help it develop.

Finally **Number Games** is pitched higher. Aimed at Maths Attainment Targets 1, 3 and 5 at levels between 3 and 5, it contains eight programs.

Chains is a puzzle which asks you to

add numbers together in a chain to match a given target number. Producing some interesting problems it isn't always possible to match the target number.

Counters, Make 37 and Make 57 are strategy games for two players. The objective is to reach a given total by selecting numbers from an on-screen grid. The games are quite simple and would be useful for providing addition practice, but I'm not so sure that time devoted to these programs would be well spent.

Spot the Pattern is better. A random series of seven numbers between 0 and 100 is displayed with all but two replaced by stars. You must find the other five, one point deducted from a starting score of 20 for every wrong guess. Three levels of difficulty cater for a wide range of ability.

For children who understand such terms as square, cube, triangle, more than and less than when applied to numbers **Ask Me** provides an alternative approach to the **Find Me** games of the **Place Value** pack.

Similarly simple, it provides a lot of motivation to look for a quick and elegant solution using the attributes of the different terms. Children enjoy playing it.

Play Train is excellent, but like others in the series it suffers from poor graphics. The problem is to fill a train's carriages with a given number of passengers. Passengers only come in two groups, so trial and error is the way to solve this one. A strategy can

#### Summing up

Most of the programs in the three packages are repetitive, but anyone tempted to dismiss them as "drill and practice" would be wrong. With a little imagination, and advice from the simple and clear 10 page manual, they can be used to provide useful mathematical challenges.

Young children can practise new skills and apply them in new situations in a fun and non-threatening environment. They can also experience situations where there are opportunities for problem solving and logical thinking, as well as strategic planning which may quickly be tested and modified if it is not successful.

Taken as a whole, the three packs are a useful and mathematically sound resource, but the programs are showing their age and are not cheap.

Finally, I am concerned that ESM should attempt to link what is essentially a collection of existing materials to the National Curriculum by simply including a reference to it in the title and by brief references to attainment targets in the manual.

Like many other recently published materials, the programs were not specially written for the National Curriculum and any links are simply implied. Unfortunately, as the practice spreads it brings no credit to anyone, and is in a sense misleading.

The last game is **Sliders**. It is suggested as one for two teams, and I would recommend teams of only two children. There is simply not enough to do to involve more, especially when it is possible for the second player or team to win every time once a relatively simple trick has been learned.

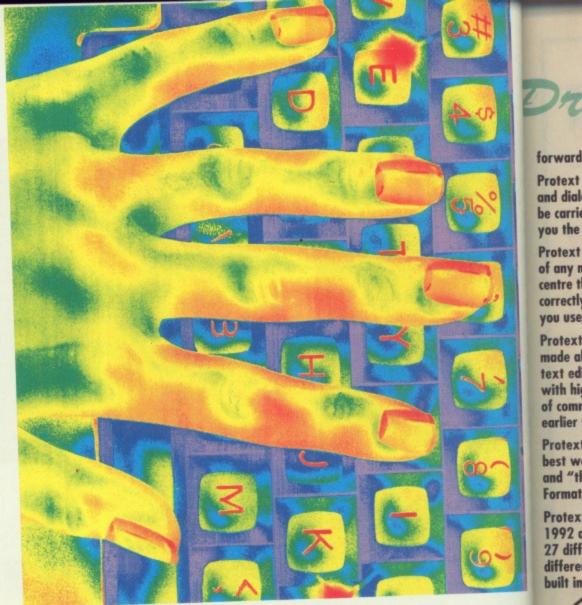

ISC Type is a touch-typing tutorial program, and for those who wish to learn this skill, it's extremely useful to have a kindly computer which recognises errors and can give you a speed typing rate as well. These tasks can now be carried out on your Archimedes, courtesy of this software.

The basic idea is simple. A small section of text - just one line - is shown on screen. You have to re-type the text so that it is displayed under the original. As soon as you've finished you are given a percentage rating for accuracy, told how many words you can type each minute and receive a simple message.

The words per minute rating is somewhat misleading. I have achieved speeds of over 220 words per minute by the simple trick of making each and every word just one letter long. A better measure would have been to have worked on average

words of five letters. You are, in fact, bound to end with no mistakes on the screen. This is because the program will not display the wrong letters that you type.

You'll know, though, when you do err since the computer offers you a low pitched raspberry noise rather than the bell which signals success.

If you hear any of these fruity asides you have to finish the task and try it again. And you keep repeating the same line until you get it right, at which point you are offered the next line of the lesson to work on.

Options allow any feature to be turned on or off - including the sound effects - and an extra metronome sound can be added to help inculcate a good typing rhythm. All of the messages that tell you how good or bad you are can be removed.

A printer can be selected and the printout shows precisely what you typed, including mistakes, along with the correct line of text. A large on-screen display of the keyboard can be removed if you don't require it. All the options can be saved to disc.

Complete with a set of lessons which start with the home keys and take you right through the keyboard, RiscType's ideas are sound and I am assured by a typing teacher that everything is correct.

Everything, that is, apart from spelling mistakes and errors in grammar. I feel cheated when I spell things correctly only to get a raspberry. This problem of lesson accuracy permeates the whole package,

which includes ideas for learning poems or French vocabulary.

This should not be a major worry since lessons are only !Edit files, so it's easy to create your own or correct the ones there.

If you follow the instructions in the handbook, though, your new lessons won't work. This is because the required layout of the lesson is not described properly in the book - I had to study the structure of one already on the disc.

It's a pity to have to make these fairly basic criticisms. After all, it would have taken very little effort for the writers or publishers to have dealt with these problems.

Perhaps they'll be put right on the all-action version two which is promised soon. I hope so because they spoil what is otherwise a very good program.

#### Summing up

RiscType is a nice package to use, and is a good way to improve your keyboard skills. However its use will be limited until CIS sort out some of the problems of accuracy which exist.

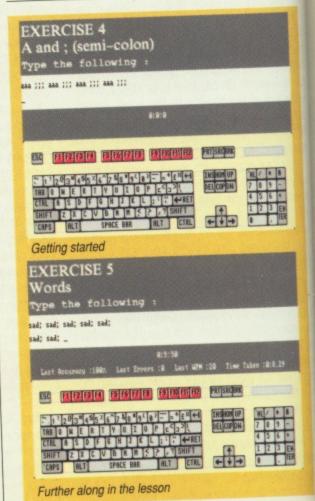

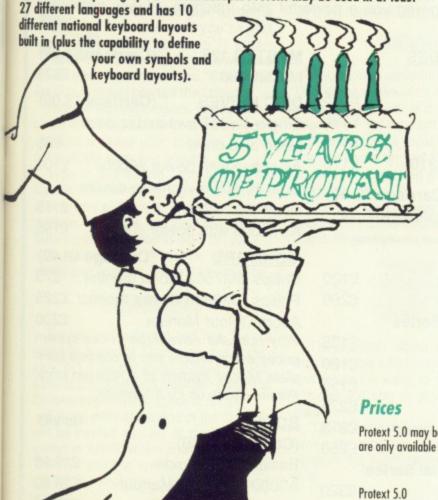

With this cunning program you can put a stop to this fraught state of affairs for good because it saves your program to disc automatically every four minutes.

Type in the listing and save it as SaveSrc. Correct any typing errors with the checksums and run it. This creates the machine code. Now you just copy the line that's printed at the end in order to save it.

To start up type \*AutoSav, and begin writing your program. The first line must be:

#### REM > Filename

Spaces are irrelevent and may be put wherever you want. Quotes are not necessary, but a double quote before the filename is permitted, and must be used if the filename begins with a space or is null.

A quote mark at the end of the filename will be treated as part of the filename, except in ADFS, where it will be ignored. The right-pointing arrow, or greater than symbol, is compulsory. These lines are all correct:

REM > Prog1 REM>GAME REM >\$.convert

The last one is a double quote mark followed by one space. But these are not on:

REM Program
REM >

The program is not saved but no error is generated.

REM>"Editor"

This is allowed under ADFS but for the DFS the name would be EDITOR".

#### REM > main"

Also allowed under the ADFS, but for the DFS the name would be *main*". If the format is wrong – or this line is not at the beginning – the program will not be saved. If the filename is invalid, or there is not enough room on the disc, an error will occur when there's an attempt to save the program.

You can set the time inverval between each save in seconds using the \*LINE command, for example:

\*LINE 60 \*LINE 120 \*LINE 210 \*LINE

The first three set the interval to one, two and three and a half minutes, while the last one resets the value to the default of four minutes and also re-enables the AutoSav program.

\*CODE has two functions: On its own, it saves the program immediately and reenables the AutoSav program. Used like this:

#### \*CODE 1

it disables auto-saving.

The program itself uses memory from &900 to &AFF, so don't use sound envelopes 5 to 16, RS423, or cassete files – since this is mainly used when writing the program it shouldn't be a problem.

The AutoSav program should be added to your boot file as a simple \*AutoSav command so that it's set up automatically with the rest of your initialisation routines.

 So there you have it. A useful routine to protect your valuable programs from accidental loss.

#### How it works

The program intercepts the event and user vectors and sets the interval timer for four minutes – the default time between saves – and enables the interval timer crossing zero event.

If the user vector is called, it first checks for \*CODE, and if it isn't \*CODE, for \*LINE, and if it's not that either just exits. If it was \*CODE the program looks at the X register, which is \*CODE's first parameter.

If X is 1 the interval timer event is disabled which stops the program running. Otherwise the accumulator is set to five – the number for the interval timer crossing zero event – and the event routine called.

If \*LINE has been issued the interrupts are disabled to prevent saving while the interval between saves is being altered.

The value following \*LINE is read using the GSInit and GSRead routines. The actual conversion from decimal to binary involves multiplying the previous value by ten then adding the new digit.

If the event vector is called, the event number in the accumulator is checked to see if it is the timer event. If not, the program exits. Otherwise the timer is reset, and event five enabled if it has been turned off, and the first two bytes of the program in memory checked to see if they conform to the format character &0D followed by character &00. If not then it's not a Basic program and the routine exits.

If it is Basic the first line is examined for a REM token – value &F4 – an assembler comment, \, and a greater-than sign, >. The assembler comment is permitted because you may be using overlays to assemble large machine code programs.

The filename is extracted – if there is one – the necessary save parameters set up and finally the program is stored to disc.

Impression release 2 is the first major upgrade to the leading DTP package for the Archimedes. It makes the preparation of documents, from the simplest letters to the most complex and intricate designs, easier than it has ever been before. It is the only program designed to be used as a word processor, to handle long documents while at the same time offering the most powerful page layout facilities.

#### Where word processing and DTP meet

As word processors grow more powerful year by year, Desk-Top-Publishing programs are becoming more like word processors, so that both types of product are evolving in the same direction. However few computers have either the power or a flexible enough operating system to allow the successful integration of the two approaches.

Impression on the Archimedes has successfully combined the best features of word processors and desk-top-publishing programs to create the logical result of that evolution. A word processor that can handle the most complex DTP, and a DTP program that can process words like no other - we call it a document processor.

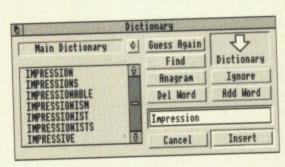
When other computers catch up with the Archimedes, all word processors will be like Impression. Why buy two programs when Impression can handle all your documentation requirements?

#### Word processing

To be a successful word processor, a program has to be easy to use, include, amongst other things, real time spell checking, a powerful set of editing tools and the ability to handle documents from the simplest letter to complete books. What's more it has to be fast and responsive in use, something that lets down nearly all DTP programs.

#### Spelling checker

Spelling checkers have become a necessary tool in reducing errors in documents, not necessarily because they can catch spelling mistakes, but because they can also spot typing errors. The spelling checker supplied with Impression is based on the successful SpellMaster product, enhanced and fully integrated into Impression. It offers check-as-youtype, a 60,000 word main dictionary, up to 8 user extension dictionaries (which can automatically save themselves to disc) and two intelligent guess modes to help identify the correct word (one lists words that sound like the misspelt word, the other lists words based on the most common typing errors). It will even solve crossword and anagram puzzles.

#### Long documents

Impression supports many features to aid the creation of long documents. By employing automatic disc slaving, it can handle documents of practically any size, even on 1Mbyte Archimedes. In fact, the memory available in the machine is no longer the limiting factor. Impression has already been used to produce books and manuals consisting of hundreds of pages, sometimes many megabytes long.

It also supports automatic index and contents compilation, again an enormous time saver. Impression 2 also has the ability to keep headings attached to the following paragraph, so eliminating 'widow' lines at the bottom of pages or

columns. This improves the appearance of all documents, short or long. As you might expect, automatic page and chapter numbering is supported along with the most flexible header and footer system around. These may be any number of lines at any position on the page, and even incorporate graphics. A new feature in Impression 2 allows headers and footers, or any frame, to repeat over a whole document or any specific range of pages.

#### Styles

Impression's unique style system can be a time saver for all types of word processing and DTP use. The appearance of headings, titles, quotes or any region of text can be made to appear in any combination of a vast range of stylistic effects. Each combination of effects can be given a name and applied to any required region of text with one key press. Styles save time because the combination of effects can be applied in one go rather than individually applying each effect, each time it is required. Styles are retro-active - any edit or alteration performed to a style will affect all occurrences of that style in the text. For example, if all quotes in a document are set to be italicised, and you want to change them to be bold, this involves just a single style edit.

The Impression style system is unique in two ways; firstly in the number of options available - text can be any size (even as large as the page), any line spacing, any font, any colour (background or foreground). Text may be set to have a strikethrough line or be single or double underlined. Tabs can be leadered (it automatically puts dots between tabs). Paragraphs can have an

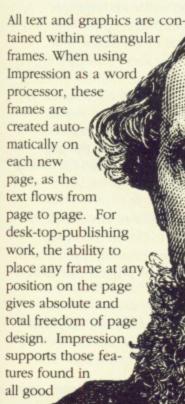
Secondly, Impression styles can be applied to any region of text, from a single character to an entire document. They can also overlap, so that one style can be used in a paragraph while another is used for a few words in that paragraph. The above quote example is not possible on other DTP systems since they cannot apply a style to anything less than a paragraph.

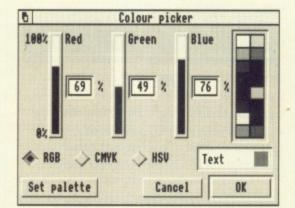
#### Master pages

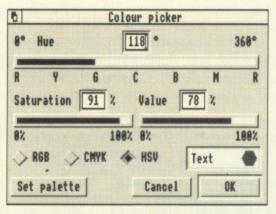
Impression master pages are a powerful tool that provides control over the appearance of a whole document. Master pages control the size, layout and structure of all pages in a document. If you want all pages to be based on three columns on A4 paper with a graphic in the corner, then the master page can be set to create all pages in this fashion automatically. However, master pages are really powerful because, like styles, they are retro-active. Any change made to a master page will be reflected throughout a document. So, if you decide to have two columns rather than three, or perhaps arrange the page landscape rather than portrait, this can be achieved by one master page change.

Impression supports any number of master pages (the pages can be any size) and can allow the page size to be changed *after* the document has been created.

The RGB colour selector (left) has a pre-selection of 16 colours, but allows any colour to be defined. Three alternative colour models are available, such as HSV shown on the right, which allows new colours to be selected in a more intuitive manner. These colour selectors can be used to set the colour of just about anything in Impression - text background and foreground, line and frame colours etc.

DTP programs such as the use of any font, any size. Frames of any size may be placed at any position on the page, and may be set to be transparent or opaque (any colour). By using the Acorn antialiased font system, it presents the ultimate in WYSIWYG displays. And since the scale of the page can be altered from 1% to 900% of actual size, it is possible to examine the page in enormous detail so that text of 1pt can be edited, or at smaller scales, complete page spreads can be viewed. Impression even allows more than one window, at different scales, on any document.

Impression also includes two essentials needed for any high quality, professional publishing, hyphenation and text gridlock. The latter ensures that lines of text align across columns. Examine most quality newspapers or magazines and you will see that, even when pictures or different size headings are used, the main

body text remains aligned

across columns.

Hyphenation is of course used in virtually all printed material. This advert, magazines, books and all newspapers use hyphenation to improve the look and readability of text, especially when arranged in columns. Impression will hyphenate automatically if required, using a combination of exception dictionary and algorithmic hyphenation.

Users can add their own hyphenation points either manually in the text (using soft hyphens) or to words in the hyphenation exception dictionary.

#### Frames

Since frames are a key part of Impression, a great deal of time has been spent ensuring that all possible frame manipulation tools are provided in a fashion that is convenient and simple to understand. Text frames can be connected to other text frames so that text will flow from frame to frame, in any desired order. (This can be displayed graphically, along with the number of words not fitting within a frame.) Any frame can be resized at will, and each frame can have independent repel margins. (Text can be made to repel around another frame, and the repel distance from any side of the frame can be controlled.) Text contained within a frame can also be inset from the frame edge by any amount.

#### Multiple frame operations

Any set of frames on a page can be temporarily selected together (multiple frame selection). In this mode the frames can be moved together as a group, and they can be copied to other pages or other documents. If one is re-sized, all others will change size by the same amount. (Imagine you want to make three columns slightly narrower - by selecting all three columns and changing the width of one, they will all change by the same amount.)

In addition frames can be permanently grouped, so captions can be permanently

This image was scanned using the Scan-Light Junior scanner at 400 dpi. This sprite was re-touched using !Paint and a mask drawn around the head. Although Impression cannot automatically flow around irregular shapes, by placing a collection of transparent, but repelling, frames around the drawing, the text can be made to repel around any desired shape. By using the group frame facility, the repelling frames can be permanently tied to the drawing, so that the whole image with its repelling frames can be moved and scaled as one.

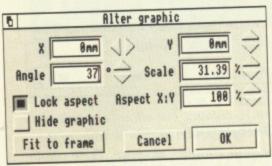

attached to graphics. This also allows multi-column text frames. Since grouped frames scale and re-size in proportion, three text frames grouped together act exactly like one single, three-column, text frame which can then be cut, copied, moved, dragged etc. as one object.



The Alter graphic dialogue allows precise numeric values to be entered.

#### Graphics

Either line art graphics (for example from !Draw) or bit-image graphics such as sprites, scanned or digitised images, can be placed in a frame. The graphics can be scaled, stretched, cropped as required, all instantaneously. Graphics can also be rotated by any angle, also instantaneously. And it can do all this without going near a dialogue box or menu option. Of course you can enter exact numeric scale or rotate values if required.

All graphics scale and rotate options are performed in real time - there is no delay or calculation required, and neither is the original graphic altered. So graphics can be scaled and rotated as much as you like without suffering cumulative distortion effects. Neither could it be simpler - by using the adjust mouse button, any graphic can be dragged around the



centre of the frame, interactively. Speed tests indicate that rotation of sprite graphics is over 500 times faster than !Paint.

Although Impression cannot directly rotate text, it is supplied with a utility program that will convert lines of text into an outline graphic file. This can be dropped onto a frame where it can be

freely rotated; ideal for headlines or any text that needs to stand out.

Grey level dithering is another unique feature of Impression. Normally a maximum of 16 shades of grey are reproducible on Archimedes monitors. However, by using a dithering ability, Impression can represent over 60 grey levels, for all types of graphic - sprites and Draw files, resulting in far more on screen images.

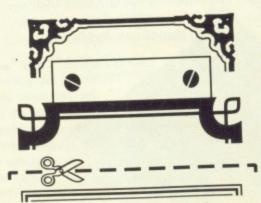
Any document more than a few pages long, that contains graphics, usually requires the graphics to be tied to a particular part of the text. Impression can embed any graphic into the text, even as part of a line if required. For example, the above equation (from our Equasor program) embedded into the text will stay with this text

wherever it is moved.

#### **Borders**

Frames can be highlighted with one of the ten built-in border types. Each frame can set any border type for each of the sides of a frame individually. Impression 2 now has the ability to import Draw files as additional border designs. And, of course, Draw files will always render to the maximum resolution of the printer - i.e. no jaggies.



#### Printing

Impression has always had a very wide range of printing options. Impression 2 takes this even further by supporting two completely different modes of operation - draft printing and RISC OS printing.

Word processors typically use the built in character set of the printer - this is fast and ideal for text only documents. DTP programs, on the other hand, use the RISC OS printer drivers that can deliver an exact representation of the page, including all fonts and graphics, to the maximum resolution of the printer. Unfortunately RISC OS printing can typically take 5 or more minutes per page on most dot-matrix printers. (PostScript or direct drive laser printers are the exception to this rule.)

Impression 2 supports both modes. Draft mode allows any document to be printed using the built-in character set of the printer, matching the closest fonts available in the printer to those used on screen. This can be used for obtaining a quick text draft of any document - even complex DTP layouts. If Impression is being used as a text only word processor, this mode is fast and accurate while still allowing full control over printer attributes such as bold, italic, underlining etc. This mode even allows multi-column text, multi-line headers and footers etc and so means that Impression is now a truly effective alternative to traditional character mode word processors such as First Word Plus.

RISC OS printing in Impression allows the page to be scaled by any amount or rotated by 90 degrees. Unique features are its pamphlet mode and multiple pages per sheet options. This allows any number of scaled down pages to be printed on a single sheet - useful for thumbnail printing and vital for proofing since it means that A4 documents can be printed 2 up, as A5 pages on a single sheet of paper. The pamphlet mode takes this further by printing the pages correctly rotated and arranged for folding into a pamphlet.

Impression 2 also allows any number of copies of a page to be fitted on each sheet and reflected printing (professional typeset pages can be printed emulsion side down.)

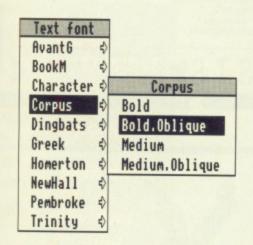

#### Word substitution

Another unique Impression feature is word substitution or abbreviation expansion - as you type. Any commonly used word or phrase can be assigned any abbreviation and added to a dictionary. When the abbreviation is subsequently entered, it is automatically changed to the fully expanded word or phrase.

#### Ease of use

Much of the design effort for Impression has gone into the user interface. The program has the minimum of menu options (only 6 main menu items), so new users are not overwhelmed by dozens of menus. Full use is made of dialogue boxes which can remain on screen while editing continues. For example the 'Alter graphic' dialogue, illustrated opposite, will remain on screen and dynamically indicate any alterations performed to the graphic with the mouse. The result is that, although Impression is more powerful than any alternative, it is actually simpler to learn and easier to use.



Fonts are listed by family so reducing the size of menu and making it easier to select any required weight.

#### RISC OS

Impression is totally RISC OS compatible and follows the Acorn RISC OS guidelines. It integrates with other programs and supports in-memory transfer with cooperating applications. For example importing a picture from !Paint, !Draw or ScanLight involves simply dropping the appropriate icon onto a blank frame in an Impression window.

Impression can access the full RISC OS character set that includes a complete set of European characters. European versions (with translated manuals, menus etc) are available.

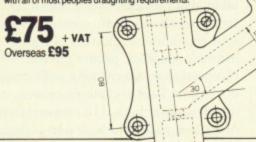

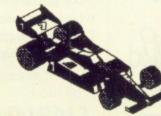

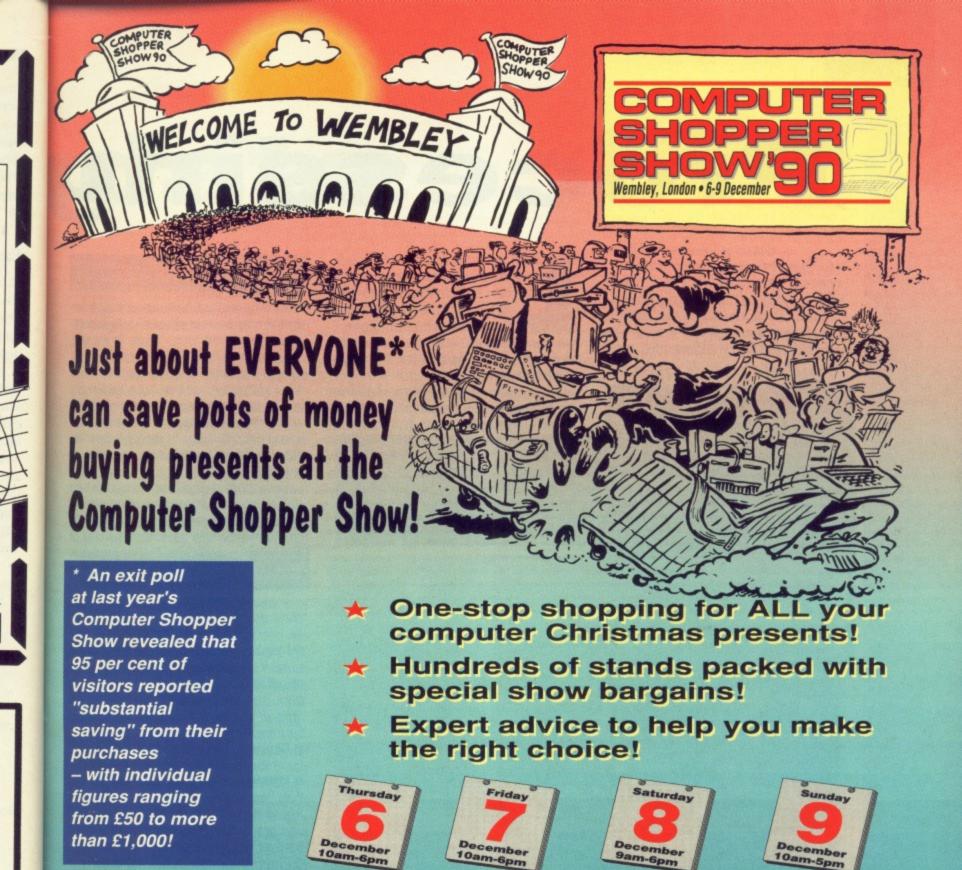

## Processing

AST month we looked at the structure of the database records and a program called ROUTINE to ease the work of making changes to records and printing individual ones out. Now let's consider some special programs for more specialised actions.

The function keys are automatically set up to load special programs available in !Boot. They may be placed in any segment by pressing together Shift-Ctrl-Fkey, and will wipe out any program already in the selected segment. Of course, you can also use the menu to load the programs by name. The panel describes each in turn.

#### **BiSortD**

If the Find option in Routine has been used to make entries there should be no need to sort the files in this way – Find is no use unless the files are already in order.

But if sorting is needed, BiSortD is available – the **D** denotes that records are read from disc while being sorted. **Bi** indicates a binary search is used you jump halfway into the sorted records and test to see if the sorted record lies before or after the one found.

If it passes the first test, jump back half the length of the previous jump. If it passes the second test jump forward the same amount. Repeat the operation until both tests fail. End the search and insert the new record in the current position.

You may wonder at the temporary use of three dummy records at the start and end of the file. The sorting code is optimised for speed, but as a result is liable to jump over the end of the records. The dummy records force the search back into the file.

A simpler sort would involve going through the sorted list until the record found is *greater than* the new record. This works faster when sorting only a few records.

#### CoSortD

Uses a similar process to sort records into groups according to the members' sex, paid-up status and age. Whereas BiSortD uses the surname+forename, CoSortD uses the code field and date of birth field.

The program includes a *display* after each new record is inserted. You may, like me, wish to see the program at work and you will find you save very little time by taking this facility out.

#### Analyze

Should be run after using CoSortD and gives, in segment one, totals for each age and sex grouping, and separate figures for those who have not paid their subscription. After Analyze you may want to run SelList to get a list of names grouped by age, for instance.

#### SelList

This lists selected fields. If you want to list selected records only, use a program like Include or SelDel to make a file of those records first.

Using this program you can decide which fields, or lines, will be included in a list of records. For instance, you may want a telephone list with names, town and phone number.

The output is to segment one, producing a file that may be given a heading and saved for later viewing or printed out. As each record is copied to segment one it is deleted from Text so you don't run out of space.

If you select Text and enter :type segment 1 in menu mode the output will be copied into text for processing. You could then do a global replacement of commas by tab characters (|T) to get columns lined

#### **Data protection**

The law lays down rules about what information may be kept about people in computer processed form. There is a basic requirement that any data user must register with the Data Protection Registrar. This does not apply if all you keep on file are names and addresses, or the most basic accounting records, or the most basic wages data. If you go beyond the essential data, or the essential uses, you may be required to register.

Under certain conditions the records of a club or other voluntary association may be exempt. The safest thing to do is to indicate on the membership application the kind of data to be recorded and its proposed use, and probably to make consent a condition of membership.

If you are starting a computerised record with more than simple names and addresses, bear in mind the following:

 Members should have a chance to object to their data being on the register – no objection counts as assent.

You also need consent to disclose data to anyone outside the club, for example for insurance or travel arrangements.

 Data must only be used for the purposes for which it was gathered.

• Members do not have a legal right to see their personal entry, but it seems provocative to deny them this. Since errors and changes occur, it makes sense for them to have a chance to check each year.

 The file must only include members – so lapsed members must be removed.

The data must be accurate and kept up to date.

 Care must be taken to guard against unauthorised access or accidental loss.

Within these limits, there seems to be no restriction on the kind of data that may be recorded if it is strictly necessary for the purposes of the club – and members approve. The rules are more detailed for cases where registration is thought to be necessary: What we have looked at here is by no means a complete statement of the law.

#### Is your system safe?

Apart from the Act's requirements, there is a heavy investment in time in entering data and you would not wish to lose it.

A minimum safety requirement is probably to keep your discs locked up. If you have a fireproof container, so much the better. Can backup copies of data and programs be kept by another club officer? Even paper records need such care.

You are, of course, following the basic

rules to avoid damage to your discs – don't finger them, keep them away from heat and sunlight, and don't put them on the monitor or, most important, near the phone.

• Keep major backup discs locked with a security tab. If a working disc becomes faulty make a copy from the backup – perhaps on another machine – and use that, rather than the backup disc itself.

 If all discs fail to load, don't panic – an expert may still be able to get back all or most of your data.

 Use a voltage stabiliser if your power supply is unreliable.

Have a reliable system for backups.

#### Making backups

Failure to back up work can cost you hours in re-entry. It is best to make copies at regular intervals during the day to reduce the risk. How many minutes of work are you prepared to lose? Some way of marking source material so you know which file it is entered in will also help if re-entry is needed.

We use two ways of backup for my wife's club. Firstly with each major session of alteration the data file is saved with a new date in the name: A180290 or M180290 are examples.

We have the file split in two for reasons of size. The result is that we always have the previous file or files to go back to if all the latest fail. I would aim to \*WIPE away any greatgrandfather files.

Secondly, each data file is saved three times, at least once to a different disc. I often back up on to the reverse of a disc, but you can't do that with an ADFS system. Disc storage is now cheaper than the equivalent in paper copies and time is

Thirdly, if you want to check a data file has saved correctly – and provided there are no control codes embedded in it – \*TYPE "filename" in menu mode and the file should be screened without interfering with what is in memory. If a file is not too long you can also reload it into a segment as a check.

If you are backing up a whole disc – which is probably rarely needed if you back up individual files regularly – be sure to lock it first by covering the write-protect notch. It's all too easy to get the drive specifications the wrong way round.

If you are going to change a disc extensively, as by compacting, work on a back-up, not the original. Alternatively you can use \*COPY 0 1 \*.\* from one disc to a newly-formatted one. I feel this is safer than compacting and the new disc will have no

waste space. Only reformat the original disc when you know, by using them, that your copied files are OK.

It may seem elementary, but it's worth a reminder that unlabelled discs all look alike. When data is held on disc is is very important to be well organised with meaningful labels and perhaps catalogue files to enable you to find what you want. Use a felt tip pen on the labels.

#### The programs

Due to the number and length of these programs they cannot be included in the magazine but most are available on this month's subscription disc. The programs are held in one file and will need to be split up.

The programs will run but it is best first to convert them to an equivalent uncommented and compressed version using Compres, as described in the last article. They will then not only take up less memory but run faster. Both versions should be kept on separate discs.

up. Though you can program for immediate printout of a list from the records, this gives less control of what you are printing than producing a list in memory first.

#### Include

To operate this program, files are loaded to Text – from within the program – and searched for records to be extracted. Using wildcards, >/# will extract all unpaid subscribers, or >#F will extract all women, paid or not.

The extracted records are marked top and bottom as extracts – you would not usually want them saved back under the original file name.

#### GlobDel

This routine deletes coded records. It's a powerful option which may be used, for instance, to eliminate all members not paid up, say code >/#. It works on a file you have already entered into text.

If you aren't too happy about using this, you can try the main Routine program command S(eek) followed by the code and R(epeat) thereafter, while using D(elete) on each example found. If you know the members well, you may spot an error in coding in this way if one has occurred.

GlobDel may be faster than the opposite program INCLUDE. Obviously you can get the same effect by including men, or excluding women. Unlike INCLUDE, it does not provide any warning about saving the resultant file.

#### Stats

This can be used to provide statistics of members. The documented program is self-explanatory. The most interesting part of the code is probably the right justification of the figures.

If you wish, you can add printout to the display, or type the statistics at the end of the record file.

#### Count

This is an example of a piece of code that can be cobbled together simply in a couple of minutes to count the number of records.

#### Registr

Perhaps the most interesting program – it is used to make an attendance register.

#### Integri

Checks the database's integrity, stopping if the mark > is missing. If it reaches the end of the text all is well.

To explain, most of the utilities – including Routine – look for the > sign at the start of each record in order to work. This is added automatically by the subroutine ADD in the main program.

But if you make additions or changes by hand you may forget to put it in. After altering records, load this program into a segment and run it before you save the updated text. B

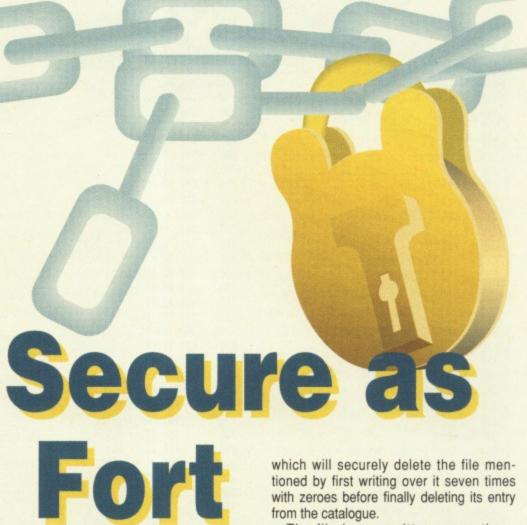

VERYBODY knows that if you want to prevent someone from reading the data in a particular file all you have to do is delete it from disc. Then it's gone - completely safe from prying eyes. Correct? Unfortunately not.

If only things were that simple. Format a completely fresh disc then, from Basic, enter this program:

> 10 PRINT "This is an example" 20 PRINT "(Your name here)"

Save this as TEST with:

SAVE "TEST"

Now delete the file you have just saved by entering:

\*WIPE TEST

Take the disc out of the drive and turn the computer off for 10 seconds. Clearly, the program is no longer in the memory and you have just wiped it from disc.

Turn the micro back on, re-enter Basic, put the disc back in the drive and type in the following commands

> \*CREATE PROGRAM 1000 LOAD "PROGRAM"

Recognise it? Your - erased - confidential data is not as secure as you thought.

### The solution

But all is not lost - or rather, all can be lost. The program presented here provides a way of securely deleting your files so they cannot be inspected with the use of a disc editor, the method above, or even by highly sophisticated equipment.

Knox

Type the program in, ensure it is correct using the checksums, and type RUN. A module called Scrubmod will be saved to disc. You can load it with:

\*Scrubmod

or by double-clicking on the file from the DeskTop. The module adds a new command:

\*Scrub

which will securely delete the file mentioned by first writing over it seven times with zeroes before finally deleting its entry from the catalogue.

The file is overwritten seven times because although another file may be saved over the top of it, magnetic traces of the original data remain on the disc and the file may still be read using specialised equipment. Saving over the file seven times is sufficient to reduce the traces of the old file to such a level that they are unde-

One word of warning: Although the module may be very useful for deleting confidential documents and business files, there is no way in which your data may be recovered after it has been scrubbed, so don't destroy files which you need.

#### From tape to disc

I HAVE recently acquired a Watford Electronic 40/80 track disc drive for my BBC B. I'd like to transfer some ancient material from tape to disc, but as the tape system isn't working I'm wondering if there is anything inside the computer I can swop over temporarily to get the files on to disc.

Both the cassette recorder and its cables have been checked thoroughly, so the problem is obviously in the computer. Any suggestions? – E. Vincent, Dinton.

The main component that goes wrong in the tape interface is the LM324 quad op amp chip located just beside the tape input socket. Unfortunately, on some boards it's soldered in and is quite a job to replace.

What you must do is cut out the old chip using side-cutters and then unsolder each chip leg seperately. Then you can solder in a new socket and replace the chip – which should cost less than £1.

However, extracting an old chip does call for skill if you are not to mess up the board. Perhaps your best bet would be to borrow someone else's machine for the transfer. You might try contacting a local school. They could be willing to let you use their machine for a small consideration in cash or kind.

#### Keep taking the tablet

HAVE you ever made or thought of making a graphics tablet which could be interfaced to the BBC Micro? I would be grateful for any information. – R. Williams, Bury.

●A simple pantograph graphics tablet was described in the June 1983 (Vol 1 No 4) issue of The Micro User. Though perhaps a bit of a collector's item now, this uses two potentiometers and a bit of maths. Other forms of tablet are a bit too involved for a magazine article.

#### Capacitor voltage

I HAVE started to build the graphics digitiser from the June 1983 Body Building, but have hit a problem – it doesn't state what voltage the electrolytic capacitors are. I can get the components from a local dealer as long as I know the voltage.

The June 1989 Body Building article told how to make a Whole-body joystick, but I'd like to know what value the four resistors are. – M. Whitbread, Chapeltown.

The resistors in the Whole-body joystick should be  $1M\Omega$  as was shown in Figure III. However, virtually any value from  $3k\Omega$  upwards should do – as long as they are the same – as they only work as a potential divider.

As for the capacitors, the voltage rating is only the maximum the capacitor can take before being damaged. As there is less that 5 volts in the circuit, any capacitor with a voltage rating of greater than this will do. In fact it's difficult to get capacitors with less.

#### Lower case please

PLEASE help me with a printer fault – I can't print lower case characters. I have an old TRS-80 line printer, linked via the parallel port to a BBC B. There are only seven data lines on the printer which I have connected leaving the eighth disconnected.

When the character set is sent to the printer all is fine until CHR\$(95). Then instead of printing CHR\$(96) it starts duplicating CHR\$(64) onwards. As the printer only cost £6 I think it's worth repairing. – D. Riley, Birmingham.

●There is nothing wrong with your printer. I had a TRS-80 — one of the first commercially available micros in the late Seventies, it had an operating system more sophisticated than the IBM PC has today. However, despite this it could never

#### Connecting an IBM green screen

I AM trying to connect a BBC B+ 128k computer to an IBM green screen monitor. Would it be possible to use a circuit similar to the one published in the May issue of *The Micro User?* – R. Clarke, Rochdale.

● Yes, it is possible to use a green screen monitor with the sync seperator pack 58. Two different types of monitor are available, those that take in the RGB signal and mix it and those that require a composite video signal. If it is the former, just connect it up as in my article in the May issue.

However, if you have the latter, connect the Video Out at the back of the computer to the Video In of the monitor. You'll still need the sync separator to provide the vertical and horizontal syncs.

#### When is a problem not a problem?

I HAVE a Watford Diagnostic disc which I run every few months to check my Master 128. Since I tried it last I have installed the new Master 128 system rom issued by Acorn. The test drive now fails on ram locations &8000 upwards.

Have I got trouble or is this a quirk or the rom, as I haven't noticed any problems with the programs I run? - P. Stonebridge, Ipswich.

● Any diagnostic program can only perform a limited amount of fault detection. If your computer works at all, 95 per cent of it must be OK. What programs like this do is add up all the numbers making up the rom software. They then compare this to the result on a known system. If you put a different system in, this number will be different and so the utility will report an error.

display lower case, so the official printer had no need to print lower case characters. In those days people were moving from mainframe computers with teletypes that only printed in upper case, so they saw no need for a computer to produce lower case characters.

of a number of identical cells arranged in a matrix, it's common for a run of memory locations to go bad all in the same way. It's not so much the memory locations as the addressing connections. Having said this, your rom did die early – most can expect a much longer life.

#### Processor hang-up

WHEN trying to use my friend's 6502 second processor with my BBC B and Disc Doctor nothing happened. Why? – P. Eagles, Olney.

•In order to use a second processor you need to have the Tube interface code in rom. This is normally in the disc interface rom kit known as DNFS (Disc and Network Filing System). This code is also included in the later Watford DFS roms.

Without it your computer cannot access a second processor. However the situation with Disc Doctor is slightly different. When it was originally written, Tube processors were uncommon so it doesn't take them into account, hence there is no effect.

#### Dead, but not forgotten

THE October issue of *The Micro User* mentioned an apparently damaged ViewSheet rom. I have a damaged version 1.0 – in &A000-&A3FF every eighth byte from &A006 onwards has its top and bottom bits set. So, for example, &00 becomes &81 and &7E becomes &FF. Everything else is as it was when it was new. What might the cause be? – H. Boothroyd, Gaydon.

• All things must die and that includes electronic chips. In most cases failure is due to the breaking of internal connecting wires that are so thin that they make a human hair look like a telegraph pole. The normal mode of failure is due to corrosion from moisture getting into the package.

However, elevated temperatures can cause these thin wires to melt. Another cause can be the diffusion into crystal deformations of the materials used to make the device. As the rom is made up

#### Stepping stones

I NEED to control two small stepping motors with a BBC B. Although I am already familiar with the additional circuitry, I just don't know how to power it with the 5 volts from the computer, or how to produce digital output in the form of fast pulses.

Do I need additional hardware or can I use the printer or user port? – R. Conroy, Rowlands Gill.

You can't connect stepping motors directly to the computer's port – you need to use some interface circuitry. You can find this described in the May 1984 issue of The Micro User.

You can power the motor from the auxiliary power output of the computer as most stepping motors will run from 12 volts. However, the switching can cause interference on the power lines which could

cause the computer to malfunction. This would require you to use supply decoupling techniques or a separate power supply.

As to generating the pulses it is simply a matter of software – again supplied in the earlier article.

#### Frequency shakes

FOLLOWING the guidelines in the July issue of *The Micro User* I tried to connect an IBM PC monitor to my BBC Micro. I am based in the USA and have connected the monitor to the modified micro after connecting pin 6 of the RGB socket to pin 9 of IC33, not 8. Unfortunately, it seems to be having some problem with the vertical hold.

At times the picture is stable, but sometimes it shimmers as if it is jumping up and down a scan line rapidly. Other times it jumps intermittently up and down a line. These effects seem to be random and I cannot adjust the monitor to correct them.

When I change mode the monitor usually loses the hold and the screen smoothly scrolls up a frame and locks again. What do you advise? – J. Wright, Michigan,

The mains frequency is different in the USA and this is contributing to your stability problems, as the monitor is having the tendency to lock on to hum generated from the mains.

These symptoms are normally associated with the frame oscillator running at the edge of its lock-in range. It should be possible to find an adjustment within the monitor which will restore stability. However, remember there are dangerous high voltages inside a monitor.

If there is no adjustment the frame oscillator capacitor will have to be changed to move it closer to the desired frequency. A TV engineer should be able to do this for you..

#### In search of the Grail

I RECENTLY bought Lancelot from Level 9 and have been unable to make it work. I've fitted a Watford solderless sideways ram board with 16k in two 4364 chips. Unfortunately, the game fails to find this sideways ram, although it does wipe anything present in the ram at the time.

I have written to both Watford and Level 9. Level 9 say that it is probably a faulty ram board and I could try to dissemble the !Boot program and alter the code. As I have no machine code dissembler nor understanding of machine code, I decided against this option. Watford Electronics say the game is probably to blame for not recognising the ram and assure me that the 4364 is exactly the same as the standard 6264. What do I do? – M.R. Davies, Carterton.

•It's always difficult to say who is to blame when a piece of hardware and software don't get on. Especially as both were designed with no knowledge of each other.

Certain assumptions must be made when designing anything, and in the absence of definitive guidelines conflicts are bound to arise. Perhaps we should blame Acorn?

However, assuming that in all other respects the sideways ram board is working, the onus must be on the software. Having said that though, I know that it's difficult for software authors to know about all the possible hardware configurations. I think you must be resigned to the fact that they are incompatible.

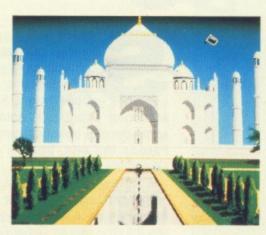

## Out of Exile

XILE is, debatably, the best arcade adventure ever to appear on the BBC Micro. It has a vast, continuously scrolling landscape, full physical effects like mass and gravity, strange creatures and, on the Master, digitised sound effects. But it has also been one of the hardest games to com-

But now we present the ultimate cheat for the ultimate game, it meshes seamlessly with the original game by providing an extra option on the main menu: F8 Toggle Cheat that switches the various cheats you have selected on or off.

All the other options function correctly including the option to Run Game, which automatically selects the appropriate cheat for normal or sideways ram version.

So type in Listing I, ensure you've made no errors using the checksums, and save it. When it's run you must ensure that the value of TOP is less than &2C00. The most important trick is to ensure that you don't type in the spaces after each line number. You can check the value of TOP by typing:

PRINT TOP

If it is over the limit, delete other extra spaces, any REM statements and join lines together until it falls within the allowed value. The reason for this is that the savegame position starts at &2C00, so the program should not corrupt this area.

Used excessively the cheats make the game both too easy and, in some cases, impossible to complete, so they should be used with care when absolutely necessary. Remember that you can always return to the menu to toggle them on and off.

#### The cheats

Disable certain events: This is a widely varied cheat, its most useful feature being that you cannot be forced to teleport by dying and it prevents the gun turrets and robots from firing at you.

A wide range of other small events have also been stopped, including bees, mon-



keys, fires, birds and so on. However, this cheat should be used with care as the game is impossible to complete with it working, as certain necessary events no longer happen - such as the dispensing of power pods from certain places.

Alter water level: This alters the level of the water with 255 at the bottom of the map, 0 at the top. Beware of using numbers too near the extremes. Not very useful really, but good for a laugh.

Make doors open and shut: This forces any door - including the portals - to continually open and shut. This makes it rather hard to get through some of the faster doors so, again, use with care. Its main use lies in getting through the portals which keys cannot unlock.

Set energy to full with function key: This puts the energy in any weapon or armour (F0 to F5) to full by simply pressing its corresponding function key.

Infinite energy: Much more subtle than the full energy cheat, this is less noticable but has much the same effect on game play.

#### The Mapper

Listing II may help if you are still having difficulties with Exile. Type it in, use the checksums to ensure it is free of typing errors and save it. Insert the original Exile disc and type RUN.

After loading up part of Exile the screen displays the start position - in the spaceship. Pressing the keys Z, X, \* and / you can scroll around the landscape in the required direction. However this program uses the map from the menu, so it is slightly different from the proper map in a couple of places.

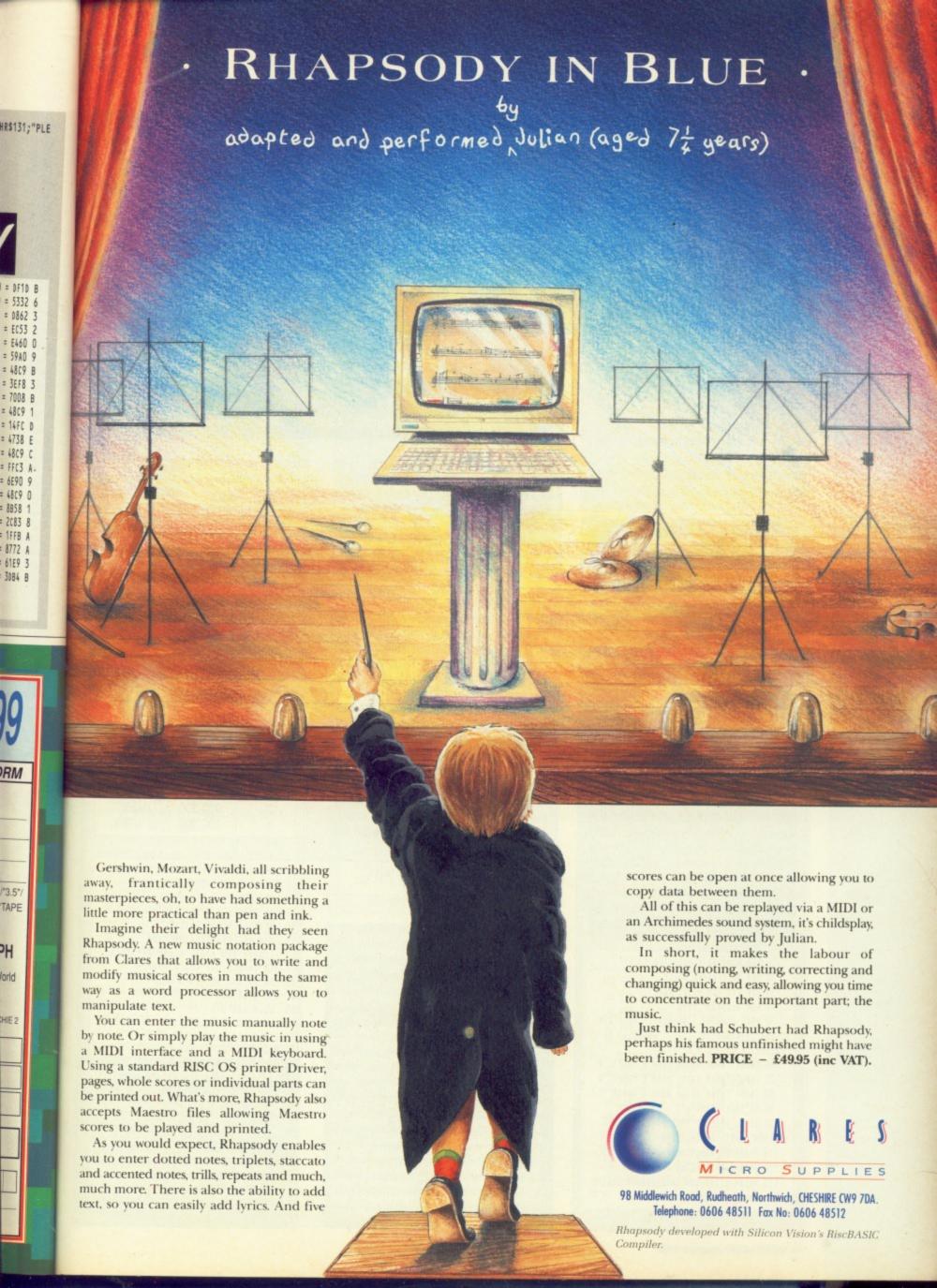

#### Solving quadratics

STUDENTS often find it more difficult to solve quadratic equations than general equations, because as well as having an unknown quantity, they incorporate the unknown quantity squared.

The usual method of finding the solutions is by graphing values resulting from trials on the equation, followed by a decimal search to find a more accurate figure. This is both time consuming and tedious, and often leads to inaccuracies.

However, by using a standard, complex formula, it is possible to find both solutions to 10 significant figures quickly by using our micros.

In the program, the formula is taken as being  $A(x^*x) + Bx + C = 0$ . Type in the program and enter the values of A, B and C and, as long as a solution is possible, the two values will be displayed.

MATHEMATICS can usually be found at the root of most computing applications, especially for graphs. The program listed below takes a new look at this subject, using the numerals resulting from long division as its parameters.

First you are asked to enter the scale size of the pattern - the number of Mode 4 pixels which each single unit is to cover. Then the initial graphics x and y co-ordinates are requested, followed by the fraction to use.

The fraction is entered in the format of 1/x where x can be any value you wish. You will find that in most cases those fractions which relate to decimals containing several recurring figures will produce the most interesting patterns.

To draw a pattern on the screen, the fraction is converted to a decimal using long division, then displayed using this rule: Each digit is taken in turn and a line with a length of that many units is drawn, the exact length depending on the scale.

After this, the cursor is rotated left

through a 90 degree angle. This process is then repeated continuously - although the display appears to come to an end when the numerals in the decimal all become zeros, or the pattern repeats

For example, if we used the fraction 1/16, the decimal equivalent would be 0.0625, the overall display format being:

- Turn left through 90 degrees.
- Draw a line six units long.
- Turn left through 90 degrees.
- Draw a line two units long.
- Turn left through 90 degrees.

#### Dating with a Master

ONE of the major enhancements of the Master series over the original BBC Micro is the built-in real-time clock. By using the \*Time command, we can find out the current day, date and time.

However, in some applications we may only want part of this information for example the date for automatic insertion into a letter.

Within the Basic environment this is not too difficult to achieve - instead of \*Time we can use the TIME\$ function to read the string, extracting only the necessary parts.

It's not quite so straightforward In non-Basic languages and machine code because the TIME\$ function is not present, and \*Time can only be used to read and print up the entire string in one go. What we need is a new command - \*Date - which prints up only the relevant information.

The operating system command Osword 14 with XY set to function 0 will get this data. It reads a parameter block of 25 characters - the full string followed by a carriage return marker. We are concerned with bytes 4 to 14.

The short listing below assembles a piece of machine code to do just this, automatically saving it under the filename of Date in the currently selected directory. Subsequently using \*Date at the appropriate moment produces the desired result.

More details on the different formats of the Osword 14 (read CMOS clock) and Osword 15 (write CMOS clock) calls can be found on pages D.3-22 to D.3-25 of the Master Reference Manual Part One.

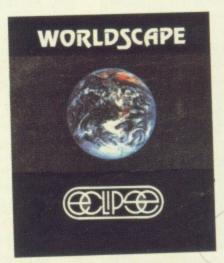

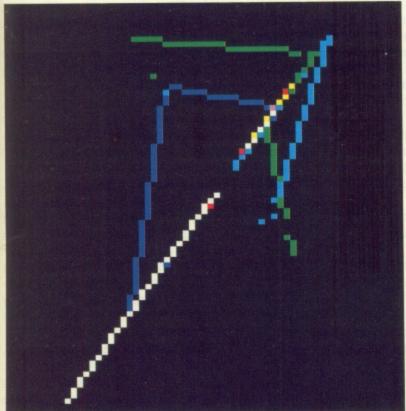

## Kinky kinetics

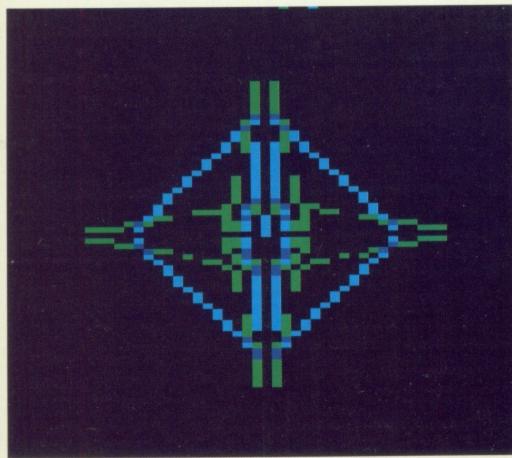
INETIC art is making a comeback. Perhaps it's something to do with the nostalgia for the Sixties – even flared trousers are fashionable again. Well for those of you who missed it the first time round kinetic art, as the name implies, involves a work that is constantly changing, offering new and surprising forms for the viewer.

I recently saw a fine example of this in Bremen, Germany, by the river: Three huge, slowly revolving blades. However most kinetic art is passive, which means the viewer is accepting a pre-programed sequence of events. This sort of system is

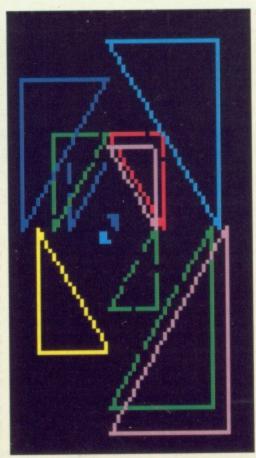
known as deterministic because all the possible patterns have been determined in advance when it was made.

What characterises the best of kinetic art is the ability of the viewer to take an active part in generating and guiding the presentation before him. However as most artists are not engineers this feedback tended to

Triangular art

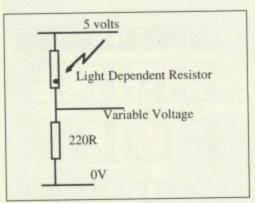


Figure I: The basic potential divider

be rather crude. In the Sixties there was no easy access to computers, so most systems tended to be electro-mechanical affairs. So to end the year I have decided to investigate the capabilities of a simple but flexible computerised system.

What I needed was a low cost transducer which could respond to a person's presence. There are several possibilities, but I have decided to use four light-dependent resistors as they are cheap and easy to interface.

The cadmium sulphide light dependent

resistor works like this: Particles of light (photons) hit the chemical and dislodge electrons from the atoms which allow them to take place in the conduction process.

The more light that falls on it the more electrons there are and the easier it is to conduct electricity. Hence more light equals lower resistance.

We can use this effect in a simple potential divider as shown in Figure I. We need four of these circuits connected to each channel of the analogue input port or joy-stick socket.

The full practical diagram is shown in Figure II. The numbers on the right hand side refer to the 15 way D-Type plug – if you look closely the numbers are printed on the back of the plug.

The electronic components are available as Body Build pack No.67 (see the order form).

Now how to arrange the photo cells? There are various options: One is to place them in a group in a box, then by waving your hands over the box you will affect each photoelectric sensor differently. Another idea is to place a photo cell at each corner of the monitor, then with a little

backlighting a viewer in front of the screen will cause changes dependent upon his viewing position. You could arrange a bout with light bulbs at one side and the cells of the other. The viewer then inserts his hand to manipulate the display.

However the hardware, as ever, is only part of the story. What brings it all to life is the software. This is where your imagination comes in, however to get you going have come up with the program in Listing!

This is split up into two parts, a test program and a sample art package. A procedure common to both is SAMP, defined a line 1140, which samples the light sensors and scales it to the range 0 to 39. The variable SCALE% controls the dynamic range and OSET% is used to remove any residual offset. You will probably have to play about with these variables to suit your local light levels.

The test portion, which starts at line 980 produces a line bar graph for each sensor. You can use this to adjust your light levels or to see the results of changing the size and offset variables.

Having set up the system, pressing any key takes you to the art part of the pro-

gram. This is basically three different types of pattern you can alter with the light sensors, the length of time each one is shown is controlled by the variable in line 80, which is currently set for 30 seconds.

To speed up the pattern generation use is made of a lookup table X%(n) and Y%(n) to relate the sample value to the appropriate screen co-ordinates.

The procedure POLYGON uses the light sensors to control the position of each corner of a quadrilateral. This changes shape in sympathy with the light sensors. A record of each shape is stored in the arrays OX%() and OY%and when a certain number have been displayed the oldest one is removed.

The number of shapes on the screen at any one time is controlled by the variable N% set up in line 130. If you are running this on the faster Archimedes you might like to make this a large value. This pattern responds very quickly to light changes.

The next pattern, PROC\_LINE, is more subtle. It is formed by a cross at the centre of the screen. Points along the arms of the cross are determined by the light sensors and then each point is connected to every

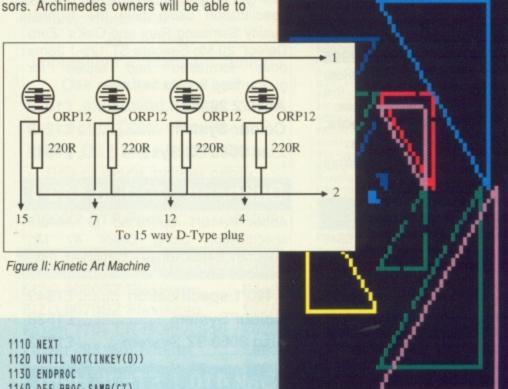
other point. This has a four fold symmetry, the number of patterns on the screen for it being limited to two.

Finally PROC\_TRI makes each corner of the screen respond to a different light sensor. A triangle is drawn with size and displacement from the centre controlled by the light sensor.

In all these displays I have chosen the colours at random, and there is nothing to stop you assigning this to one of the sensors. Archimedes owners will be able to

experiment in the higher colour modes and achieve even better results. As usual I want the Body Build article to be a springboard for your own ideas.

I hope when you put on your one man (or woman) retrospective of kinetic art at the Tate you will invite me to the opening night. Have a very merry time this Christmas. See you next month.

## And Fourier

N the world of electronics, it's very important to be able to understand the nature of the signals which travel around our circuits and systems. The interesting thing is that all waveforms can be built up from a basic wave shape, and you can do it yourself using your BBC Micro.

Many types of wave are simple shapes, such as the sinusoidal signal shown in Figures Ia and Ib.

The voltage of our mains electricity supply is this shape. The size of the signal is called its amplitude, while the number of cycles that occur in one second is the frequency which we measure in Hertz – abbreviated to Hz.

This simple shape is fairly easy to handle in circuit design. However, other signals are not so user-friendly. In computer systems the data is in digital – on-off form – so it isn't unusual to see square wave signals, Figure II.

If we look in power supply units, we may find signals called half-wave and full-wave rectifier waveforms (Figures IIIa and IIIb). And delving into other circuitry may reveal such shapes as the sawtooth and triangular signals shown in Figure IV.

The remarkable thing is that these more complex signals can be created by adding together a number of pure sinusoidal signals composed of a basic signal called the fundamental plus other smaller signals called harmonics which have frequencies which are simple multiples of the fundamental. This idea is shown in Figure V.

For example, the second harmonic is twice the frequency of the fundamental, the third harmonic three times the fundamental

frequency and so on.

This idea was first shown by a French mathematician, Baron Jean Baptiste Joseph Fourier (1768-1830), who certainly wasn't to know just how useful his work would become in electronics and communication engineering. The signals are named the Fourier series in his honour.

Theoretically, an infinite number of harmonics are required to reproduce the complex signal exactly, but by just adding a few together we get a good approximation. Once we realise that complex signals are made up of a series of sinusoidal signals, we can predict the effects of circuits upon them.

Suppose that you are sending digital data down a pair of wires to a printer. The longer the length of wire used, the harder it is for high frequency signals to get through. Now remember that digital data consists of a whole range of sinusoidal signals at different frequencies.

If the higher frequencies can't get through then, at the receiving end, our onoff signal will be distorted because all its harmonics will no longer be present. In practice this limits the length of connection to your printer to just a few metres.

If we try to increase the rate at which we send data to the printer we have a signal whose harmonics are going to be higher still, and so even more prone to distortion. These facts limit both the rate at which data can be sent down a wire and the length of the wire.

To start with a complex signal and then work out the size and frequency of each of the sinusoidal signals in the series needs a great deal of mathemagics. It's much more fun, and just as instructive, to start with the individual sinusoidal signals and add them together to produce a resultant complex waveform.

The Basic program given here lets you do just that. So type it in, ensure you've made no typing errors using the checksums, save it then type RUN.

The program lets you to enter the size and frequency of each sinusoidal waveform and watch it being drawn. At any time you may instruct it to show you what happens if

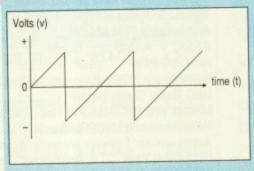

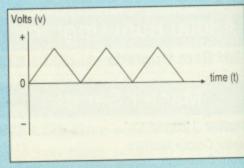

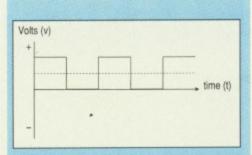

To see how the program works, let's take the square wave as an example. When the program is run you will see the graph-type display shown in Figure VI.

The figures on the vertical axis represent the amplitude of each signal, while the horizontal figures determine how many cycles are plotted. One cycle of the fundamental frequency corresponds to 360 degrees marked on this axis.

You are asked if you want to enter a

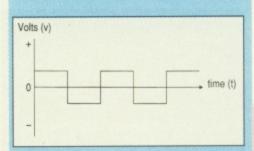
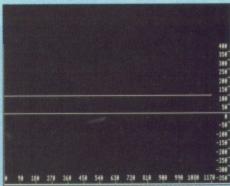

# d.c.(direct current) component. This is a Figure VIII constant value sometimes needed to lift the resultant waveform. Its value for the square next trick

wave is given as 100. The difference result if we didn't include it is shown in Figures VIIa and VIIb. You can see what I mean about the lifting effect. Type in 100 and press Return. If a waveform hasn't got a d.c. component, just hit Return. A straight line will be drawn across the screen with an amplitude of 100 (see Figure VIII). Now we start entering the

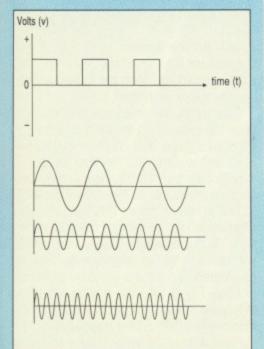

details of each sinusoidal component - the frequency is simply entered as a number. The fundamental frequency is one, the second harmonic - being twice the frequency of the fundamental - is two and so on. Just follow the on-screen prompt.

In this instance we want the fundamental, so press the one. The waveform amplitude is entered next and it may be a positive or negative number. For our square wave the amplitude of the fundamental is 127.32.

Finally a phase shift is allowed for which can be used to give a harmonic a staggered start compared with the fundamental signal. For example, see how the picture of a second harmonic signal with a 90 degree

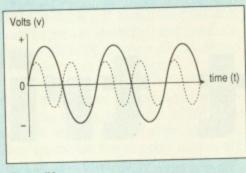

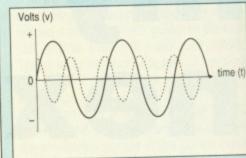

phase shift differs from that of the harmonic without the phase shift - shown in Figures IXa and IXb . The phase-shift is zero for our example.

The fundamental frequency will now be

drawn on the screen (see Figure X). Calculations are carried out for the first 360 points plotted and then the values are reused to speed up the plot.

Now follow the on-screen prompts and enter the values from the table for the other harmonics given. You can now ask for the resultant waveform. You can keep the waveforms you've already drawn and obtain a printout which looks like Figure XI.

The program shows the mathematical expression for the resultant complex waveform. To get a clearer look at the results, you can ask for the original waveforms to be cleared and for the resultant to be replotted - Figure XII - this is already starting to look like a square wave. A few more harmonics will flatten out the bumps.

Have a go at the other shapes and then experiment with your own values. If you're interested in electronics, you should find it useful - if not, I hope you still find it fun.

# Main procedures

Sets up the text window and initialises the program variables. The SCREEN complex wave values are stored in the array A%(). Draws each axis. By calling the procedure with L%=0, the vertical axis AXIS(L%,I%) may be erased. By restoring L%=1 and using your own value for 1%, the vertical axis may be re-drawn but with the figures scaled down by a factor of 1% Calculates and plots the sinusoidal frequency whose details you have WAVE(A\$) entered. AST month we looked at a technique of reducing the size of the screen on the Electron by blanking the colours during a delay provided by two different interrupts. This time we'll see how every ounce of processing power can be squeezed out of the machine by software alone.

Several techniques can give substantial increases in speed. The first thing to do is to disable the analogue to digital interface using a machine code osbyte with the accumulator set to 163, the *X* register set to 128 and the *Y* register set to one.

The equivalent FX call can be used from Basic, but this returns an error if the +1 interface is not attached. If the joystick is required only two of the four channels need to be disabled.

Another major speed increase can be obtained by disabling the keyboard interrupt, using an osbyte call with the accumulator set to &81.

The keyboard can still be scanned using the Inkey function with negative numbers as given in the User Guide. For example, to scan for the spacebar being pressed:

LDA #881 LDY #8FF LDX #(255-99) JSR &FFF4 BCC space\_not\_pressed \space pressed

However this takes time, so alternatively the keyboard can be scanned directly.

The keyboard on the Electron maps on to rom slot eight, so to read the data the

Basic rom must be paged out and the keyboard paged in. This may be done by storing eight in register &FE05.

If the program is written entirely in machine code this only needs to be done once when the game is initially run as you won't be requiring Basic again.

The 14 address lines from the rom socket are attached to the keyboard columns. If



a particular address line is low then one of the keys in that column is pressed. The row data from the keyboard is returned on the low order bytes of the data bus. For example, to find out if Space is being pressed:

> LDA &BBFC AND #8 BEQ space\_not\_pressed \space key pressed

To find out if X is being pressed use:

LDA &B7FF AND #8 BEQ X\_not\_pressed \X key pressed

The speed gained by reading the keyboard in this way is significant. The standard calls have to be general purpose routines which will return the same value on the BBC Micro, Master and Electron, so they must process the data quite considerably.

This technique also has the advantage that it takes less memory than the standard keyscan routine and so can be substituted in to the Electron version of a program with the minimum amount of effort.

# **Getting radical**

It is also possible to speed up the Electron in Modes 0, 1 and 2 by temporarily forcing the operating system into Mode 6. This is relatively easy to accomplish and involves storing &B0 into the mode select register at &FE07.

This register also controls the cassette port, sound generation, cassette motor and the caps lock light. However unless the program is loading from tape while attempting to change mode there is no problem.

The key factor here is that the change is temporary – we change screen mode only while the screen blanking is occuring, so the change is invisible to a games player.

This technique is often used in games



for drawing in new screens and can easily be adapted for use in any program which requires a complex screen to be drawn in Mode 0, 1 or 2.

The listing shows how the forced mode change can be combined with the Colour Chop to give an increase in speed while the bottom part of the screen is still visible.

The basic idea is to force the processor into Mode 6 while it is drawing the upper part of the screen at the same time as the colours are turned black.

When the palette is restored the screen is also returned to Mode 1.

The mode change also has the side effect of causing a hardware scroll which has to be compensated for by resetting the screen start address registers at &FE02 and &FE03.

Line 380 changes the screen start address

to compensate for the scroll forced by the mode change.

to draw the sprites always took the same time to execute.

The speed of certain machine code instructions vary depending on the location of the data which they are manipulating. For example the instruction:

### LDA &3080,X

may take either four or five instruction cycles to execute depending on whether the addition of the X register to the address causes the resulting address to cross a page boundary. However, by using waiting loops to balance this it was possible to get the final colour change line steady to within two pixels.

 Well, that's it. Speeding up the Electron with software is quite realistic, and it is possible to recover valuable memory from the screen without producing a messy hash of images. I hope you find it useful.

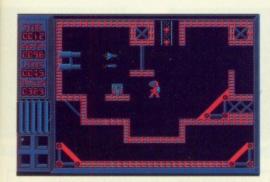

A similar technique to this is used in Star Port. The game uses the Vsync interrupt to change the colours to black and force Mode 6, but a different method was found to control the timing for the second colour and mode change.

The program was organised so that the sprite routine itself could be used as a timing loop. To do this certain compromises had to be made: There are always three sprites on the screen – though sometimes only one or two are visible – and they are all the same size – four bytes wide by 24 high.

The routine which draws the sprite is actually part of the interrupt routine – when the Vsync interrupt is detected the palette is blanked and Mode 6 is forced and the



sprites are drawn.

Finally, Mode 1 and the palette are restored to normal. By doing this it is possible to get a 50 per cent increase in speed while blanking five lines of the top of the display. The three sprites never flicker because the colours are always blanked while being drawn.

The main problem encountered with this arrangement was ensuring that the routine

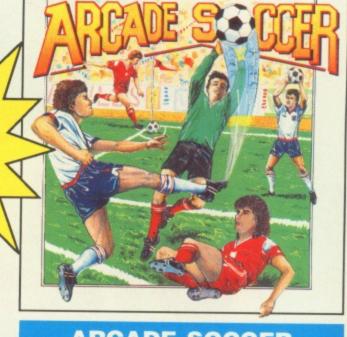

And no Christmas would be complete without an update to the Hac Man high-score table. Although the first edition was composed entirely from the high-scores of the authors of the featured games, I have long since thrown it open to all readers.

The only qualification for inclusion is that the score must be achieved without the use of pokes or cheat facilities. Of course, I cannot check on the validity of these scores, so I leave it up to individual consciences.

Most of these scores are quite incredible, all the more so for being genuine. However, three in particular really stands out for me: Gary Hunt's Thrust score, Perdita Patterson's more than five-fold improvement on her own high-score for Android Attack, and Corinne Berg's success with Tetris. This last one is particularly astounding because Corinne completed more than 900 lines in the course of this record-setting game.

She asks: "Can the score go to six figures?" Well, Corinne, Tetris stores its high-score table in memory using three bytes for each score, and each byte is used for two digits of the score. For example, a score of 98202 is stored in memory as 098202. I think this answers the question: Yes, Tetris can accept scores up to 999999. Keep going.

Incidentally, I have heard of higher scores than some of these, particularly a 30 million-plus Orlando totted up for Zalaga

# Going for the prize

As has often been said in this column, the arcade adventure is a very popular breed of game because it combines arcade action with adventure-style puzzles to bring out the best in a games player.

Although full-price offerings such as Exile and Citadel are possibly the best-known examples of the genre, arcade adventures more than hold their own at the budget end of the market.

One such offering is The Golden Figurine which was released by Atlantis Software a couple of years ago.

I recently received a letter from Oliver Robinson of Hemel Hempstead, Herts, who said that he could not get it to run on his Master 128, either with or without Acorn's Convert utility. The game loads from tape in 10 parts, but crashes as soon as the Figurine8 file has finished loading.

The reason for this is that Figurine8 loads into memory at page &A00 and overwrites what is called the extended vector table at the upper end of page &D00.

This table does not exist on an ordinary Model B but the Master needs it when call-

Let's press on with the solution to level two of Ravenskull which I started last month. We left our hero at the crossroads just north of the start position, having cleared all the treasure pieces from the south-west and south-east corners of the map. It is from this position that we continue our exploration of level two.

Unlike the south-west and south-east sections of this level, the north-west and north-east sections are quite independent of each other and in theory can be tackled in any order. Nevertheless, we will first attempt the north-east section.

Before we start, I should point out that the objects I described last month as boulders are in fact supposed to be wooden casks. So here we go, with casks and without boulders:

Proceed north from the crossroads, taking care with the room of spikes, and take the east fork at the T junction. At the end of this passage go north (ignoring the cask between the spikes – we'll come back to that later) and then go east until you reach a small crossroad.

On its right you can see two items of treasure, but it is imperative that you do not go right of this crossroad or a gate will close over the top of the nearer treasure piece, making it impossible to complete the level. Instead go north.

Take the treasure from either end of this passage. If you do not remove the

treasure from the alcove at the eastern-most end of this passage you will not later be able to move the nearby cask which – at that time – will obstruct further progress.

Now retrace your steps to the abovementioned crossroad and clear the treasure from the room to the south of the crossroad. Return to the crossroad and go west then south through the wide corridor to the right of the corridor through which you arrived at the crossroad.

As you make your way down this corridor you will see a scroll to the south and a fork to the west. Take the fork.

If you continue south you will cause two blocks to slam together behind you, trapping you with the scroll in a confined space with no means of escape. Instead, go west and skirt around the area of the scroll and remove the piece of treasure below the cask, together with the other two bits of treasure in the vicinity.

Retrace your steps to the point above the slamming blocks. This time go straight down and take the scroll. Use it immediately – it is another strength scroll – then discard it and leave the room by pushing the cask south.

Now go east avoiding the spikes and use the key that you found in the south-

west corner to enter the room to the south of this passage.

Take the four treasure pieces, then discard the key and proceed north, picking up all

the treasure as you go. Make sure that you pick up the two pieces from the right-hand side of the oft-mentioned crossroad without activating the slamming door, because you won't get another chance.

Make your way out of the north-eastern passage and leave this mid-eastern area by pushing the cask into the alcove.

Now proceed into the north-east corner of this level, carefully moving the casks to gain access to the treasure pieces and the second key. Now retrace your steps to the cask between the spikes mentioned in the first paragraph of the solution.

Move it out of the way to allow yourself access to a door. Open it with the key retrieved from the cask maze in the northeast section, then discard the key. Return to the T junction mentioned earlier.

As before, thanks to Alan Busvine of Brislington, near Bristol, and Bill Hensman of Keighley, Yorks, for all their hard work. Look out for the third and final part of the solution to level two in next month's column.

ing operating system routines - \*FX calls and the like - from Basic.

This is normally not a problem on any machine, since most games are written entirely in machine code. However, the last file of The Golden Figurine code – Figurine9 – is a Basic program that manages the data loaded in the Figurine3 to Figurine8 files.

Accordingly, any OS calls made after this table has been overwritten will make the program crash. To circumvent this, I have written Listing I, which prevents the extended vector table from being overwritten, thereby allowing the game to run on the Master.

One fairly serious problem I encountered with The Golden Figurine was that although it claims Electron/BBC compatibility on the cover, the versions of the game on both sides of my cassette were identical – both apparently for the Electron. As many readers will know, the Electron is a much slower machine than the BBC.

Many modern games access the Electron's video hardware directly in order to speed things up as much as possible, and will not therefore run on the BBC Micro.

However, if a legally-written game is designed to run at a suitable speed on the Electron, it will run blindingly fast on the BBC Micro. This is what I found with

Figurine.

To compensate for this lines 200 and 210 of the listing set up an artificial delay loop by causing the System 6522 VIA to generate interrupts much more often than it would normally do. Because all interrupts literally interrupt the 6502 CPU from its normal processing, this slows the whole system by keeping the 6502 busy.

The variables hislow and loslow allow the player to specify how much the system is slowed. The values I have set – zero for loslow and eight for hislow – give a playing speed with which I feel comfortable. If the game is too slow for you, increasing the value of hislow will increase the speed, and vice versa.

The variable *loslow* has 1/256th the effect of , and is really for fine tuning. I doubt that many readers will want to alter it. However, if for example, a value of eight is too slow and nine too fast, setting *hislow* to eight and *loslow* to 128 will give a result that is exactly half way between.

Incidentally, you will notice that the game slows considerably when you are pressing keys. This is because keyboard interrupts are being generated in addition to those produced by the 6522 – the poor 6502 doesn't really know what's hitting it!

Finally, line 170 provides an infinite energy facility. If you don't want it, delete this line before typing RUN.

# Rebounding success

UCH is made of how wonderful the Archimedes is, and how exciting and brilliant are the demos produced on it. Well, the BBC Micro isn't out of the running yet. Here's another excellent demo that shows off its muscles.

There are two programs, the first creating the data for the demo while the second actually runs it. Type in Listing I and ensure you've made no errors by using the checksums. Save, then run it. It takes about five minutes to run through and need only be used once to create a file called BalData.

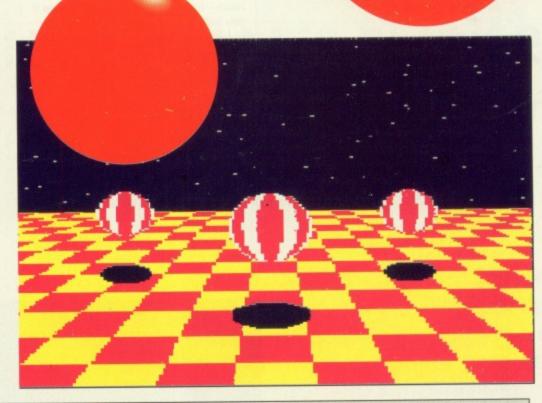
Now type in Listing II, check it with the checksums and save it. When run it loads in the data file and, by using a small machine code routine, quickly displays each frame, giving the effect of movement.

The method of animation is a bit like that used in the Beeb's Revenge demo. However, instead of drawing and saving each complete screen, only the areas which are changing are saved - called Delta Compression - in this case where the balls are.

This conserves memory and allows more frames to be used, even though a full screen is displayed.

The second listing uses a short piece of machine code to take the graphics data from memory and display each area, but only where the picture has changed, stepping through each frame to provide the illusion of movement.

Andrew Mellor's juggling act demonstrates the power of the BBC Micro

Variety is introduced with the addition of walls around which you must guide the puck, and tokens that initiate random events when hit.

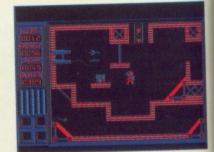

Once again, Superior can do no wrong in their continuing domination of the BBC/Electron software field.

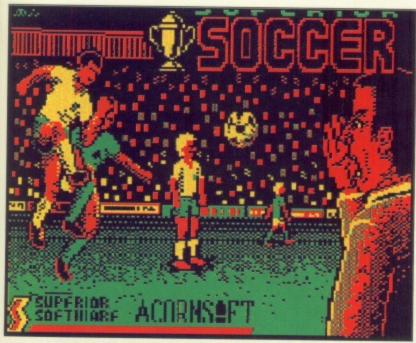

F all the strange scenarios, none have sunk quite so low as to suggest that the player is a mutated cornflake who has escaped the breakfast horror to find himself in the land of Yosh. Not only that, but he is now running for his life from the evil Tonneh.

Well, Pon is said distressed cereal, and for him to return to his proper place on the breakfast menu he must get through the

dimension gate.

I don't quite know which is the worst fate, but as death seems more imminent at the hands of the Tonneh, perhaps the breakfast option is a little more open. A cheery but long title sequence with music gives

way, after hammering the spacebar, to level one. A beautiful scrolling piece of text passes, assuring you that you are at the beginning. Then you are left to the real thing.

There's a time indicator on the left of the screen and the land-scape moves in a slick vertical scroll. Consequently all the screens are in a strip form and Pon is limited to sideways scampering within the bordered area.

You objective is to turn all the green and grey tiles to red while avoiding your homicidal adversaries in this strange land. Should you meet them head on they will drain your time bar.

However, these are not the only hazard you are likely to meet. Among the chartered paths are more taxing squares, such as ones which look like crazy-paving but crumble on touch, one-way arrows divert you into a cul-de-sac, lurking tombstones are inevitably fatal and

are sometimes cunningly partnered with slippery blue icy blocks.

You get a real sense of achievement as Pon whizzes around the screens – the tiles recede to red in a relaxing blotchy way and all the time our rancid hero winks and blinks his own body language.

A word to the wise – beware mysterious items that manifest themselves before you. Should you innocently jog up to and collect a poison bottle, Pon's face drops as nice red tiles become green.

However, should you meet any fellow nutritional cornflakes a touch of cannibalism will replace any of the three lives you may have mislaid earlier. Also an extremely use-

> ful tile allows you to short cut to areas to which you

might not h a v e a c c e s s. Though the Tonnehs are tenacious and mean they can be quashed by finding an exploding stone or more dexteriously stepping on to a crumbling section just as a furry foe a p p r o a c h e s. Beware of the

generator machines at higher levels too – they regenerate even nastier cousins.

The arrangement of the game is set to lull you into a false sense of security. You should be able to whiz through the first level, but then a more considered and strategic approach is required.

I could critise the graphics and simplistic game format, but I'm not going to as nothing detracts from the all-out, racing pace and fun. Only the addition of a jump level option and a pause key could enhance Pon. The music is swell and I don't even miss any sound effects.

O! This has nothing to do with cars or discs – it is, in fact, a new golf program. You can choose to play either the Lauren Hills or San Rivero course and a quick overview of each can be obtained before the selection.

Then the names of up to four players are entered, allocating them a skill factor and selecting whether they be left or right handed. Next choose which hole to start from, and let action begin.

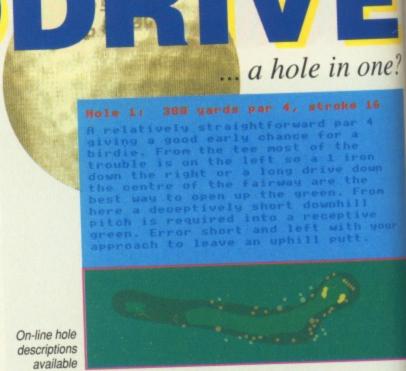
The display shows a 3D view

down the fairway. Hazards, in the form of bunkers, water and out-of-bounds areas, are clearly indicated. By watching the way the screen is drawn – it takes only a few seconds – some insight into the position of hills and valleys can be gained.

Also on screen is a wind strength and direction meter, plus information about the length of the hole and how far from the flag your ball lies. A helpful – but invisible – caddy will already have selected a possible club for you. You can, of course, make your own decision. There is onscreen advice on the hitting distance for each club.

At any time a plan of the hole can be called up, along with advice on methods for tackling problems. Switching between this screen and the 3D view is instant.

After mulling over the options



and selecting a club you start your back swing and - with a satisfying "thwack" - wallop the ball.

There is control over the amount of back swing and whether to hook or slice. At high skill levels these touches are very hard to manage. On the easy level, the computer seems to offer a lot of help.

With luck, your ball will sail down the middle of the fairway and so select a next club for the second shot. If things go awry, the ball may hit trees, get stuck in a bunker or perhaps land in the water. Most hazards are accompanied by very realistic digitised sound effects.

Eventually the ball will land on the putting green. These far-from-level surfaces are hard to portray on a 2D screen. Unlike Holed Out, you retain the 3D viewpoint and it's essential to watch how they are drawn if you are to sink the long putts. The satisfying noise of ball in hole makes the effort really worth-

while. When all players have hold out, a score sheet is shown indicating above or below par scores. There is no match play option, which I feel is a pity.

Playing a solo round and scoring close to par will take about hal an hour. Obviously, it will take longer with more or poor players. A facility to save scorecards would have been useful so that long games could be completed.

These are minor quibbles though. The game is an exceller implementation, with good graphics, and has proved great fun to my non-golf playing family. If you have no golf game MicroDrive could well fit the bill.

LD favourites tend to die only to be resurrected a couple of years later. While the scrolling text on the high-score table tries its best to convince you that you are saving the space/time continuum, this is yet another version of Breakout for the Archimedes.

Control of your trusty bat is by mouse only and you will need to develop a swift hand movement to return a deflected ball successfully because the mouse sensitivity is not controllable.

Each screen has its own title and unique mosaic of multicoloured bricks to hack away at. The ball glides across the embellished backgrounds with flicker-free ease and bounces off objects at unusual angles.

The shade of the brick donates whether it will vanish on impact, or merely darken a little before disappearing after another hit. Some hues of block are indestructible and will block your path as you fight to reach the remaining rectangles.

Random capsules descend from the minced masonry – catch them before they disappear and each will affect the gameplay. Some are beneficial and others are not – that trick of reversing the controls I find extremely irritating.

I rather like the sticky bat which offers a little timein which to aim your projectile, while the laser capsule is vital to complete certain levels. Other capsules widen the bat,

excite or dull the ball's speed, or build a temporary fence to save you all those volleying dashes – this is a great option when coupled with the multi-ball effect, by the way you only have to hit the white ball.

Sets of four bopping aliens provide a relentless cabaret as they appear in various positions on the screen and then dance back and forth, sending your best shots astray.

It is worthwhile taking a little time to shoot at them, as they deflect the ball disastrously in addition to being difficult to aim around.

An editor is provided in case you tire of the action. Flexing your artistic talent you can order ranks of bricks as you wish, finished arrangements being titled and set against a textured background.

Options such as copying, swapping, cutting and pasting are all available.

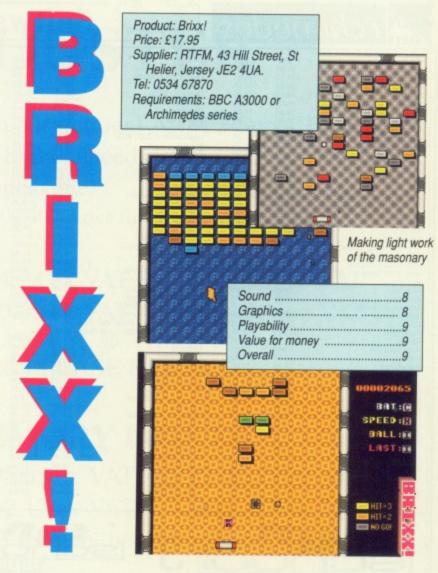
Strangely, all screens can only be saved as one datafile and on the game disc.

If your designs ovewrite the original you can retrieve it using the default screens icon.

This is a very limiting approach and means that it is impossible to swap home-designed screens with your friends.

The print option does little more that drop basic text screen information to the printer – a screen dump would have been more acceptable.

There are six levels, but I've not yet completed level three. The program's author says level two is his limit!

A score is given for each correct answer and if you remember enough your name will go on the high score table and be saved permanently on disc.

This is a simple game that will probably not amuse one person for too long. It could provide some party fun but it lacks that quality which gets people hooked.

SPACE-efficient programming is an important idea, making the best use of all the commands available. This is especially true when writing subroutines for inclusion in longer programs for the Model B since it has so little ram.

It does not always involve solving problems as you would do mentally - more often it is finding a combination of commands that provide a short cut.

Mr Ellis's solution to rounding a number to two decimal places appeared in the June issue of The Micro User.

Apart from its several problems which I outline below, I felt that this 20 line routine was a very lengthy approach to such a simple problem and that there must be an easier way. Well there is.

The trick is to multiply the number by 100 and then to take the INTeger of this, thus removing all digits to the right of the decimal place. Rounding up is achieved by adding 0.5 before taking the INT.

The last task is to move the decimal point back two places to the left. But if we do this by dividing by 100 we may lose one, or both, of the decimal places if the rounded number ends in a zero since, for example, 123.40 is printed as 123.4.

The trick here is to introduce a string variable, say n\$, which represents the string of the number.

To insert the decimal point, we simply take the leftmost digits, add a dot and then add on the two right most digits: "123" +"."+"40" = "123.40"

It is only a small step from here to a function which rounds any number to any number of decimal places. This is the six line function set out below. It takes your number n and the required number of decimal places p and returns a string rounded as specified:

Line 110 and 150 form the main algorithm, line 130 prevents a decimal point form being added when rounding to whole numbers. Line 140

Try out decimals betwen 0-1 without this line and you'll soon see why it's needed. The variable sign\$ is set in line 120 and enables the procedure to handle negative numbers.

The method I used works on the positive value of n -ABS(n) - and includes a minus sign at the end if necessary.

So to print the number stored in the variable A to three decimal places, you would use:

### PRINT FNround (A,3)

Finally, there is a limitation with this solution. The INT function only works on numbers less than 2,147,483,648 (2^31). So n\*10^p must not exceed this. Also, there's no point in specifying n to more than nine significant figures. as Basic cuts the decimal short at this point.

Mr Ellis's solution suffered from the problem of using the function STR\$ on a decimal. He also tediously worked backwards from the last decimal place, when it is only the

third place which decides whether or not to round up the

This causes a flaw in his algorithm: As printed, if one decimal digit is greater than 5, it will cause the one on its left to be incremented. But this wrongly rounds 12.345 to 12.34.

If, however, we change the rules so that the increment occurs when the digit is more than 4, another problem crops up. For exmaple, 12.3445 first becomes 12.345 and then finishes as 12.35, which is also incorrect.

Mr Ellis's program cannot cope with rounding negative numbers. It also fails with numbers less than 0.1 and more than 10<sup>9</sup> because these numbers are converted to scientific notation, which is not expected by the program.

I hope I have shown how space-efficient programming can not only significantly shorten programs, thus easing the task of debugging, but can also lead to simpler algorithms which are more easily adaptable to the general situation. -Simon Shaw, Oxhey, Herts.

# Art for art's sake

I WOULD like to thank you for the current PD articles, and associated software. Arctist+ on the July disc will not run on a 1Mb machine and if you want it to run then this is what you have to do:

- Bring up the Task Manager and drag System sprites to
- Select Mode 15
- Press f12 and enter:

# \*Dir !Arctist+.Files

Press Return twice to get back to the DeskTop, then bring up the directory viewer for !Arctist+ then Shift+doubleclick on the !Arctist+ icon. Double-click on Files then double-click on boot.

Things to notice with Arctist+ are the fonts inside the Files directory. Doubleclicking on one of them from the DeskTop wil replace the system font with a new one.

This has a wider use than just making your DeskTop look more friendly, as they can be used with !Paint and !Draw for hard copy print-outs.

With !Draw select System Font from the font menu then double click on the required font in the Files directory of Arctist+.

If you find yourself waiting for an outline font to be loaded off floppy disc into !Draw each time they select a new font

# More memory for a Master

I HAVE a standard Master 128 and would like to increase the memory size as much as possible. How would I be able to do this and what would I need to fit? I am looking in the region of 2Mb of ram.

Is this possible? If not what size ram can I fit as an option without having to change over to another computer?

Are there any disadvantages of doing this as far as my present software is concerned? — R. Bowler, Whatton, Notts.

• While it's possible to increase the memory available on the Master to such a vast amount – using a system similar to that in our July issue – none of your existing software would use it, nor is there any software on the market that would.

To get the kind of memory you're talking about you'd have to upgrade to an A3000 or Archimedes.

With a Master you've already reached the limit of memory for the 8 bit BBC Micro and your only option is to change machines.

However this will affect your existing software as most of it will only work on the 6502 emulator – slowly – if it works at all.

# Sprite redemption

VERY recently I purchased Computer Concepts hand-held scanner for my BBC A3000 and was looking forward to scanning pictures and manipulating them in Pro-Artisan.

Unfortunately it isn't that easy, the scanner will not function correctly in Mode 15 and therefore sprites loaded into Pro-Artisan will corrupt the screen.

Simply loading the Mode 12 sprite in Mode 15 doesn't work either as the palette is different. A quick solution is to scan and save the picture as a sprite and load it into !Paint while working in Mode 12 on the DeskTop. Then change to Mode 15 using the palette.

Click Menu on the !Paint

icon and select the Get screen area option, now you can grab any part of the screen and save it before loading it into Pro-Artisan.

Artisan users can load sprites straight into the program without the need for conversion as it runs in Mode 12 and the palette remains unchanged. I hope this has cleared a hurdle as some amazing results can be achieved using Pro-Artisan. — Chris Hunter, Gildersome, Nr. Leeds.

WHEN converting other people's machine code utilities to run from rom there is always the problem of deciding where to change an RTS to a JMP exit and if more than one exit exists for the routine or command there can be problems sorting them out.

You can always go through the code a few times and work it out but you may miss one or more. What is needed is some method of forcing the code to return to the exit routine no matter how many, or where, the exits may be. The following code achieves it:

Lines 310 to 370 get the address of the command and save it somewhere in page zero. This is followed by line 440 JMP (z-page+2) or equivalent.

If the address of the exit routine-1 is pushed on to the stack before the JMP (z-page+2) when an RTS is executed, at the end of the command, the address on the stack is loaded into the program counter just as normal and automatically incremented by one. — Randy Hutchinson, Pudsey, W. Yorks.

# Technique of going sideways

I HAVE noticed that many games have sideways scrolling landscapes. I am contemplating writing a machine code game and was wondering about a sideways scrolling one. I have seen routines in books that do this by programming the 6845 directly.

The problem is that when graphics go off one side of the screen they come back the other one line down. What I want is a continuous scroll – how do I get it? – Richard Tonge, Chesterfield.

 The trick is to draw the new part of the screen on the section that's just scrolled on to the right.

As far as the line offset is concerned, you need to apply an adjustment to the scroll value – you'll learn more by working out the exact details yourself.
