Letter dated 6 June 2011 from the Permanent Representative of Gabon to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General (\$\sigma 2011/340\$)

The meeting was presided over by H.E. Mr. Ali Bongo Ondimba, President of the Gabonese Republic, in his capacity as the President of the Security Council.

The agenda was adopted without objection.

In accordance with the understanding reached in the Council's prior consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Michel Sidibé, Executive Director of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS.

The President made opening remarks, as well as a statement in his national capacity.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution contained in document S/2011/341, submitted by Bosnia and Herzegovina, France, Gabon, Germany, Nigeria, Portugal, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America.

The Council proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (\$\frac{\$}{2011}/341)\$ before it.

Decision: The draft resolution (\$\sigma 2011/341\$) received 15 votes in favour, none against and no abstentions and was adopted unanimously as resolution 1983 (2011).

After the vote, the Secretary-General, H.E. Mr. Ban Ki-Moon, made a statement.

The Council heard a briefing by Mr. Sidibé.

The Security Council was addressed by H.E. Mr. Goodluck Ebele Jonathan, President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, H.E. Mr. Kgalema Motlanthe, Deputy President of the Republic of South Africa, and H.E. Mr. Alain Juppé, Minister for Foreign Affairs of France.

Statements were made by the representatives of the United States, Portugal, the United Kingdom, the Russian Federation, India, China, Brazil, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Colombia, Germany and Lebanon.
