NEW TITLES AVAILABLE FROM WAYOUT




Unlike chat rooms these 'forum trails' are left up for a long time to spread their negativity. These forums are the most destructive thing that I can think of for the transgender scene and are taking us back to the dark ages. I call for moderation and balance in such forums which can fast create, frankly, lies out of all proportion to the truth.

I have always believed in offering positive news of opportunities for everyone to try - If I have nothing good to say - I say nothing. I believe we all have a responsibility to do help the TG scene grow outside as well as on of the computer monitor screen.

Let me Join Bella Jay (of Roses Repartee) by echoing in her own words a call for balance. "Diversity is an important part of our community - it is always good to have choice. What we really need are more opportunities to get out, not less and calls for any particular business to close simply because a few people find it not to their particular taste are quite frankly just stupid!"



Lynn Daniels is a friend of whom I have great affection and respect for. Always sweet natured and a lady, it was great to do the photoshoot with her where she showed incredible patience when after six hours of shooting, we then said, "Strip off Lynn and jump on this box". Ms. Debonair, Titch and myself then spent two hours body painting her to produce the fabulous cover image. She particularly enjoyed having her 'nether regions' painted. I asked her to try and describe her amazing life in a few paragraphs, this is what she has to say!


I started dancing school in Bury near Manchester at the age of eleven, dance examiners used to remark that I should try and dance in a more masculine way. Once my mother commented as a joke, "Maybe you should have been a girl!". At age seventeen I got my break in to show business dancing in Showtime at the Gaiety Theatre in Rhyll. I loved every minute of it, except for the fact of being jealous of the girl dancers and their fabulous costumes. I worked in many other shows and travelled the world, and while dancing in a Revue in Italy the fire eater taught me the skills of working with fire. I moved in to female impersonations and fire eating, getting my first break at The Black Cat in Pascara in Italy. It was when working at Sheriton Hotel in Cairo that the crunch came when I was told that I could not go out dressed after the show because, "You are a man". Immediately I thought, "No one is going to say that to me ever again". I left the show and came home and went to see the gender reassignment specialist at Charing Cross Hospital, he started me on hormone treatment. Six months later I was auditioning as a girl with the fire act touring the country working in a very cleverly cut diamante bikini. I loved it but felt like a fraud and was very nervous. I almost got caught having a shave one day! After this I had lots of very painful electrolysis. Finally I plucked up the courage to tell my parents that I wanted to be a girl. My mother in relief said, "So that's what's wrong with you". She was concerned that a sex change operation would be irreversible. I said, "This is the best thing about it, the more irreversible the better! No one could ever say YOU ARE A MAN ever again". My parents paid for my reassignment surgery, after which there was no stopping me. I managed to fulfil my biggest dream, to be a Showgirl in the chorus at the Theatro Appollo in Barcelona. After this I went to Germany and toured with the five thousand seat Circus Krone, tap dancing down silver staircases in huge ostrich feather headdress's, riding the elephants, ariel rope ballet and fire eating. After five years with the circus I moved on to work in many other shows around the world including England. I now love being at home which I share with my cat Lucy in Kent doing one night cabarets. The only thing missing at the moment is that 'special person' in my life. I love returning to my roots and appearing in the shows at The WayOut Club. Reading through this I am amazed at my achievements given that I am dyslexic, tone deaf and have two left feet. I consider myself a very lucky 'girl'. If I can do it, anyone can!


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
The Lazy Crossdresser (book)


TV & CD Current Views (book)

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

I have often wondered how the name Doreen came to pass because Doreen is not exactly a name to conjure with. Can you think of a single film star called Doreen? Ever? Doris Day, Dorothy Lamour, Dora - well at least there was Dora Bryan. These days people just don't know anyone called Doreen. In the popularity stakes, it's right up there with Mona, but even Leonardo baulked at the idea of painting 'The Doreen Lisa'. For all we know that may have been the original model's name, and in one of those blinding flashes of parental stupidity perhaps the great man said 'I think I'll change the name of my creation from Doreen to Mona...'

There was a real Doreen and the story is a little like one of those Ealing social comedies. She was young, he was wealthy - and married. He wanted to be nice to her, so he set her up in her own dress shop and Doreen Fashions was born in City Road, E1. Shortly after this child of their illicit passion sprang into being, the lady herself upped and fled with another man, perhaps one who had a wedding ring to offer her - not just one he slipped off his finger into his pocket whenever they met. Meanwhile, just around the time Doreen made her escape into domestic bliss - and into oblivion as far as this story is concerned - another young couple got married: Les and Betty. Betty is one of those names that rolls back in regularly like the tide, helped by the fact that it is the shortened version of two of England's best-loved Monarchs. Les was steady, with a dry sense of humour. Betty was a little flighty herself in her way: a singer, trained in piano at Music School, a bit of a gambler by nature, full of energy. She might have taken her chance on the boards and kicked her legs up in a chorus line the way Betty Boothroyd, ex-Speaker of the House of Commons, once used to. In spite of their contrasting temperaments Betty and Les shared a mutual ambition: to be masters of their own fates, come what may. Post-war austerity was officially dead. A new Elizabethan age was dawning, so they took the biggest gamble of their young lives. Using all the money to their name, they bought the rest of Doreen Fashions' lease from the mistress-challenged gent for whom the shop had now lost much of its charm. And the rest, as they say, is history. 51 years of it! In a strange way there is a beauty about the name Doreen Fashions. It isn't fashionable, it isn't 'in'. It probably wasn't even back in 1953. It is timeless, without pretensions. And that allows each of the thousands of customers over the last five decades who have found a welcome in the present Lea Bridge Road shop to form their own associations. The paradox is that for most of them Doreen stands for glamour and sparkle, a touch of Marilyn or even Diana. A little stardust. In a way, how appropriate that Doreen's is, and always has been, run by someone actually called Betty. Like Betty Grable, whose gorgeous legs adorned more pin-ups than any other woman before or since. Star quality comes in many guises, but only one that I know is called Doreen.

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Visit Las Vegas and you will see a casino called Paris with a half height Eiffel Tower and a nightclub called 'Risque' with a Le Follies style show. Opposite is the New York New York casino with a reproduction of the Statue of Liberty and a nightclub celebrating the famous Studio 54.

If a casino was built on the Las Vegas strip called London – the roof would be shaped like St Pauls Cathedral and the nightclub would be called Madame Jo Jo's.

No other London nightclub has such a well known name and such a strong image. Jo Jo's neon sign is an iconic London landmark.

However in truth it is many years since Jo Jo managed the infamous venue as a six nights a week drag venue with the leggiest boy/girl waitress's (The famous Barbettes).

Madame Jo Jo's was, in its heyday, an adjoined show bar and piano bar taking the whole corner plot (now a separated). Owned by Paul Raymond, it was the plaything of his daughter with Jo Jo as floor manager. Every six months a new show was choreographed, sound tracked and costumed to run six nights per week. Saturday was always a hen night crowd but Thursday and Friday in particular would always have a choice clientele of celebrities, business men and smart party people with never a spare seat. Princess Diana and Sarah Ferguson, Johnathan Ross and most of the telly darlings, Bea (Golden Girls) Arthur, Caroline (Tula) Cossey, Des Lynam and sporting friends - and that's just the people I spotted. Each and every one was personally welcomed by Jo Jo herself as she did myself on my very first weekend 'out dressed'. Jo Jo made sure everything was "just so".

Wednesday night in the Show Bar was a little less crowded and the favourite night for the Transsexuals and Transvestites to cruise the bar area. The Piano Bar upstairs was always full of trannies.

When Paul Raymond's daughter died he lost interest in the venue (too much of a reminder of his daughter and good times). The new owners "let Jo Jo go" with new ideas in mind for the venue - indie music, niche music and comedy nights. But the image of what Madame Jo Jo's was has never faded. The drag hen parties continued on Saturdays but without the scale, budget or planning of the infamous shows of the past. UNTILL NOW

Miss Paula Pure who has regularly performs for the 'wannabee wives' recently negotiated a budget with Paris the venues manager to re-create the "full on - Jo Jo's show experience". With the help of a talented team of performers (including recent WayOut Star Search winner Sarah Lee) and the costume skills of Miss Sarah Lloyd. Paula has re-created the classic Madame Jo Jo's formula complete with Barbettes who swell the shows cast in the two half hour sets. The show has received critical acclaim from both the audience and the management.

On the launch night of the show Paula was supported by many drag friends but miracle of miracles Jo Jo herself returned for the first time to witness and compliment the labour of love that Paula Pure and her team have put into re-creating the legend.
