

CONSTRUCTION OF MOLASSES GATES AND COCKS FOR DRAWING LIQUORS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 2,342, dated November 10, 1841; Reissued January 25, 1848, No. 105.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Levi Lincoln, of Hartford, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Molasses-Gates and Liquor-Cocks; and I do declare that the following is a full and exact description.

The nature of my invention consists in the use of a lever of the second kind, in the room 10 and stead of the sliding gate, as heretofore used.

To enable others skilled in the art to make and use my invention, I will proceed to describe its construction and operation.

15 An arm, a, Figure 1, in the accompanying drawing, which is intended as a part of this specification, is made to project at right angles from the front end of the screw tube b, for the purpose of furnishing a center c, for 20 the lever d. This lever and also the arm a, are widened at the opening of the outlet of the screw tube as at e, e, to afford sufficient surface to insure the perfect closing of the outlet, which is effected by the lever being

slid down over it, being kept in close contact 25 with the opening by the segment f, which is adjustable by the three screws g, h, and i, the last serving also as a center on which the lever turns. When intended for a liquor cock, I cast a projection k, Fig. 2, on the 30 lever opposite the outlet; through this projection, communication is made with the outlet as shown at l, l, Fig. 3, which shows the reverse side of the lever. The dotted circle m, coincides with the outlet or opening of 35 the screw tube b, when the said opening is closed, or when the lever is in the position represented at Fig. 2.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of the lever d, with the segment f, adjustable by the screws g, h, and i, as set forth in the above specification.
