


INCLINED WATER-WHEEL.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 3,279, dated September 23, 1843.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ABRAHAM BAKER, of Dalton, in the county of Wayne and State of Ohio, have invented a new and Improved Water-Wheel; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1, represents a general view of the

wheel; Fig. 2, a section.

The nature of my invention consists in forming an inclined wheel with movable buckets in the rim so as to receive the water 15 at its highest point and discharge it at the lowest by which I am enabled to use a wheel of much larger diameter in a given fall than can be done with an overshot wheel.

To a stout shaft (a) I affix any convenient number of arms (b) and firmly brace them; around the outer ends of these arms a broad rim (c) is fastened which projects above the face of the wheel and inside of it another rim (d) is attached to the arms concentric with the first named one (c) and of the same width between these two rims a series of buckets (e) are suspended constructed of any suitable material the ends

of these are somewhat in the form of a trapezium the inner end being smaller than 30 the outer one so as to conform to the radii of the circle; they are hinged on a rod that runs across from one rim to the other under their bottom.

The wheel thus constructed is placed at 35 an angle of about 30°. On the rims are placed studs (e') forward of the supporting rod which keeps the bucket upright while going down and thus prevents its losing water (see section A, Fig. 2,) but after the 40 bucket has passed the lowest point it can
