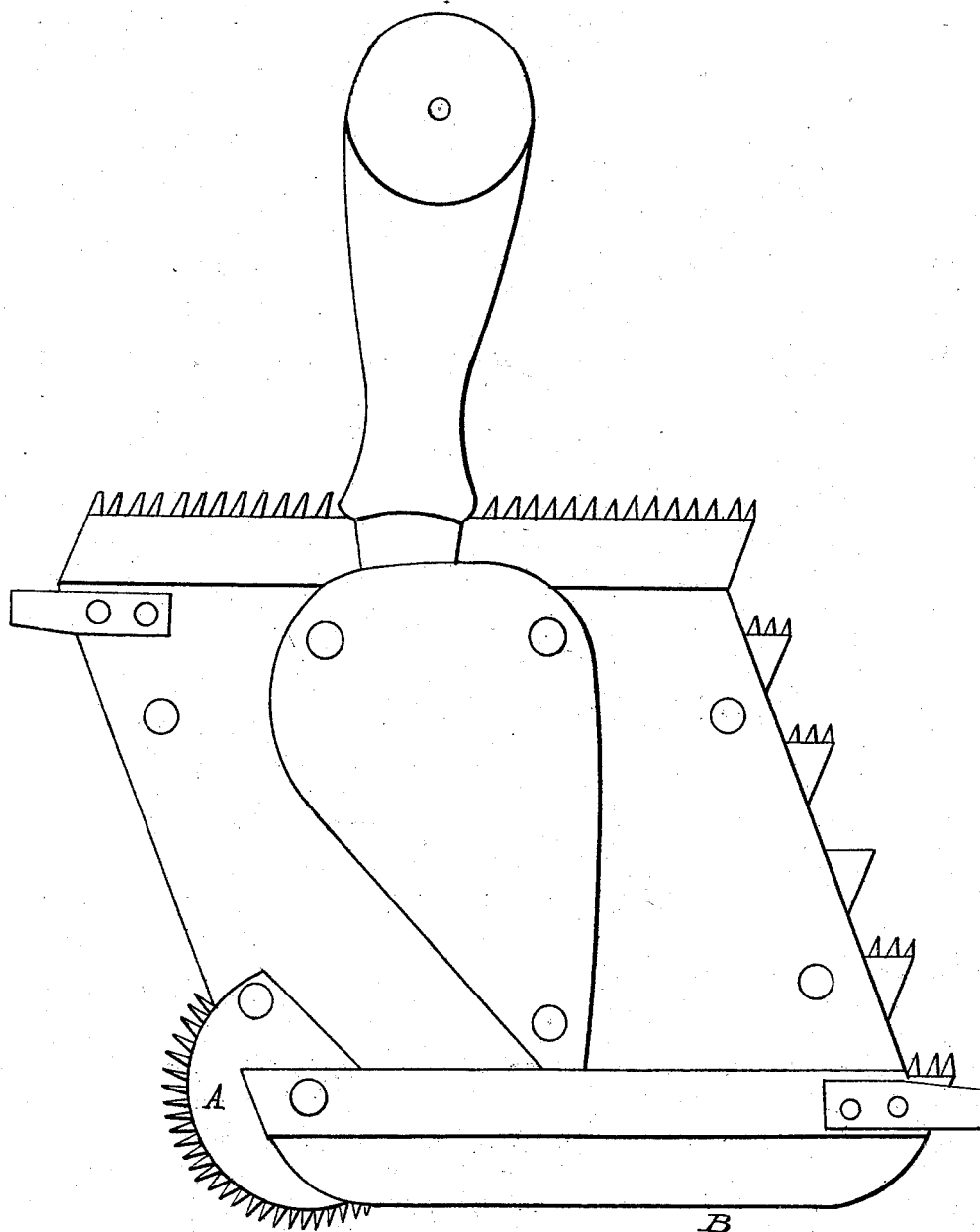

CURRYCOMB.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 3,706, dated August 16, 1844.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS WILKINSON, of Cambridge, in the county of Washington and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Currycombs, by which the operation of cleaning the concavities of the gambrel and posterior joints and of various other situations about horses is greatly facilitated; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full and exact description.

The nature of my invention consists in the addition of a serrated semi-circular plate to the corner formed by the intersection of the top and the right-hand margin; (see A, in the annexed drawing,) and also

of a blade, B three fourths of an inch in width, erected upon the back, extending from the aforesaid corner, on a line with the top, to its intersection with the left-hand margin, designed as a scraper, to remove any uncleanness; both to be made of the same metal of which the body is constructed.

What I claim, is—

Combining with the common curry-comb, the serrated semi-circular plate, and the scraper, in the manner described.
