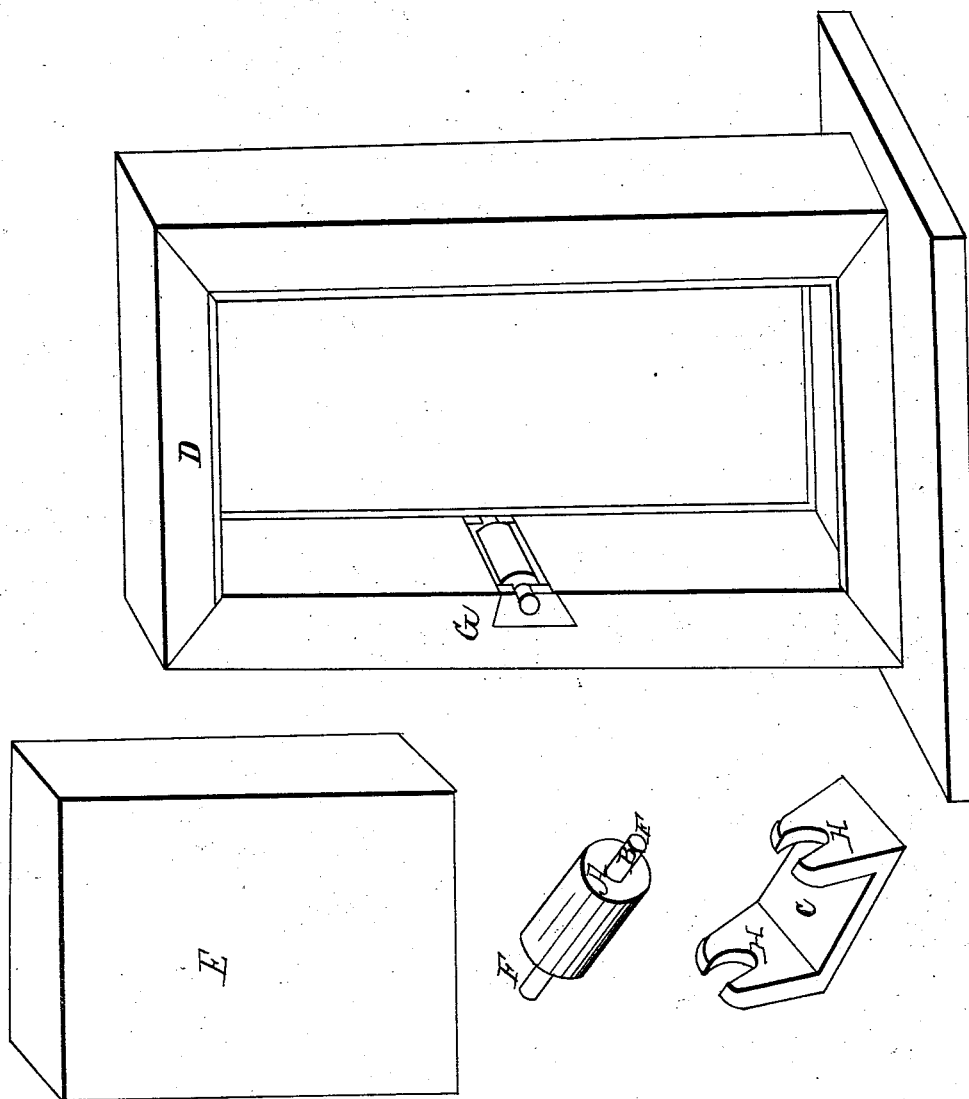

ELASTIC-ROLLER SASH-BEARER.

Specification of Letters Patent No. 7,267, dated April 9, 1850.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JULIUS A. PEASE, of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented an Improvement in Sash-Supports; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of same.

The nature of my invention consists in the combination and arrangement of an elastic roller A with a shaft through the center B and a box for said shaft to play in C, of which the following is a description, taken in connection with the drawings forming a part of this specification.

I construct the roller A of india rubber or other elastic substance. In the center I place the shaft B. The ends of said shaft F F I place in the journals H H, in the box C, in which they play. The box is placed into the side of the frame G or into the sash E, the elastic roller is left projecting above the surface of the frame or sash sufficiently to hold the sash in any desired position by friction, and is so regulated as to allow it to

be moved with ease. I use one roller to a sash or more. When two are used I place them opposite each other. The elastic rollers do not wear the sash and consequently do not get out of order easily. When they do get out of order they are remedied by placing a slip of wood behind the box and pressing it forward so as to give more pressure of the roller upon the sash.

I am aware that an unelastic roller or rollers pressed against either the sash or the frame by springs has been employed to support window sash. I do not claim such an arrangement, but

What I do claim as my invention and desire to secure by Letters Patent is—

The combination of an elastic roller with a shaft and box the whole constructed and arranged as before described for the purpose of supporting a sash in any desired position.
