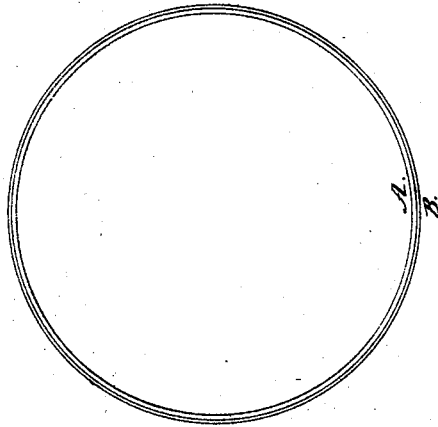

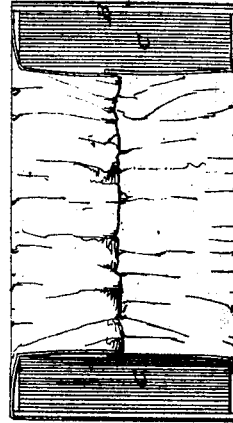

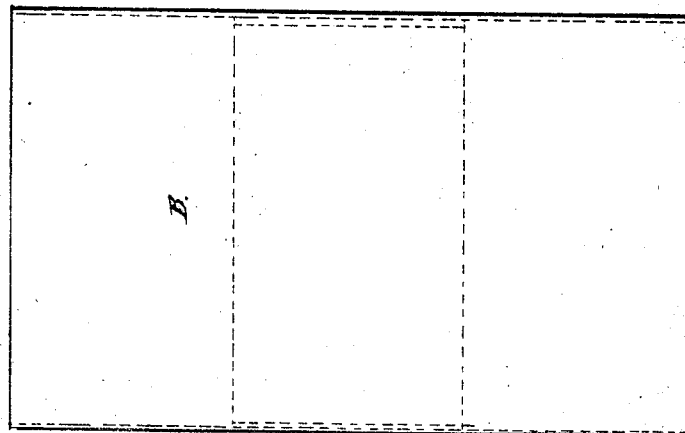
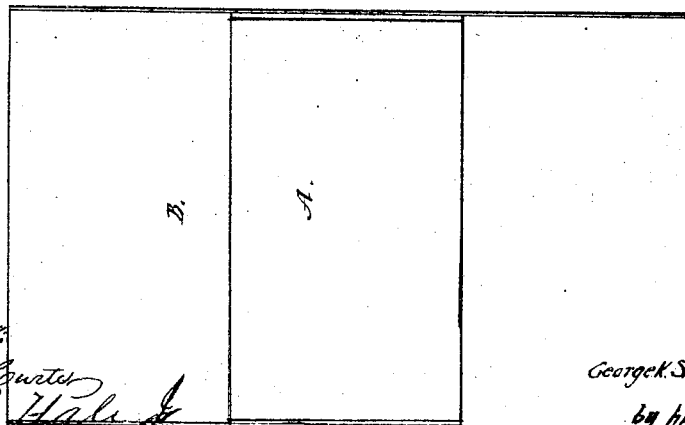

IMPROVEMENT IN PAPER-COLLAR PACKING-ENVELOPES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 48,848, dated July 18, 1865.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE K. SNOW, of Watertown, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Envelope for Holding Paper Collars or various other articles of like value; and I do hereby declare the same to be fully described in the following specification and represented in the accompanying drawings, of which—

Figure 1 is a side view, Fig. 2 a horizontal section, and Fig. 3 a vertical section, of it. Fig. 4 is a section of it as doubled upon a roll of collars.

It consists of a stiff tube of pasteboard or other suitable material and a flexible tube of paper or cloth or the equivalent thereof, they being arranged so that the flexible tube shall be concentric with and attached to, and extend in opposite directions from the ends of, the stiff tube, and so as to be capable of being folded down over such ends and a pack of collars or other articles placed within such stiff tube.

In the drawings, A denotes the pasteboard or stiff tube, while B is the flexible tube, the latter being made to encompass the former and to

project from it in opposite directions, and have a length about three times as great as that of the thick tube. Or, instead of the single tube B, two flexible tubes may be substituted, one of them extending from one and the other extending from the other end of the stiff tube, the whole being so that when a roll of collars is placed within the tube A the projecting parts of the tube B, or the tubes attached to the said tube A, may be folded down over the edges of the roll and within it, in manner substantially as represented in Fig. 4, wherein C denotes the collars, A the flexible and B the stiff tubes.

The above envelope for the packing of paper collars or other articles of like character for transportation and sale is one of great economy and advantage to the maker, as well as to the seller and the user of the collars..

I claim as a new manufacture, and as of my invention—

The said envelope, substantially as described, and for the purpose specified.
