IMPROVED LINIMENT.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 52,778, dated February 20, 1866.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN W. WOODRING, of Greensburg, in the county of Green and State of Kentucky, have invented a new and valuable Medicine which I call "Compound Stimulating Liniment;" and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof.

I take spirits of turpentine, one-half ounce; oil worm-seed, one-half ounce; oil spike, one-half ounce; oil olivæ, one-half ounce; tincture opii, one-half ounce; castile soap, one-half ounce; gum-camphor, one-half ounce; tincture capsici, one-half ounce; alcohol, one pint, and mix all together and apply the mixture externally for all kinds of wounds, bruises, sprains,

stiff neck, sore throat, rheumatism, and pains of the side and joints. Used internally, it will cure cholera, cholera-morbus, cholera-infantum, dysentery, and diarrhea. It is as valuable for beasts as for man.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The medicine aforesaid, composed of the constituent parts and prepared as aforesaid.
