IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUND.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

We, WILLIAM M. WILSON and DALLAS S. DENTON, of the county of Polk and State of Missouri, have invented a certain Composition of Matter or Compound called "Timber-Oil," to be used in the cure of pains of all kinds, especially those of a rheumatic character.

This invention consists of mixing cedar-oil, two parts, with one part sassafras-oil, said oils being prepared from those two kinds of wood, (the wood itself, when thoroughly dry,) and is extracted therefrom by dry heating without distillation, as such oils are usually extracted.

Claim.

We claim as our invention—

The manufacture or preparation of a compound which is denominated timber-oil, of the ingredients, in the proportions, and for the purposes set forth.
