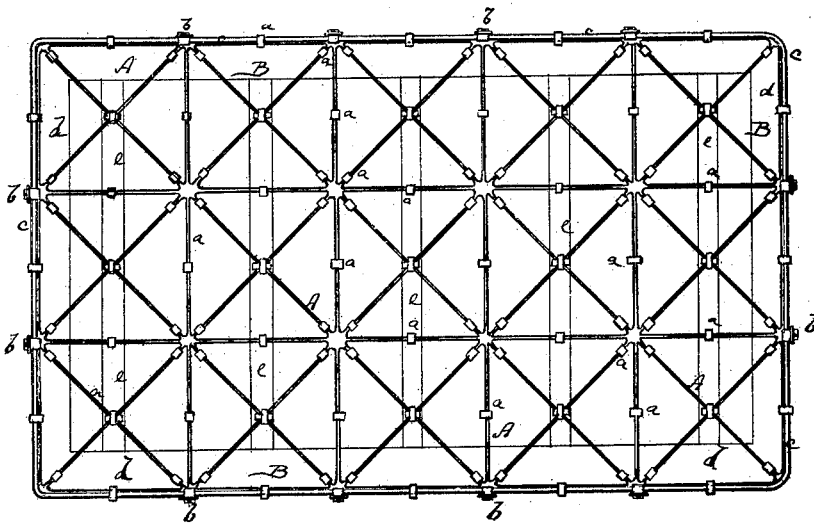
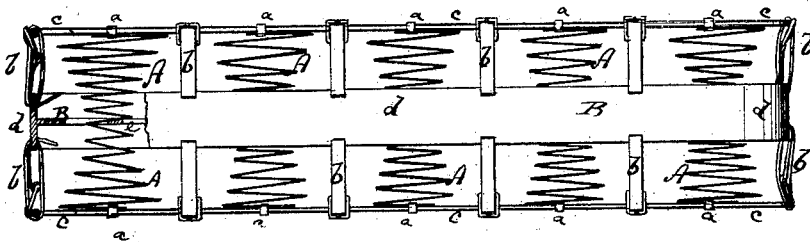

IMPROVEMENT IN SPRING MATTRESSES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES FULTON, of the city of New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented a new and improved Spring Mattress; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification.

My invention relates to spring beds or mattresses, and

My object is to make an improvement which will be first described and then pointed out in the claim.

Figure 1 is a plan, and

Figure 2 a side view, with my improvements embodied.

A are triangular coiled springs, which can be placed close together.

a a are clasps to connect them, formed of metal,

bent and tied around the adjacent sides of each pair of springs.

b b are straps, and

c c, wire frames, bent around the mattress.

B is a strong middle frame, sometimes employed by me, between the straps b, having rigid rim d, and cross-bars e e.

Having thus described all that is necessary to a full understanding of my invention,

What I esteem as new, and desire to protect by Letters Patent, is—

The clasps a, straps b, and frames c, combined with a series of triangular springs A, as and for the purpose described.
