

IMPROVEMENT IN WELL-TUBES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Andrew J. Shirley, of Plymouth, in the county of Marshall and in the State of Indiana, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Well-Tubes; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my invention consists in the construction and arrangement of a well-tube, with an improved sand-screen or filter, as will be hereinafter fully got forth.

In order to enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains to make and use the same, I will now proceed to describe its construction and operation, referring to the annexed drawing, in which—

Figure 1 is a side view, and

Figure 2, a vertical section of my well-tube.

Figure 3 is a side view of the tube, with the wire

wrapping removed.

A represents the tube, of any suitable dimensions, in the lower end of which the point B is inserted, and secured by means of a pin, d, passing through, as shown in fig. 2.

The point B has a shoulder or offset at e, upon which is the tube A, the part of the point above said

shoulder being inserted into the tube, and the pin d passing through said part and the tube.

At the upper end of the tube A are serew-threads, to form suitable connection with the pipe above.

The tube Λ is corrugated or grooved longitudinally with grooves a a, a suitable distance apart, as shown in fig. 3.

In the grooves or corrugations a a are holes or perforations i i through the tube.

On the outside of the tube A are also formed screwthreads b, extending the entire distance over and above the corrugations a and perforations i.

In these screw-threads is wrapped a wire, C, all around, as shown in fig. 1, forming a sand-screen or filter.

Having thus fully described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to seeure by Letter Patent, is—

The arrangement of the pipe A, provided with longitudinal grooves a a, perforations i i, and screwthreads b b, the point B, with shoulder or offset e, the pin d, and wire C, all substantially as shown and described.
