


## IMPROVEMENT IN CHANGEABLE-GAUGE CAR-WHEELS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Jonas Hamilton and GEORGE F. MORSE, of Portland, in the county of Cumberland and State of Maine, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Car-Wheels for Changeable-gauge Trucks; and we do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others to make and use our invention, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification, in which is seen a section of the wheel, bushing, and axle.

The purpose of our invention is to provide an improvement in car-wheels for changeable-gauge trucks;

It consists of the bushing b, having two sets of apertures, in combination with the car-wheel, and the axle, having the hole to receive the gib and key, and the gib and key g and h.

Our bushings are secured to the axle, as shown in the drawing, by means of a key-way, made entirely through the axle, and by means of a gib and key, passing through both bushing and axle.

The bushing has two key-ways, to allow of the different positions of the wheel in accommodating itself to the broad or narrow gauge.

a shows the axle. b, the bushing.

c, the car-wheel.

d, the key-way in the axle.

findicates one of those in the bushing. In the other are shown the gib g and key h.

What we claim as our invention, and desire to se-

cure by Letters Patent, is-The bushing b, having the two sets of apertures, in combination with the car-wheel, and the axle, having a hole to receive the gib and key, and the gib and key g h, as herein described.
