

IMPROVEMENT IN SIDE-SADDLE TREES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

1, ANDREW LAWRENCE, of the city of Louisville, county of Jefferson and State of Kentucky, have invented a certain new and useful Improvement in Side-saddle Trees, of which the following is a specification.

The first part of my invention consists more especially in the cantle or seat, which is turned from a solid piece of wood, somewhat in the shape of a dish, and secured to the tree by means of screws or rivets, the front edges being cut out in order to give it the proper shape at the side and in front where it connects with the horns.

The second part of this invention consists in the pommel or horns, which are made from a straight piece of wood steamed and bent in the proper shape, and secured to the lower part of the tree in the usual manner.

Having thus fully described the nature of my in-

vention, a more complete understanding of which may be had by reference to the drawing, in which—

A A is the lower bar of the tree.

B B is the cantle or seat.

C C are the pommels or horns, all of which are made of wood.

The above being a description of the drawing.
What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The cantle or seat B B, when turned from a solid piece of wood and secured to the tree by means of screws or rivets, substantially as and for the purpose herein set forth.
