## IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL BITTERS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THEODORE BECK, of the city of Omaha, in the county of Douglas and State of Nebraska, have invented a new Composition for Bitters, to be known as "Beck's Medical Bitters," the ingredients and proportions of the same being as follows:

To each quart of distilled whisky is added one-sixteenth of an ounce of aloes, one-eighth of an ounce of rhubarb, one-eighth of an ounce of myrrh, one-eighth of an ounce of horse-radish, one-eighth of an ounce of gentian root, and one-quarter of an ounce of orange-peels.

Upon completion of the mixture of the within-

named ingredients, the liquid is distilled and bottled for use.

Claim.

What'I claim as my invention, and desire Letters Patent for, is—

The composition of the medical bitters as above described, and manufactured of the within-named ingredients, in such proportions as above indicated.
