

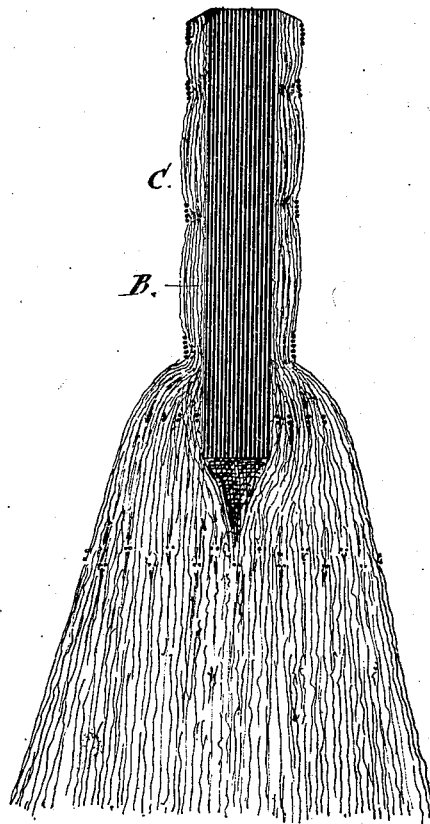

IMPROVEMENT IN WHISK-BROOMS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, GREENLEAF STACKPOLE, of Elizabeth, in Union county, in the State of New Jersey, have invented certain Improvements in Whisk-Brooms, of which the following is a specification.

Nature and Objects of the Invention.

My invention relates to the handle of a whisk-broom, the core of which I make of paper or pasteboard, covering the outside with the extended hurl-ends or broom-covering.

Figure 1 is a sectional view of my improved whisk-broom, in which—

B is the paper or pasteboard core, and

C is the hurl covering.

I do not claim the combination of a wooden core with the hurl when extended to the end of the core, for Martin L. Dickinson has claimed that in his patent dated September 30, 1862; but

What I do claim as my invention, and wish to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The paper or pasteboard core B, when covered with the hurl C, substantially as set forth.
