IMPROVEMENT IN MERCURIAL SALVES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, WALTER WHEELOCK, of Boston, Massachusetts, have invented an Improved Salve, called "Wheelock's Wonderful Cure," which is a remedy for humors, piles, skin diseases, &c.

The composition of my salve is as follows: Red precipitate, one ounce; fresh butter, one pound; resin, four ounces; spirits turpentine, two fluid ounces. Mix and simmer together.

Having thus fully described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The salve composed as described, and for the purposes substantially as set forth.
