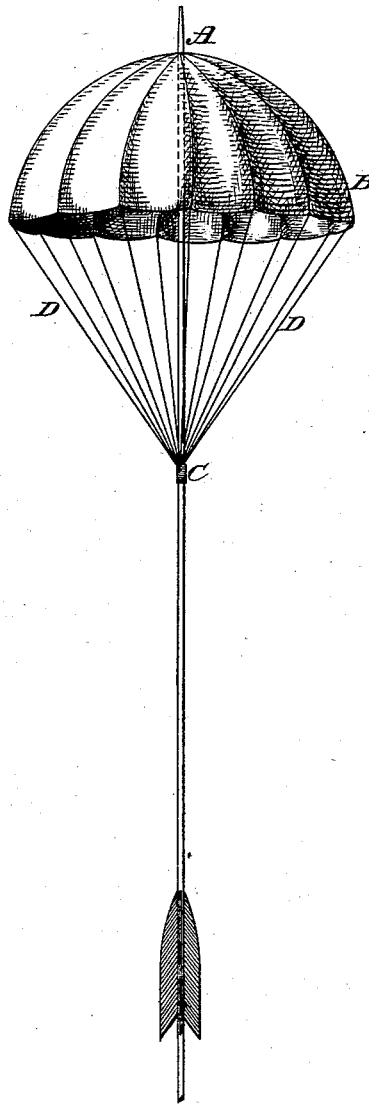

GEORGE MULLER, OF NEWPORT, RHODE ISLAND.

IMPROVEMENT IN TOYS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **216,526**, dated June 17, 1879; application filed September 16, 1878.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE MULLER, of Newport, county of Newport, State of Rhode Island, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Toys; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, and to letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

The object of my invention is an improvement in toys; and the invention consists in attaching to an arrow a parachute which remains closed until the arrow reaches its highest elevation, and in descending expands and floats in the air, the same being constructed in a manner as hereinafter described and shown.

Reference being had to the accompanying drawing, B is a parachute, made of paper or other suitable material, attached to the upper end of an arrow, A. D D are strings attached to the edge of the parachute B, the lower end of said strings being secured to the arrow at the point C.

Having described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A toy consisting of the combination of the arrow A, parachute B, and strings D D, arranged substantially as shown and described.
