

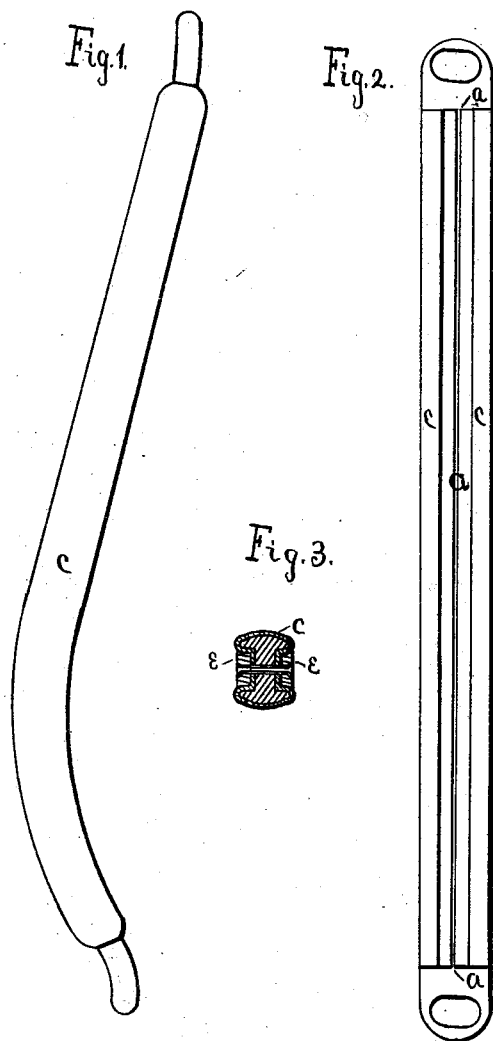

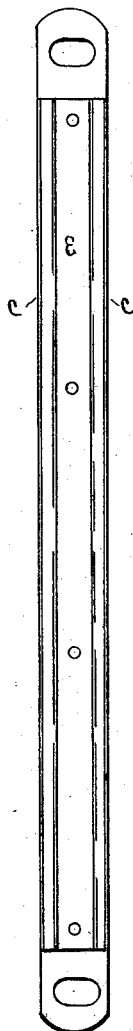

HAME.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 264,519, dated September 19, 1882.

Application filed July 21, 1882. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN G. EBERHARD, of Akron, Summit county, Ohio, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Hames, of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to that class of hames which are covered with leather or other suitable material and provided with an ornamental or longitudinal piece, by and through which the leather is fastened to the hames.

In the drawings forming a part of this specification, Figure 1 is a side elevation. Fig. 2 is a side elevation with the ornamental pieces removed, and Fig. 3 is a cross-section. Fig. 4 is a side elevation, similar to Fig. 2, except that it represents the completed hame with its longitudinal plating or piece *e* riveted over the edges of covering *c* to the hame.

It is preferable that the hame be metallic; but it may be made of any suitable material. It is formed with one or more longitudinal depressions, *a*. The covering *c*, of leather or other suitable material, is placed on the hame

with the edges of the leather in depression *a*, where it is held in position by a longitudinal piece, *e*, firmly fastened in said depression by riveting it to the hame, or in any other suitable manner. The piece *e* may be made to represent plating, and thus be ornamental, and at the same time serving the useful purpose of attaching the leather to the main part of the hame and protecting and concealing the edges of the leather.

I claim as my invention—

A hame formed with one or more longitudinal depressions, *a*, and having a covering, *c*, of leather or other suitable material, and a longitudinal piece, *e*, attached to the hame in depression *a*, over covering *c*, and firmly fastening it in said depression, substantially as described.
