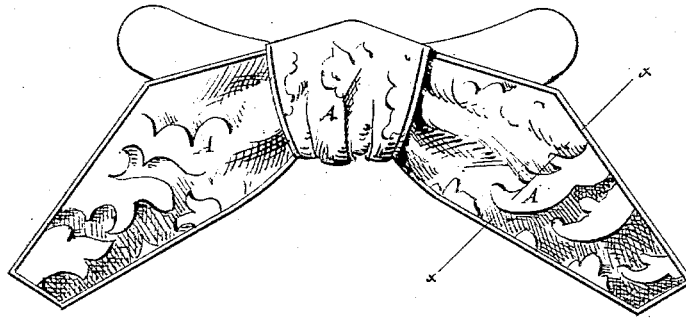

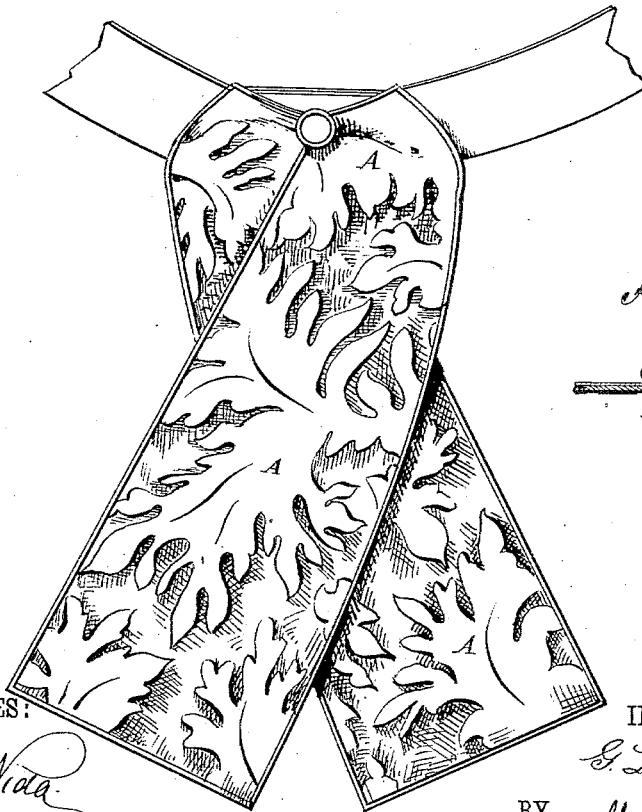
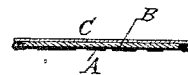

SCARF.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 303,867, dated August 19, 1884.

Application filed February 9, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE LENNIG, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improve-
5 ments in Scarfs, Bows, and Ties, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

Reference is to be had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification,
10 in which similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts in all the figures.

Figure 1 is a front elevation of one of my improved bows. Fig. 2 is a front elevation
15 of one of my improved scarfs, and Fig. 3 is a section on the line *x x*, Fig. 1.

The object of this invention is to provide
20 scarfs, bows, and ties simple and inexpensive in construction, durable in use, which can be readily cleaned, and in which the colors will not be liable to fade.

The invention consists in scarfs, bows, and ties made of leather or imitation leather, as will be hereinafter fully described.

A represents the front or outside of a scarf,
25 bow, or tie, which is made of leather or imitation leather cemented or sewed to a "shape"

or stiffening, B, of cloth or other suitable material, and provided with a lining, C, of silk or other suitable material. The fronts A
30 may be embossed or otherwise decorated in any desired style or manner and to any desired extent, and can be dyed of any desired color or shade of color. The fronts are very flexible, so that they will readily take any desired shape, and will retain their color, so that
35 they will not have a faded appearance. When the fronts become soiled, they can be readily cleaned with a wet sponge.

I am aware that neckties and bows have heretofore been made of struck up or embossed
40 paper or metal, and therefore I do not claim such invention.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

An improved scarf, bow, or tie, consisting
45 of the embossed leather front A, the stiffening B, secured to the front, and the lining C, substantially as herein shown and described.
