


FASTENING FOR STUDS OR OTHER ARTICLES.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 305,658, dated September 23, 1884.

Application filed February 16, 1884. (Model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH BAUER, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, have invented a new and useful Device for Fastening Studs and other Articles, of which the following is a specification.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a perspective view of my device in its open condition. Fig. 2 is a sectional view of the

A may represent any stud, button, brooch, or similar object. B is a small metallic bar, which is brazed or soldered to the rear of such object, and which is armed at one end with an 15 outward and forwardly directed hook, C. At the same end of said bar is a hinge, D, for attachment of an arm, E, which has a slot, e, whereby the arm is in its closed condition enabled to snap over the ridge b or bar B with 20 sufficient tightness to retain it in the said condition against accidental displacement. The arm E terminates at its free end in a hook, F, similar to the hook C. The stationary hook C

being first engaged in the garment or other object to which the article is to be attached, the 25 hook F is then engaged at the proper distance in the same object, and the arm, being then folded to the condition shown in Fig. 2, preserves this condition until the arm E is forcibly lifted by the user, which having been done, 30 the article can be released by a repetition in reverse order of the above-described manipulations that were employed in attaching it.

I claim as new and of my invention—
The device for fastening studs and other ar- 35
ticles, consisting of ridged bar B, fixed hook
C, and the slotted hinged arm E, terminating
in hook F, and adapted to snap over the ridge
b of said bar, substantially as set forth.
