

WELL-TUBE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 305,916, dated September 30, 1884.

Application filed April 4, 1884. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD GOGIN, of Pine River, in the county Waushara, and in the State of Wisconsin, have invented certain 5 new and useful Improvements in Well-Tubes; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

My invention relates to well tubes, and will

be fully described hereinafter.

The drawing is a section of a well and tube

embodying my invention.

A is the surface of the ground. B is a short tube driven in the bottom of the well. C is a galvanized tube, having the shape of an inverted funnel. The tube C has a screw-15 verted funnel. threaded opening in the upper end to receive another tube, C', that extends up to the surface, and the pump-pipe C² is passed down through this tube C' into the water in the tube C. Af-20 ter the tube C has been sunk and a sufficient

amount of tubing C has been coupled to it the earth is filled in, as at D, and properly packed. To steady the tube C, I provide it with lugs a, that rest upon the upper edge of

25 tube B.

In wells provided with my invention there

is no chance for surface drainage to get into the water, as nothing can get into the tube except from below.

I may dispense with the tube B when it is 30 desirable, and set the tube C directly in the earth.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

1. A metal well-tube of inverted-funnel shape, adapted for being sunk in the earth, in combination with a tube for receiving the pump-pipe, as set forth.

2. The tube C, having lugs a a, substantially 40

as described.

3. The tube C, in combination with tube B, as set forth.
