



## HEEL AND SOLE PROTECTOR.

GPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 344,526, dated June 29, 1886.

Application filed February 15, 1886. Serial No. 191,918. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK J. HERRICK, of New Britain, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented a certain

5 new and useful Improvement Pertaining to Heel and Sole Protectors, of which the following is a description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, where-

Figure 1 is what may be termed a "top view."

Fig. 2 is a view of the bottom of a boot-heel with the device of Fig. 1 inserted therein. Fig. 3 is a view in vertical section of the said boot-heels on the plane xx.

The object of this improvement is, as the 15 above title indicates, the protection of the heels and soles of boots and shoes, including rubbers, and more particularly the latter,

The letter a denotes the heel-protector, made 20 of metal, preferably hardened iron or steel, frusto-conical in shape, with the lesser face practically flush with the face of the heel. At its base this frusto-conical protector has lateral flanges b b and c. That side of the protector which is opposite c is left devoid lateral flange in order that the protector be located near the periphery of the heel, for the same reason the flanges b b are co spondingly curved on the outer side, mea

by "outer side" the side opposite the flan In the making of a rubber heel protec like this are embedded in the process of n

In using such a protector as this wit leather heel it may be inserted when the h is made, or a layer or layers can be taken the heel afterward and the protector inserte

I claim as my improvement-

The frusto-conical heel-protector a, provi ed with the lateral flange c, and the two pecu iarly-curved lateral flanges b b, all substal tially as described, and for the purpose so forth.
