




## **BOX OR RECEPTACLE.**

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 384,156, dated June 5, 1888.

Application filed April 12, 1888. Serial No. 270,416. (Model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD J. HAUCK, a citizen of the United States, residing at Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented new and useful Improvements in Boxes or Receptacles, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to an improvement in boxes or receptacles adapted for the reception of such material as tobacco, and by means of this invention such material can be protected against spilling, as set forth in the following specification and claims, and illustrated in the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a box closed. Fig. 2 is a section along the line x x, Fig. 1. Fig. 3 is a plan view of a box open. Fig. 4 is a perspective view of a cover.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.
In the drawings, the letter A indicates a body of a box or receptacle. The lid B is hinged cr jointed at C to the body.

D is a casing having an opening, and a cover, E, can be used to close an opening in the cas-25 ing D. When the box is filled with a powder

like or fine material—such as tobacco, snuff, and the like—the casing D prevents such material from scattering or spilling onto the lid B and onto the hinge C. When the cover E is in place, as seen in Fig. 2, the contents of 30 the box are prevented from spilling in case the box should be opened with the lid B downward.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. A box composed of a body, A, a lid, B, and a casing, D, in said body, having an opening, substantially as described.

2. A box composed of a body, A, a lid, B, a easing, D, in said body, having an opening, 40 and a cover, E, for said opening, substantially as described.
