## HAIR-TONIC.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 386,617, dated July 24, 1888.

Application filed April 18, 1888. Serial No. 271,097. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:
Be it known that I, WILLIAM T. WALLACE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Troy, in the county of Bell and State of Texas, 5 have invented a new and useful Composition of Matter to be used as a Hair-Restorer, of which the following is a specification.

My preparation consists of the following ingredients combined in the proportions stated, 10 viz: tineture of cantharides, one and onehalf ounce; oil of cocoa, one ounce; castoroil, one ounce; solution of ammonia, one half ounce; alcohol, one onnce; bay-rum, one half ounce; borax, two drams; flowers of sul-15 phur, two drams; oil of bergamot, one-half dram; olive-oil, four ounces; cologne, enough to perfume. These ingredients are thoroughly mingled by agitation, the cologne being added by preference in order to perfume the prep-20 aration.

In use the liquid preparation is applied to the head once a day until the scalp is thoroughly irrigated, and thereafter once or twice a week. By its use the hair will be prevented from falling out, as often occurs after fevers, and when 25 the follicles are not dead a new growth of hair will be formed on bald heads.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is-

The herein-described preparation for use as 30 a hair-restorer, consisting of tincture of cantharides, oil of cocoa, castor-oil, ammonia solution, alcohol, bay-rum, borax, flowers of sulphur, oil of bergamot, olive-oil, and a perfuming substance, in or about the proportions 35 specified.
