SALVE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 421,799, dated February 18, 1890.

Application filed November 7, 1889. Serial No. 329,550. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT WEYFORTH, a citizen of the United States, residing at Baltimore, in the State of Maryland, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Medical Compounds, of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to a medicinal compound for the treatment and cure of flesh sores of any description, such as gatherings, carbuncles, and sores resulting from burns, scalds, bruises, and the like.

The compound consists of the following ingredients, viz: olive-oil, four pounds; ground cloves, four ounces; ground nutmeg, one-half ounce; radish-juice, two ounces; gum-camphor, twelve ounces; glycerine, one pound, (sixteen ounces;) white wax, one pound, (sixteen ounces;) red lead, two pounds, (thirty-two ounces.) In the admixture of these ingredients heat is necessary to effect a thorough

incorporation, and the mass will be used externally as a salve.

The oil, camphor, and wax when combined in the proportions named form an unctuous base or vehicle for the other materials, the camphor also serving as a healing agent, while the other ingredients assist by their healing and stimulating properties.

What I claim is—

The herein-described medical compound or salve, consisting of olive-oil, ground cloves, ground nutmeg, radish-juice, gum-camphor, glycerine, white wax, and red lead, combined in the proportions substantially as specified.
