

STOP-HINGE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 458,727, dated September 1, 1891.

Application filed April 11, 1891. Serial No. 388,519. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH F. MCKIBBEN, of Farmer's Station, in the county of Clinton and State of Ohio, have invented a new and 5 useful Improvement in Lid-Supporters, which improvement is fully set forth in the following specification and accompanying drawings, in which-

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a chest 10 provided with my lid-supporter, and Fig. 2 a view of my device in operative position.

The object of my invention is to provide a simple and effective device whereby the lids of boxes and chests may be conveniently sup-15 ported in open position by an external appliance instead of the straps and link-hinge hitherto employed for the purpose, and which, being attached to the inner side of the chest, are liable to interfere with the contents there-20 of and are otherwise inconvenient and easily deranged.

Referring to the accompanying drawings, A designates a box or chest having a lid attached by ordinary butt-hinges B. The lid-25 support is made in the form of a strap-hinge

consisting of four sections or leaves a b c d, which are connected by hinge-joints efg. A bracket C is bolted to the leaf a. It will be observed that the hinge e bears an eccentric relation to the lid-hinges B; but their radii 30 are equalized by the action of the hinge-joints f and g, and when the lid is brought into open position the leaf b engages the bracket C, which supports the lid without unduly straining the butt-hinges.

What I claim as new is—

A lid-supporter consisting of a strap-hinge composed of four leaves or sections having its end sections attached, respectively, to the top and rear side of a chest or box, and the 40 bracket C, all combined substantially as and for the purpose herein set forth.
