

or, in the Alternative, Motion for Summary Judgment; and Defendants' Motion to Stay Consideration of Plaintiffs' Motion for Summary Judgment, lodged *in camera* and *ex parte*, for the length of that memorandum.

The additional pages beyond the 25 page limit for each of these submissions are needed in order to inform the Court fully of the grounds supporting dismissal or summary judgment based on the assertion of the military and state secrets privilege and other specified statutory privileges. Plaintiffs previously received consent to file a 43 page brief in support of their Motion for Summary Judgment.
