References:

a. Your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of March 29, 2001, for records concerning various dossiers. Your request was received in this office on April 18, 2001.

b. Our letter of April 20, 2001, informing you that additional time was needed to review the records and we were unable to comply to the 20-day statutory time limit in processing your request.

We have conducted checks of the automated Defense Clearance and Investigations Index and a search of the Investigative Records Repository to determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request.

We have located the enclosed records pertaining to Institute for Shipping Research Bremen, ZF010837W. We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order (EO) 12958. As a result of our review, information has been sanitized and 13 pages of records are denied in their entirety as the information is currently and properly classified CONFIDENTIAL according to Sections 1.3(a)(3), 3.4(b)(1) and 3.4(b)(6) of EO 12958. This information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(1). Fees for processing this request are waived. It is not possible to reasonably segregate meaningful portions of the withheld pages for release. A brief explanation of the applicable sections follows:

Section 1.3(a)(3) of EO 12958 provides that information shall be classified CONFIDENTIAL if its unauthorized disclosure reasonably could be expected to cause damage to the national security.

Section 3.4(b)(1) of EO 12958 provides that classified information more than 25 years old is exempt from automatic declassification if it would reveal the identity of a confidential human source, or reveal information about the application of an intelligence source or method, or reveal the identity of a human intelligence source when the unauthorized disclosure of that source would clearly and demonstrably damage the national security interests of the United States.

Section 3.4(b)(6) of EO 12958 provides that classified information more than 25 years old is exempt from automatic declassification if it would reveal information that would seriously and demonstrably impair relations between the United States and a foreign government, or seriously and demonstrably undermine ongoing diplomatic activities of the United States.

Since the release of some of the information deleted from these records would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned, this information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA per Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(7)(C).

In addition, information has been sanitized from the records and 13 of the same pages withheld under (b)(1) are also denied in their entirety as the release of the information would reveal the identity of confidential sources and sensitive intelligence methods. This information is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(7)(D) and (b)(7)(E) of the FOIA. The significant and legitimate governmental purpose to be served by withholding is that a viable and effective intelligence investigative capability is dependent upon protection of confidential sources and sensitive investigative methodologies.

The withholding of information by this office is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Brigadier General Keith B. Alexander, the Commanding General, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You may appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60 day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you filing litigation in the courts.

We have been informed by the Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI) that their information no longer warrants security classification protection and that the information bracketed in black is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(7)(D) of the FOIA.

The withholding of the information by the ONI constitutes a partial denial of your request. You have the right to appeal this decision to the ONI. Should you choose to exercise this right, you may appeal to the Department of the Navy, Office of Judge Advocate General (Code 34), Washington Navy Yard, Building 33, 1322 Patterson Avenue, S.E., Suite 3000, Washington, DC 20374-5066. To be considered, the appeal must be received in that office within 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. It is recommended that the letter of appeal and the envelope both bear the notation "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

We are continuing to review records regarding other titles you have requested and will respond to you by separate correspondence when our review is complete.

Op-0925 comments - 15 April 1963 - We have been receiving ice charts of the Baltic from Finland, Sweden, and Germany which in general contain similar information to that in the enclosed chart, inasmuch as the Baltic countries are now exchanging ice information. If the Iron Curtain countries cease exchanging ice information, then a chart such as the enclosed one would be very valuable for providing data for the USSR, Poland, and East Germany. Therefore continued forwarding of this and other types of marine science information is desired as available.

2. (C) On 17 Nov 62, a casual source of this organization reported that Sov ship POLTAVA, which had been sighted entering the Baltic Sea area on 1 Nov, had later changed course, turned about, and was at ODESSA (4628N-3044E) on 13 Nov. POLTAVA was carrying missiles from Cuba.
3. (C) Source claims POLTAVA tracked by West German Navy during time she was bound for Baltic. Source did not know when POLTAVA changed course, or if she came back through English Channel.
4. (C) Source's own opinion is that possibly Sovs intended unloading POLTAVA's missiles at Baltic port, but learned West aware of these plans. SCP-3

URGENT ONI REQUIREMENTS

1. (pt 9 on ONI list) Two Polish freighters put into MALMO on 23 Oct 62, carry NO CARGO. New crews for both vessels were flown from Poland, and the old crews taken back to Poland. The two ships then left for Cuba. What Polish freighters were in MALMO on 23 Oct 62? List all Polish freighters in MALMO on 23 Oct 62, their cargoes and destinations upon leaving MALMO. Requirement: the names of the two Polish freighters, the reason for the exchanging of the crews, any details on the descriptions of these freighters, crew lists if possible, any refrigeration facilities, and if they changed ships' names.

2. (pt 11 on ONI list) A report on each Sov-Bloc shipyard is desired. This report should include any unscheduled yard work being done on Soviet tankers on a hurry-up basis. It is expected that several tankers might be in a yard at one time, having topside alterations done. Details of alterations is desired. Report of any noticeable trend for more tankers than usual going into the shipyards. Soviets may use only their own shipyards for this work, but if there is a noticeable trend to take several tankers off their scheduled runs and put them in yards for short periods, they may use Polish or East German shipyards. Continuous requirement with reports to be submitted as obtained. Reports should indicate name of tanker, date entered or left yard, and work being done.

3. (pt 16 on ONI list) What is the position and cargo carried on the:

a. Swedish M/S "Coolangatta" - transited Kiel Canal on 11 Oct E to W reportedly bound for Havana.

b. Swedish M/S "Sottern" - transited Kiel Canal 12 Oct E to W reportedly bound for Havana.

c. Cuban freighter "Bahia de Nipe" - in Hamburg 18 Oct.

d. Cuban freighter "Sierra Maestra".

A. Details concerning trans-shipments from barge to ship (Sov-Bloc ships only) in the ports of HAMBURG and SZCZECIN, to be furnished on a continuing basis. What would be the cost of such reports if furnished fortnightly?

B. Details concerning cargoes transloaded at night from Czech barges to ships moored at the piers in the HAMBURG Freihafen. Names of the barges and ships involved, as well as cargo details and destinations of the ships are desired. Continuous requirement with reports as obtained.

C. Details concerning cargoes transloaded in the HAMBURG Freihafen to Cuban ships. The Soviet ships moor in the Indiahafen and the Cuban ships usually tie up alongside after dark, with transloading activity usually being completed by the next morning. Ships involved, cargo details and destinations of ships are desired. Continuous requirement with reports as obtained.

D. Details on cargoes being transloaded at Vera Cruz, Mexico, other Mexican or other Latin-American ports to smaller ships to be taken to Cuba. Names of all ships involved and details on ports and cargoes is desired by telegraphic means. What would be the cost of such reports if furnished fortnightly or more often if circumstances require?

E. Details on all cargo bound for Cuba from anywhere and everywhere throughout the world. Information is desired two/three days before cargo would arrive in Cuba. What would be the cost of such reports if furnished regularly as information comes available?

F. Details on all military equipment bound for Cuba specifically to include aircraft, helicopters, military craft (patrol or torpedo boats), and radar or fire control equipment. Names of ships carrying this cargo to be furnished two/three days prior to arrival in Cuba.

G. Identities of any Sov-Bloc personalities, either military or civilian, who are in Cuba, and information as to how they arrived there (name of ship and date of arrival), to include troops, technicians, scientists, and specialists. Any information concerning Cubans going to other Sov-Bloc countries for training, to include dates of arrival/departure, method of travel, identities, locations and activities. Continuous requirement with reports as obtained.

H. Any and all information concerning tank storage facilities in Cuba, either in coastal areas or inland. Any information on ship refueling facilities, fueling connections on piers, water depths at piers, etc. Can a study on all port/harbor maritime type fueling facilities in Cuba be furnished? What would be the approximate cost of such a study and when could it be completed? Any and all information is desired on port of MARIEL as soon as possible. Describe the refueling facilities at SANTIAGO de CUBA (tank farms, pumping facilities, capacities of tanks, diameter of hoses or pipelines, etc.). Are submarines known to be refueled anywhere in Cuba?

I. Up to date plotting of mine-fields anywhere and everywhere in the world is desired. Whenever possible, this should distinguish between actual known minefields and "Zwangsweg". A plotting of all the minefields/Zwangsweg in the Kola Gulf area is desired as soon as possible. One-time requirement for each area with additional reports to be submitted as changes occur.

J. Up to date plotting of all Cuban minefields is desired. This should include plot locations, type of mines, moored on cables, resting on bottom, pressure-wave triggered, acoustic, etc. Any information on known anti-submarine or anti-torpedo nets or booms, or any patrol craft (including armament) is desired. One-time report with additional reports to be submitted as changes occur.

K. Any information concerning construction of a shipyard at MARIEL, Cuba. Are any Polish engineers or shipyard technicians there? When and how did they arrive? Can any of them be identified? Any information concerning the possible construction of a submarine base in Cuba is desired.

L. Details concerning the shipment of goods (not including sugar, pine-apples, tobacco) from Cuba. Details concerning the movement of personnel in large numbers from Cuba. Nationalities and occupations are desired. Especially important is any shipment of military equipment, arms, munitions or guerillas to any other Latin American countries. The name of the ship(s), date of departure from Cuba, port departed from and destination are desired for an indefinite period as information becomes available.

Estimate the lifting capacities of the largest floating drydocks associated with this shipyard. One time report desired.

AA. Information is desired on construction of new, or expansion of old, port and harbor facilities in all Sev Bloc countries. Of particular interest would be any such work now being rushed to completion (working "around the clock"). Continuous requirement.
