

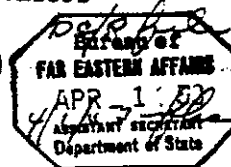

I had a long talk with Mr. Fisher Howe (see attached papers) and emphasized the importance that this Office attaches to

last but not least, the utility of brief secret intelligence reports on subjects and of a nature which might well not be covered fully or available through normal channels and correspondingly the inutility of long analytical theses regurgitating material already at hand.

Mr. Fisher Howe seemed to recognize the desirability of the above observations and expressed himself as most anxious to be helpful and cooperative and to keep in close touch with the chiefs of the divisions as well as FE. He also indicated that he did not propose to attempt to obtain approval for increases without prior consultation with us and that he hoped to ensure that before new personnel went to the field as replacements they would be briefed, etc., in the Divisions.
