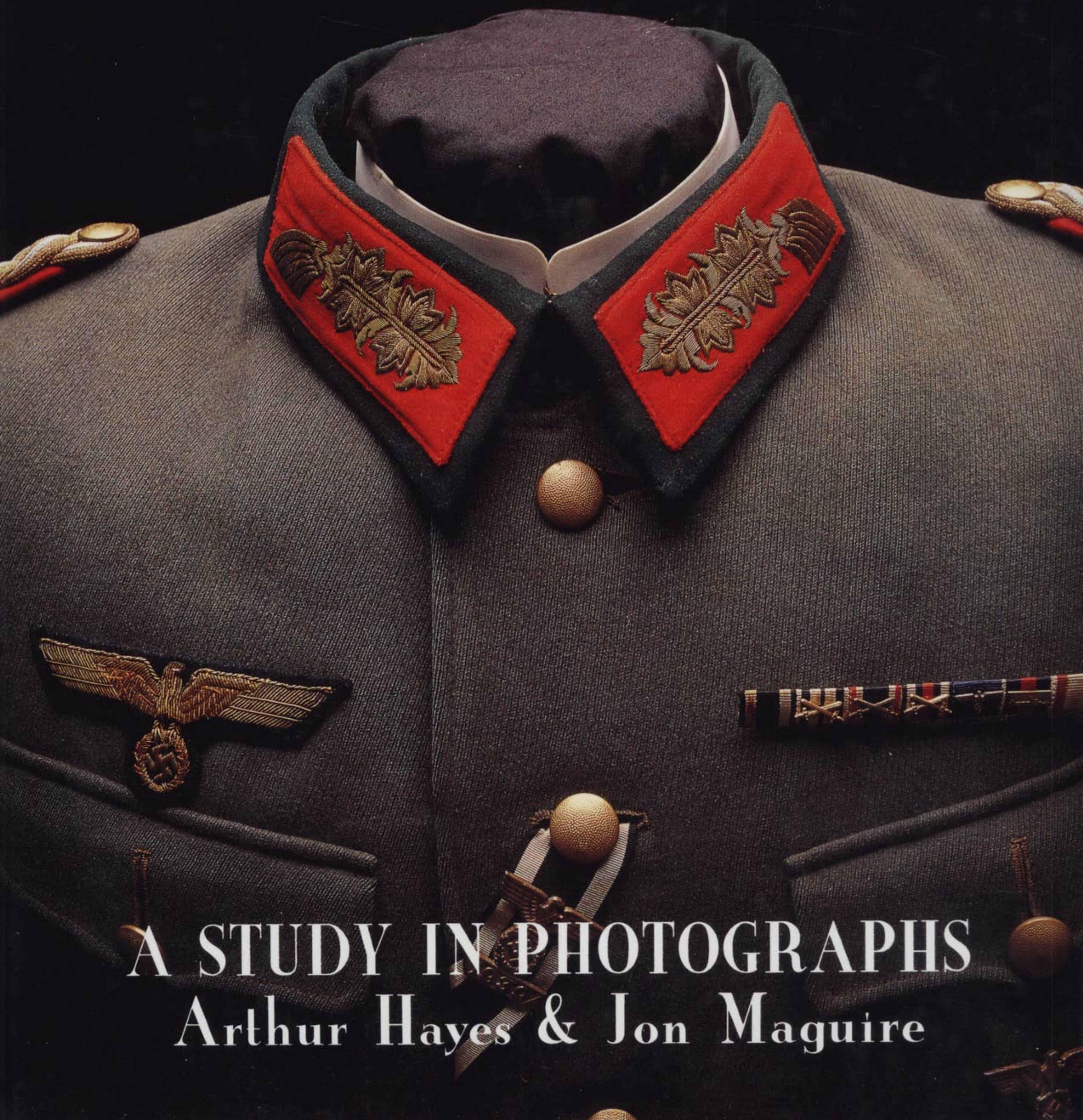

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Introduction

German uniforms of World War II are among the most beautiful of any country's throughout history. The quality and craftsmanship of tailoring and manufacturing was extremely high, especially in the early years of the Reich.

The world of collecting German militaria of World War II grows a little more cloudy each year due to unscrupulous individuals who continue to perpetrate fraud on the unsuspecting collector by manufacturing fake items of all descriptions. As a result, collectors and historians alike are clamoring for more detailed information and access to genuine items of the period for study and comparison. This book takes a close look at a variety of authentic German uniforms of World War II including examples from the Army, Luftwaffe, Kriegsmarine, Waffen-SS, Allgemeine-SS, Hitler Youth and Political Leaders. The pieces are photographed in painstaking detail to show the reader tailor's tags, buttons, insignia detail, etc., and allow the reader to see what the genuine article looks like. Various accoutrements worn with the uniforms are also included to aid the reader. The authors hope that these photographs will broaden knowledge and help avoid the expensive pitfalls we have all had to deal with over the years.

We have made our best effort to insure that all items pictured are 100% genuine and we believe them to be so, but we do not claim to be infallible. If any items not of the World War II era have slipped passed us, we sincerely apologize.

While recognizing the Germans of World War II as a magnificent fighting force, this work is not intended to glorify them or their twisted political views. It is simply a photographic record of some of the clothing they wore. We must never forget!

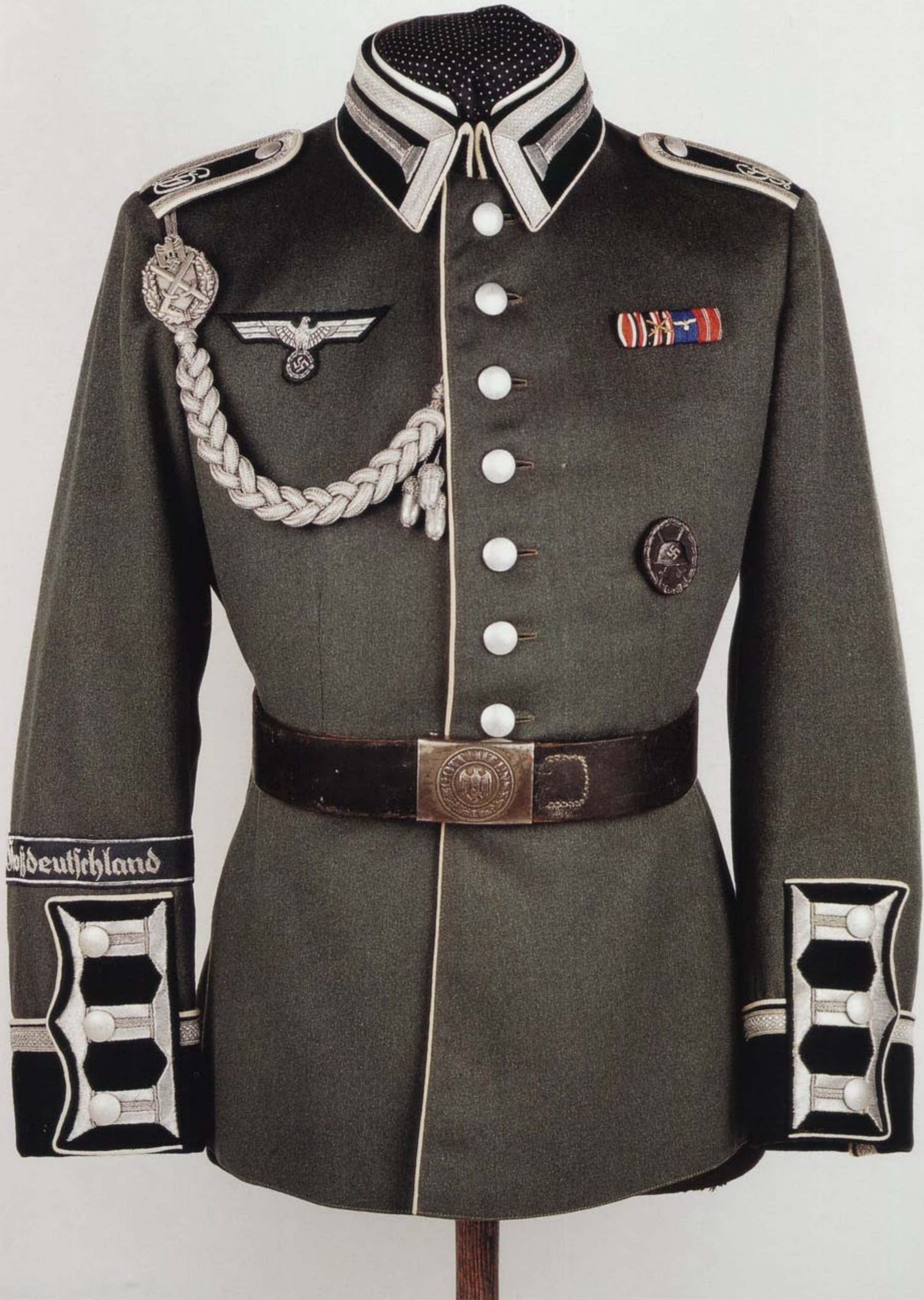

The Parade Dress Uniform of an NCO of the Infantry “Regiment Grossdeutschland”

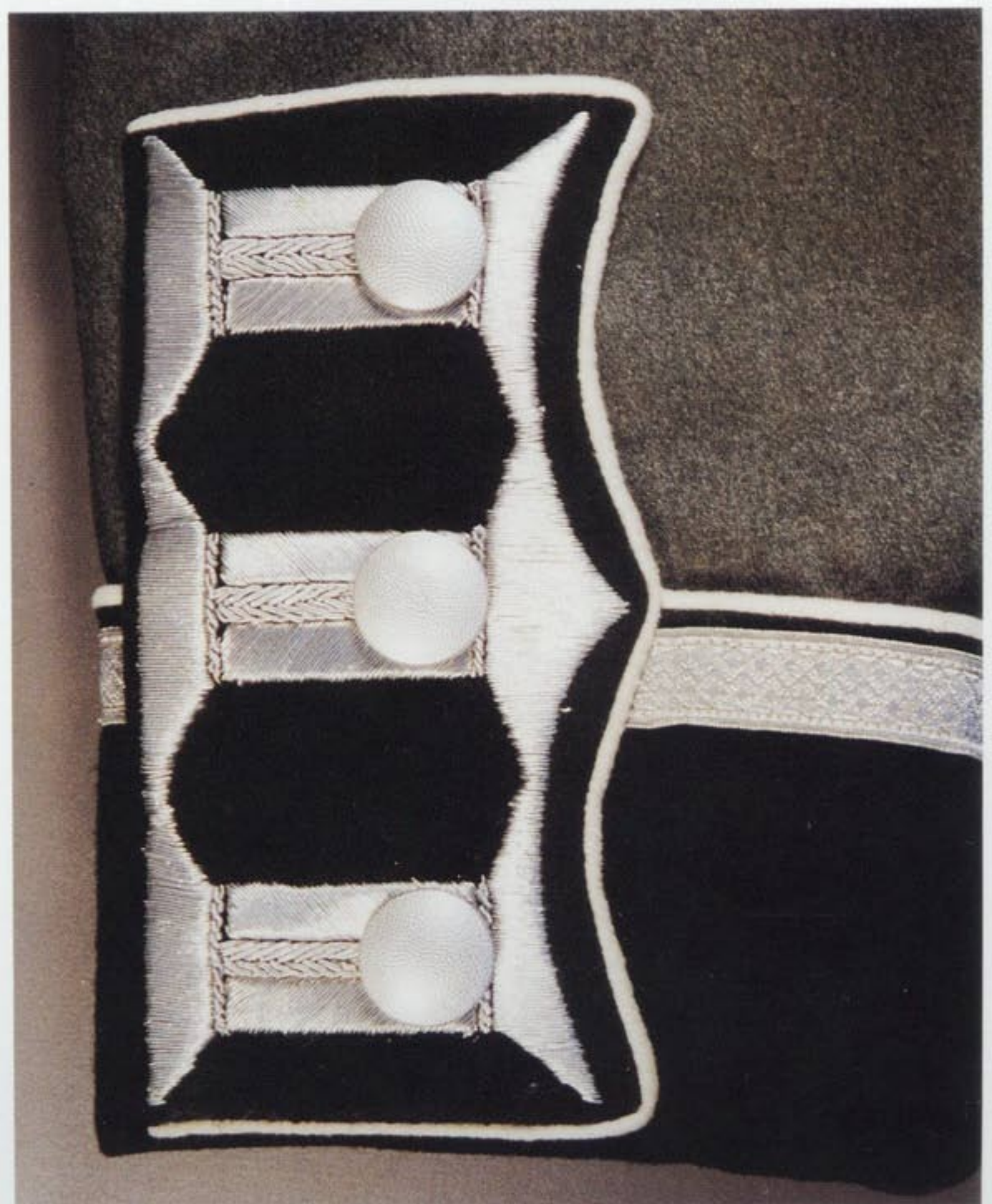
This uniform was introduced in March of 1939 to be worn from September 15, 1939. The tunic has two notable and distinct features. The collar patches and the cuff patterns are of a design completely different from all other German Army uniforms, to identify this elite unit with the traditions of the old Imperial Army. The uniform is shown here by itself and with the standard bearer 's carrying sash.

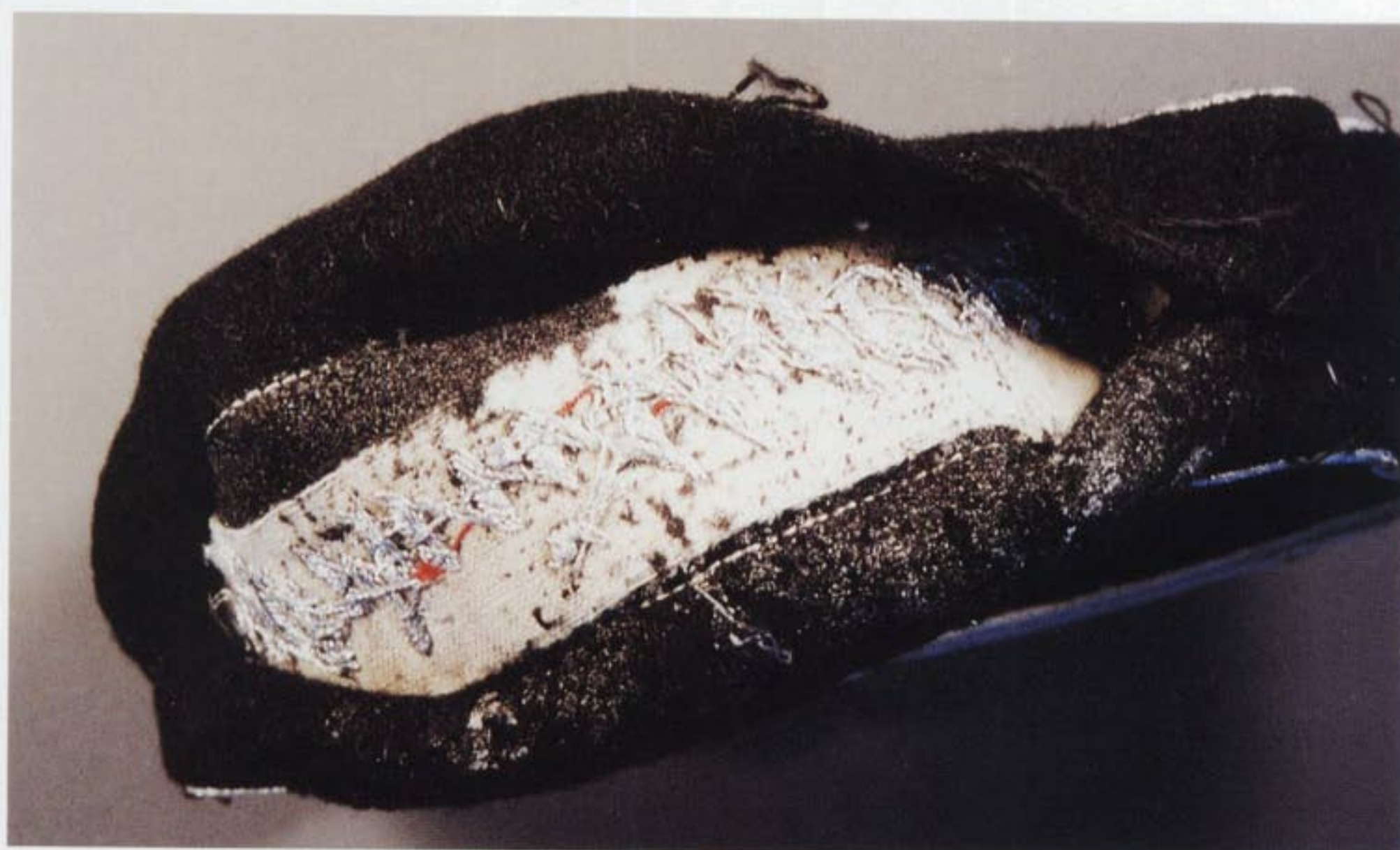

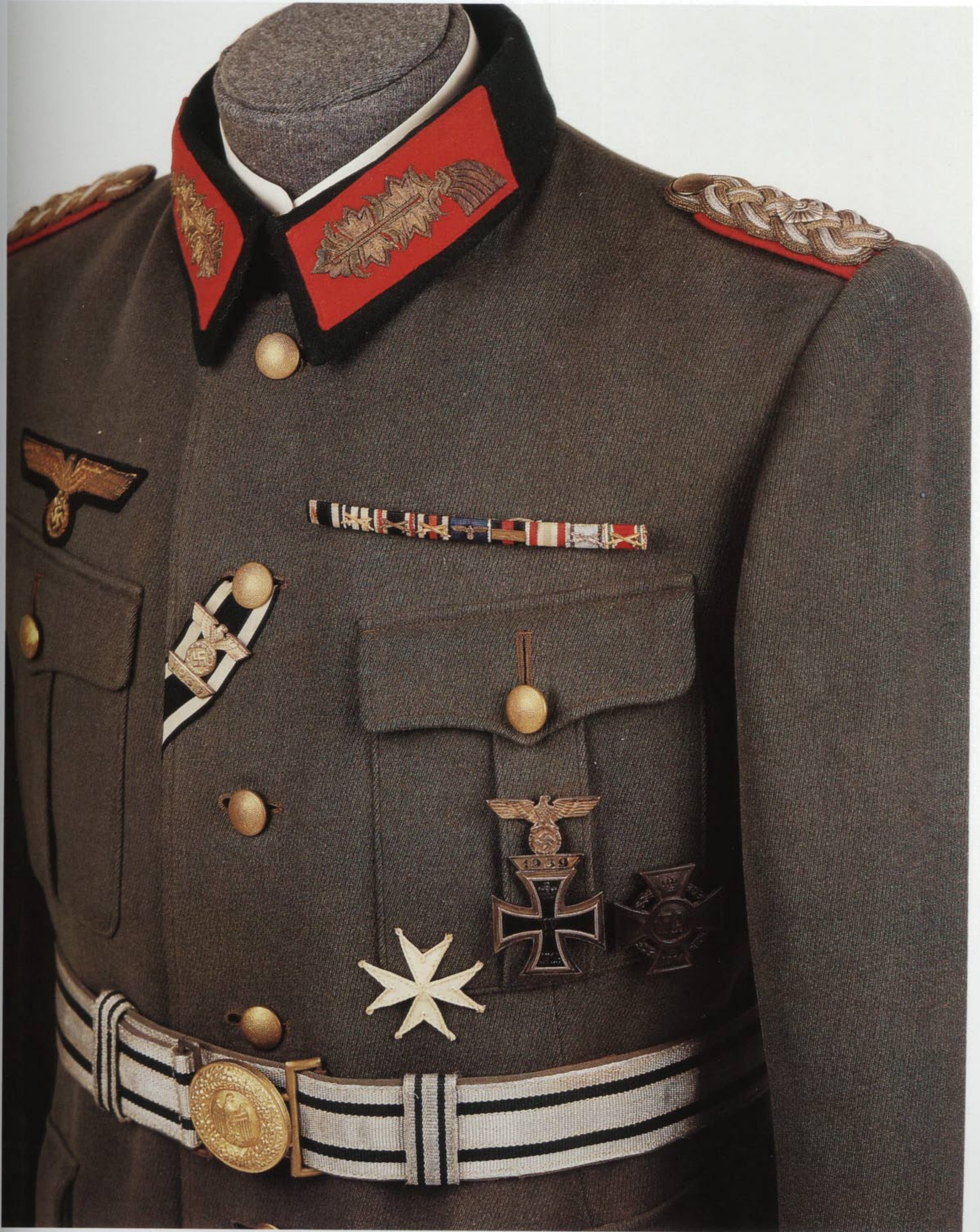

Uniform of Generalleutnant Hans von Kempski

This style of uniform was introduced in June of 1935. This example, dated 10-1-40, is named to Generalleutnant Hans von Kempski, who was the commander of the 199th Infantry Division. He was born 6-2-1883. The unusual white cloth Maltese Cross on the pocket is the Order of St. John of Jerusalem "Johanniter Order."











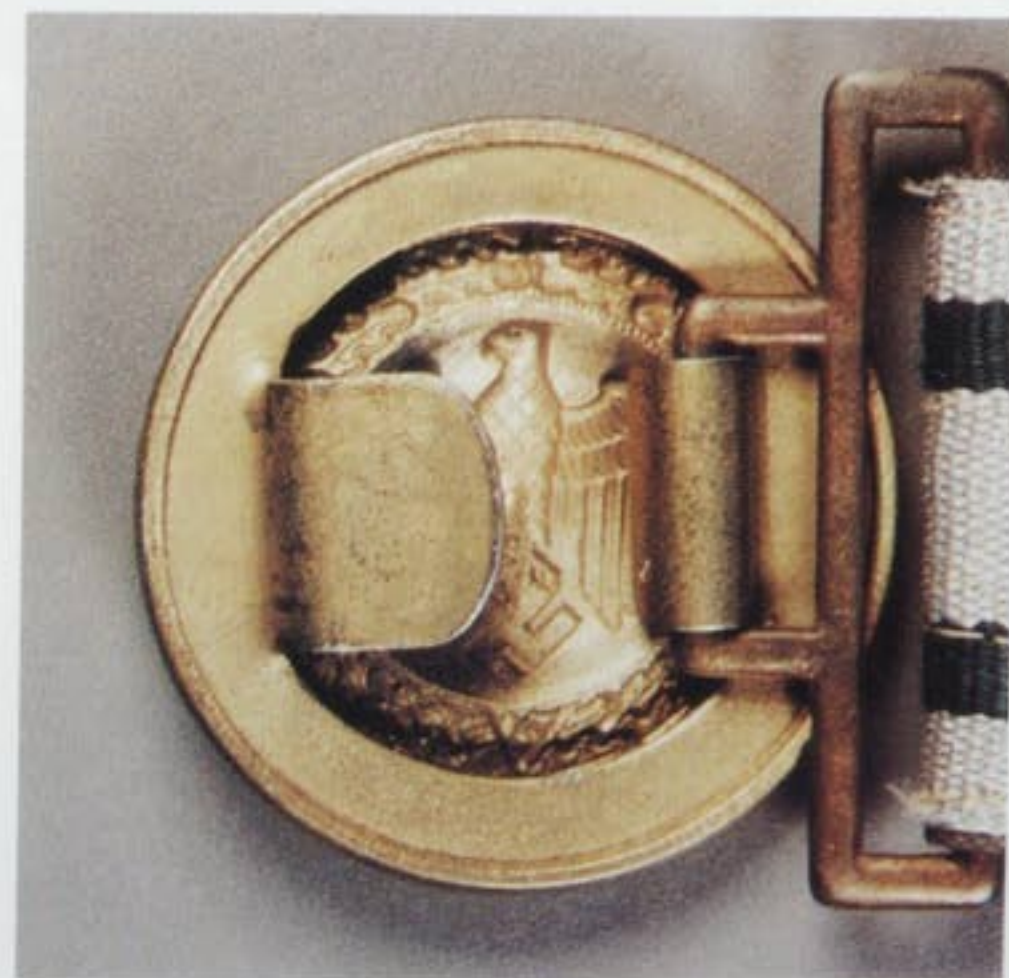

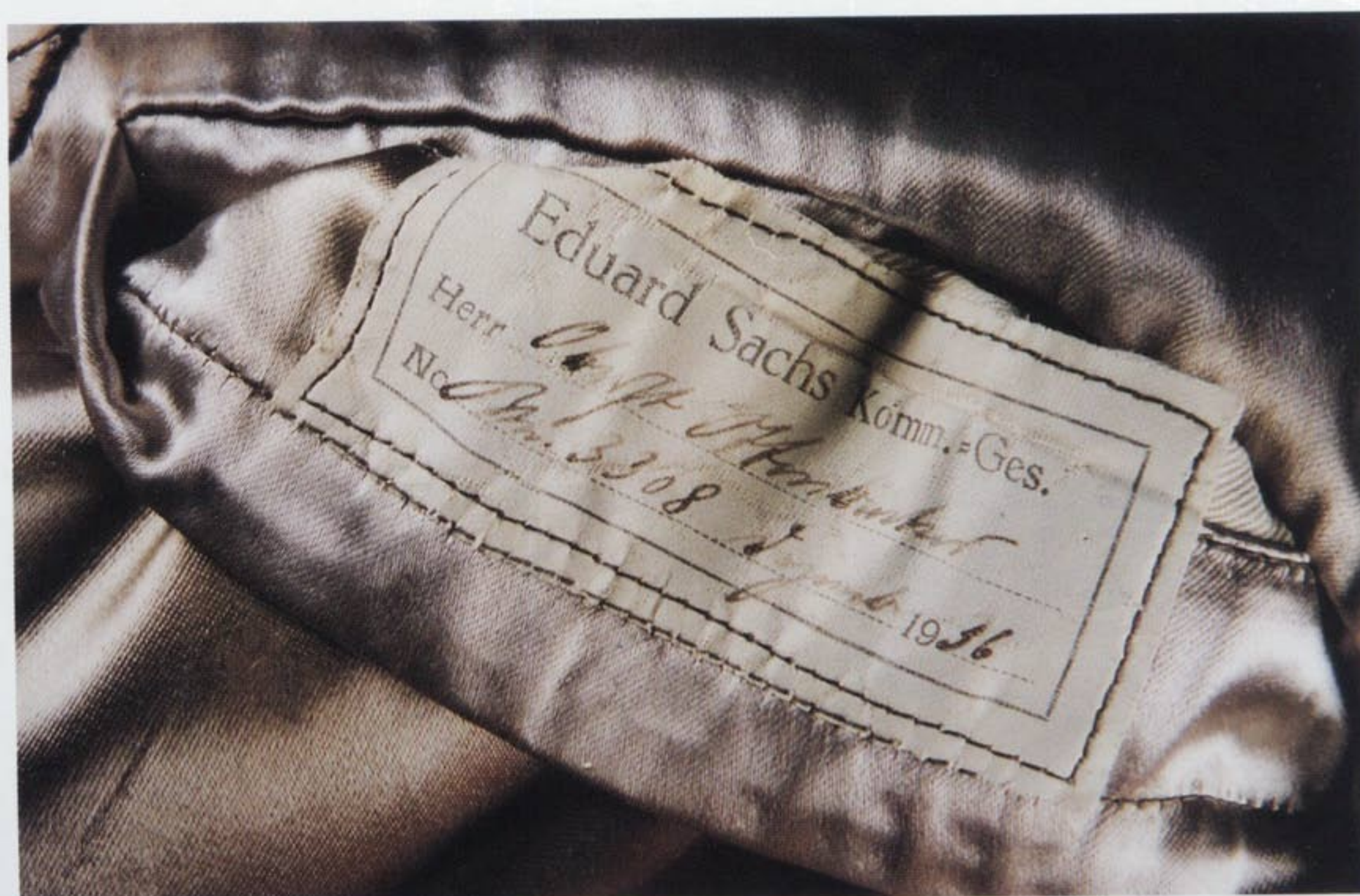
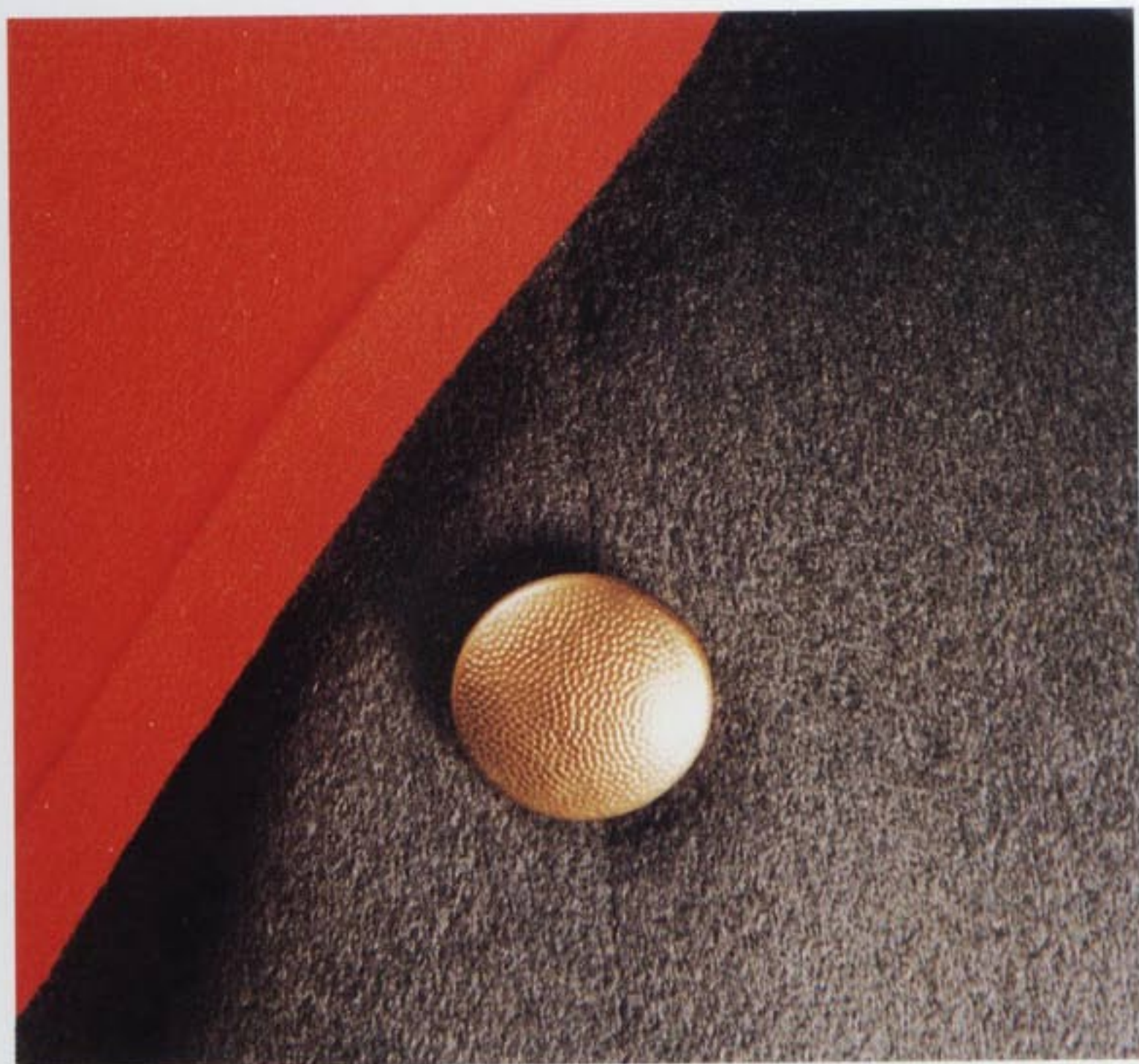


Two at right: Detail of the General Officer's Parade Dress belt and buckle.

The Uniform of Generalmajor Erwin Rommel

This waffenrock tunic was made by Franz Heidler in Potsdam and is dated January 1937. At the time of its manufacture, Rommel was an Oberst and an instructor at the Kriegsschule in Potsdam. The trousers pictured were manufactured in Italy, and it is interesting to note that they are named to Sig. Rommel as opposed to Herr Rommel. The trousers are dated 7.10.41. (Shea)



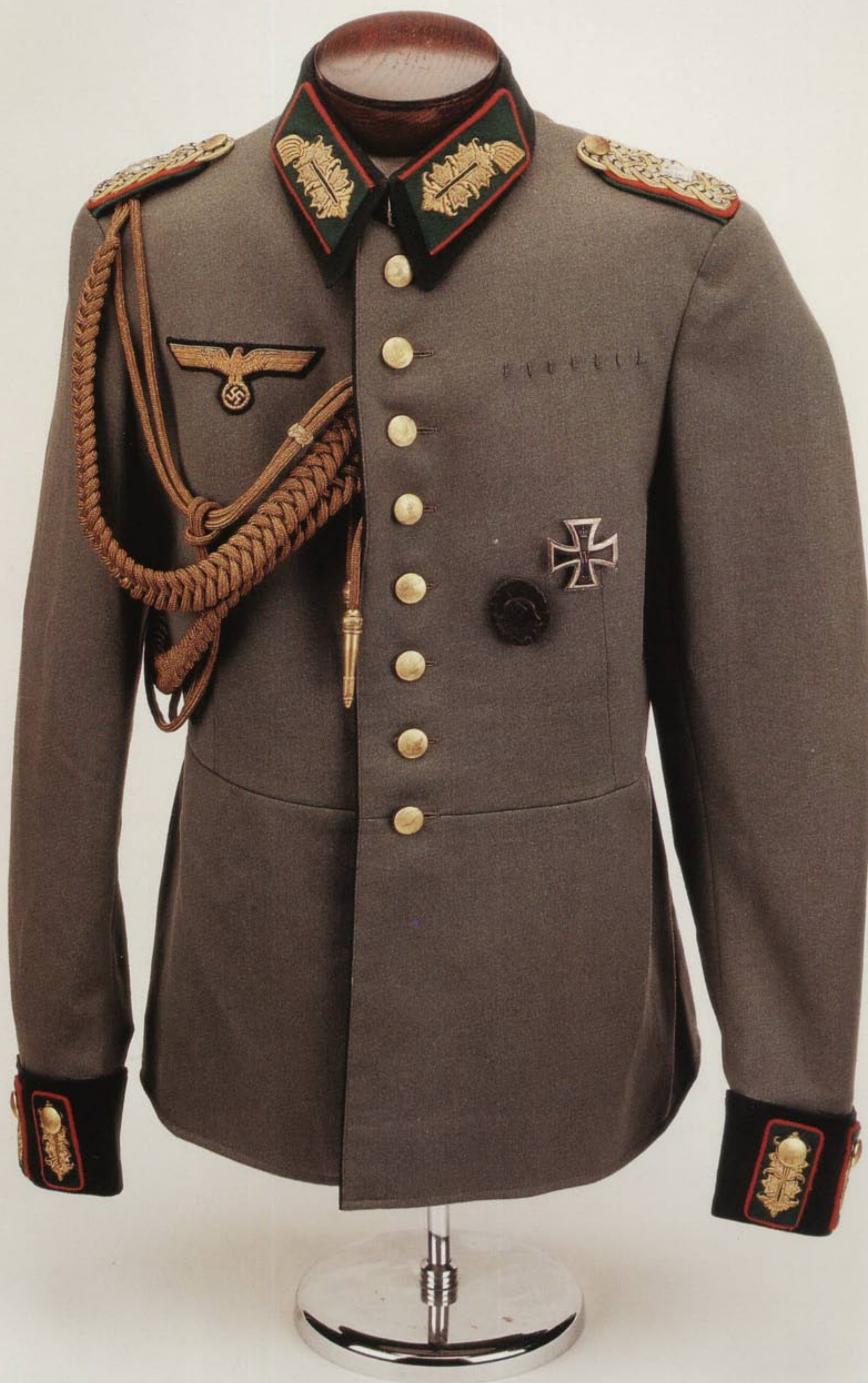






The Uniform of Generalmajor Walter Reich

This parade dress waffenrock tunic is for a Wehrmachtbeamte im Generalrang for an official serving on the staff of the OKW or OKH. It has the white metal "HV." Walter Reich was attached to Army Group I - Berlin. Tunic is labeled Averbeck & Bröskamp in Berlin, and is dated February 1943. (*Shea and Dienna*)









Model 1936 Uniform of Generalveterinär Dr. Edward Richters

Tunic was manufactured by Rudolf Keller, Berlin and is dated 1941. Note veterinarian serpent insignia on shoulder boards. Note "Dr.KR" initials in hat (Klaus was Richters' proper first name). (Shea)











Model 1936 Uniform of Generalmajor (Generalrichter) Dr. A. Grün

Tunic was manufactured by L.H. Berger, Collani & Co., Berlin and is dated 9.10.44. Wine red waffenfarbe denotes judiciary corps. Grün was a high ranking judge whose job was to review the results of all military tribunals. (Shea)









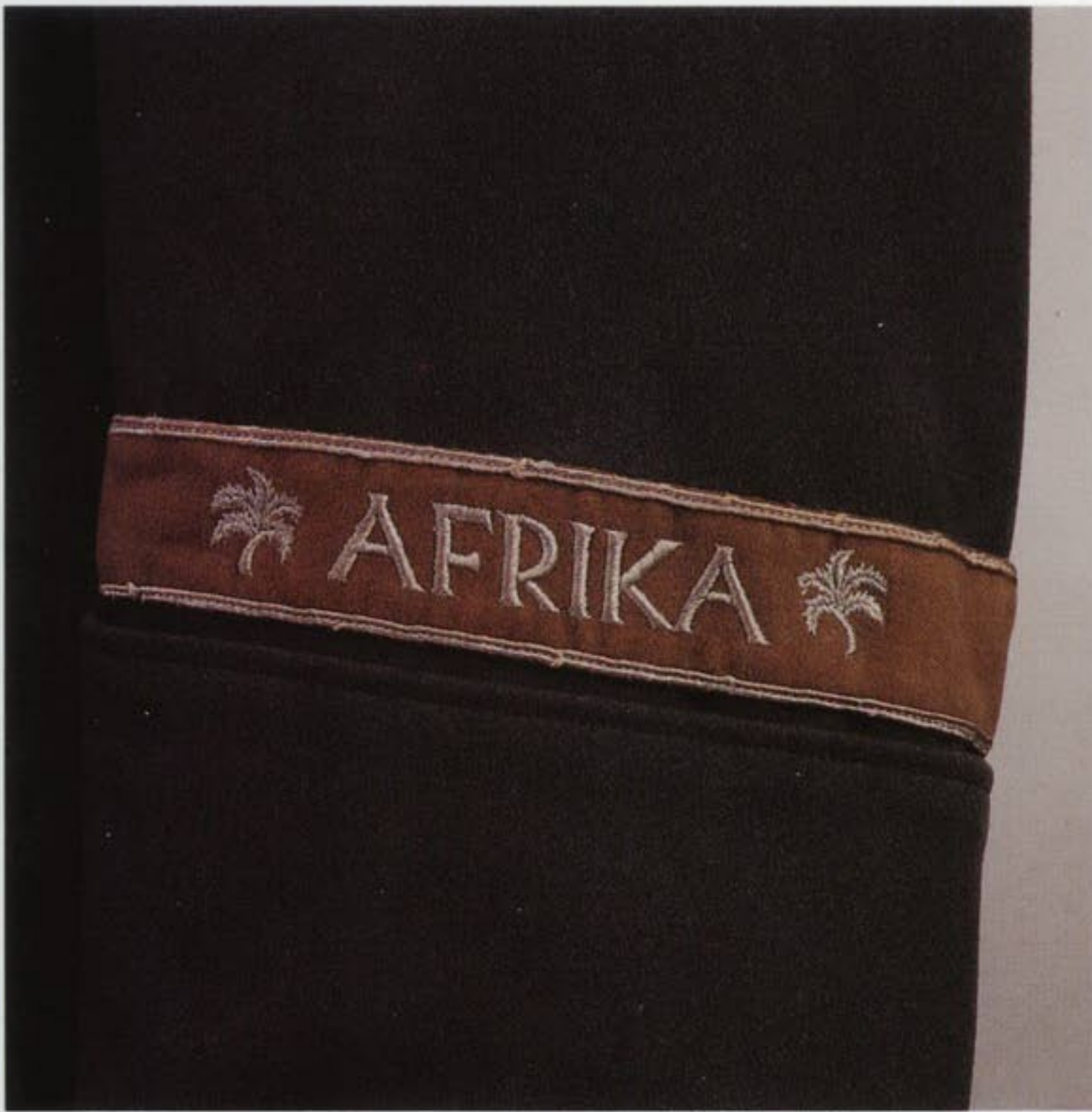


Standard Army General's Overcoat of General der Panzertruppe Walther Nehring

Nehring held the Knight's Cross with Oak Leaves and Swords, and served as the commander of the Afrikakorps in 1942. He later fought brilliantly in Russia for over two years. Overcoat has Nehring's North African campaign cuff title. Tailor's label is from Armeemarinehaus, Berlin = Charlottenburg 2, and is dated 15.1.37. (Shea)







The Walking Out Dress Uniform of an Army Infantry Leutnant

This is a tailor made example of the standard German Army officer's service uniform. The tunic is shown with the brown leather officer's belt and cross strap and with the brocade parade dress belt. The Army officer's dress dagger is also displayed as worn.













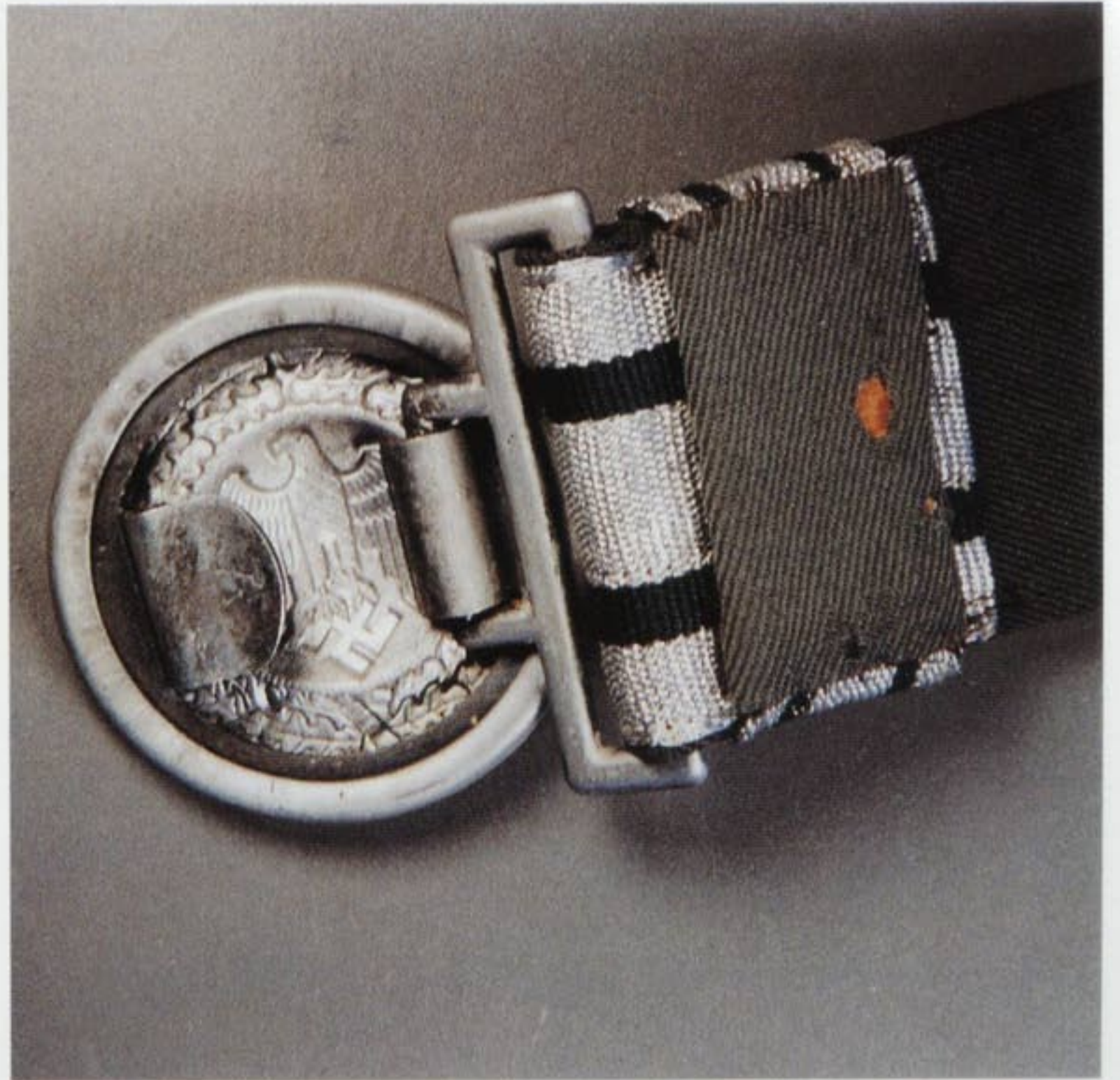

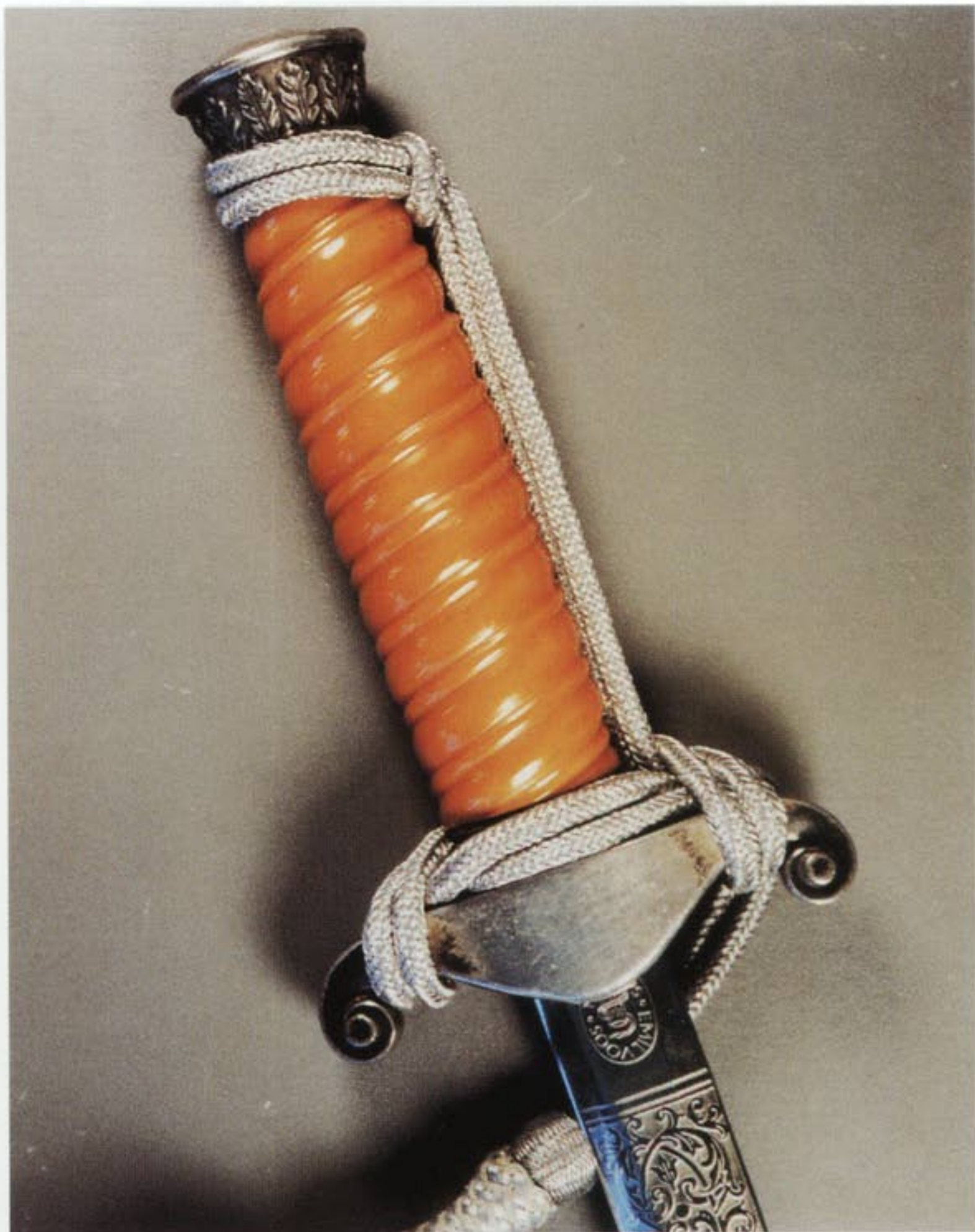

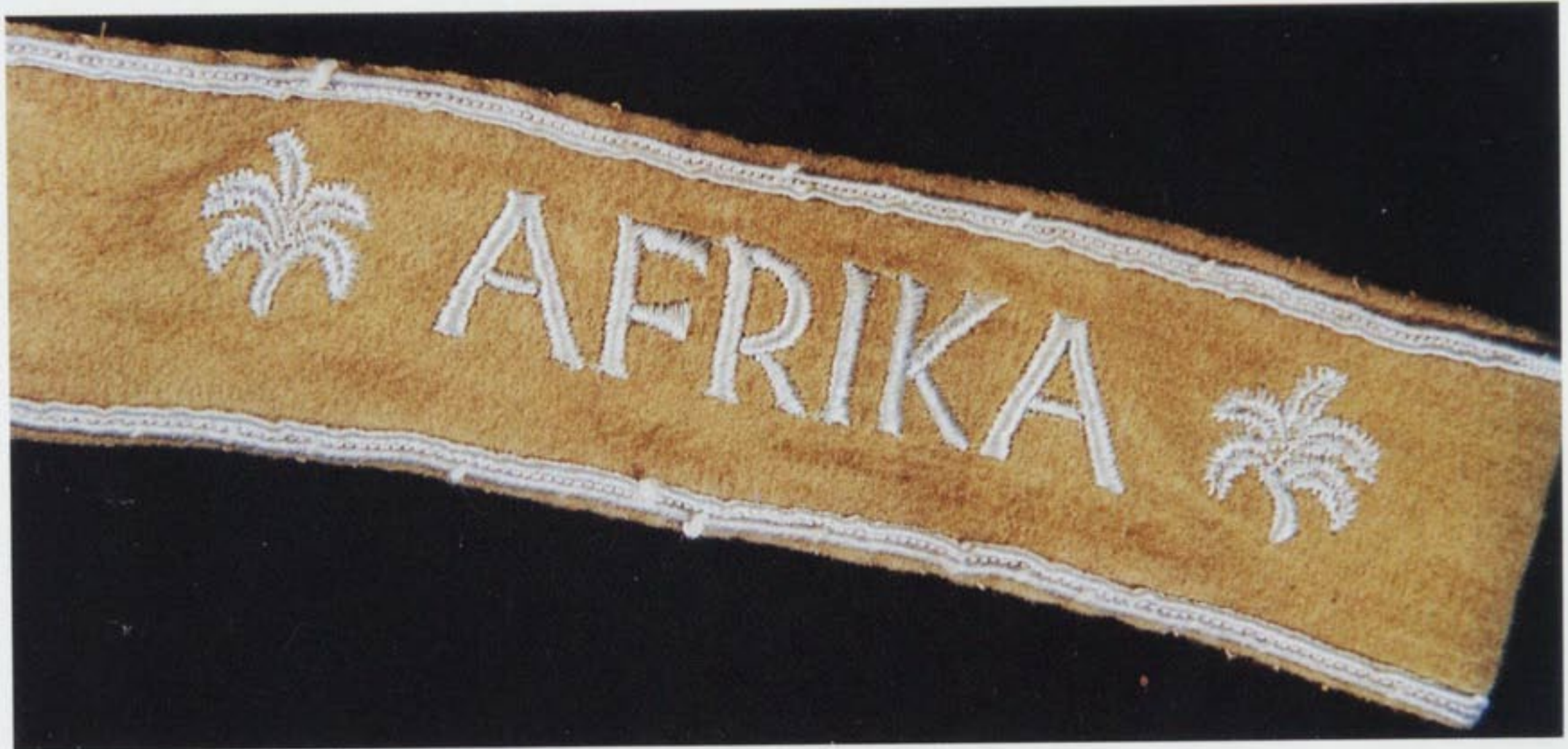
The Panzer Officer's Special Black Uniform of Rudolf Gerhardt

This style of uniform was worn by all ranks serving in armored fighting vehicles. This tailor made example was worn by the commander of the Panzer Lehr Regiment, Rudolf Gerhardt. Gerhardt took command of the regiment in November of 1943. The coat features unusual, non-standard collar tabs.

This example was worn by Gustav Muller. Note the addition of red fabric behind the eyes of the skull on the collar tabs.

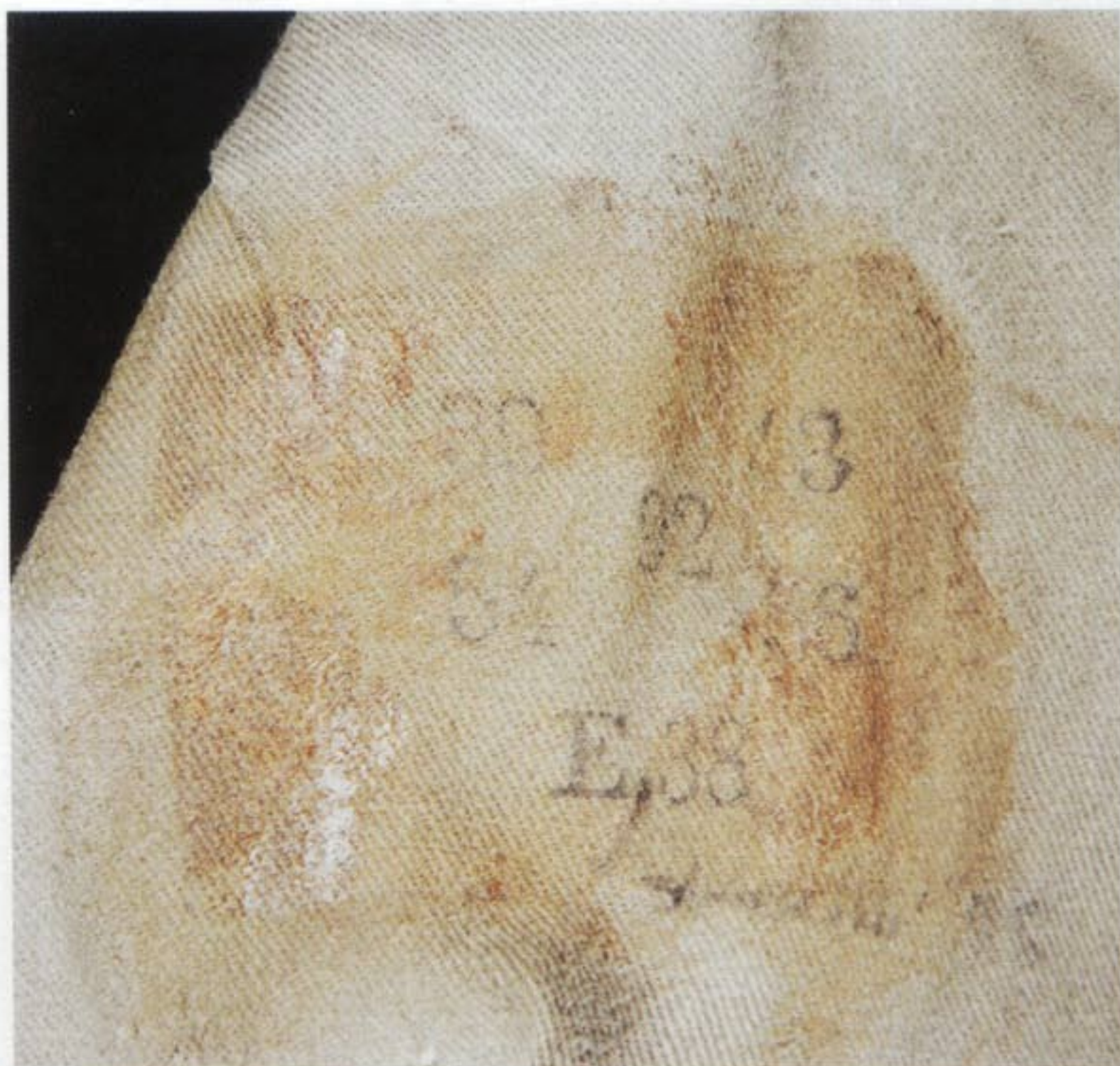

This example is an early war piece with scalloped pockets, dark green collar and French cuffs. Insignia on the shoulder boards indicates the 11th Panzer Division. The coat has a Krim (Crimea) Shield on the left sleeve and a Tank Destroyer strip on the right sleeve. (Matthew Reinert, MHS)







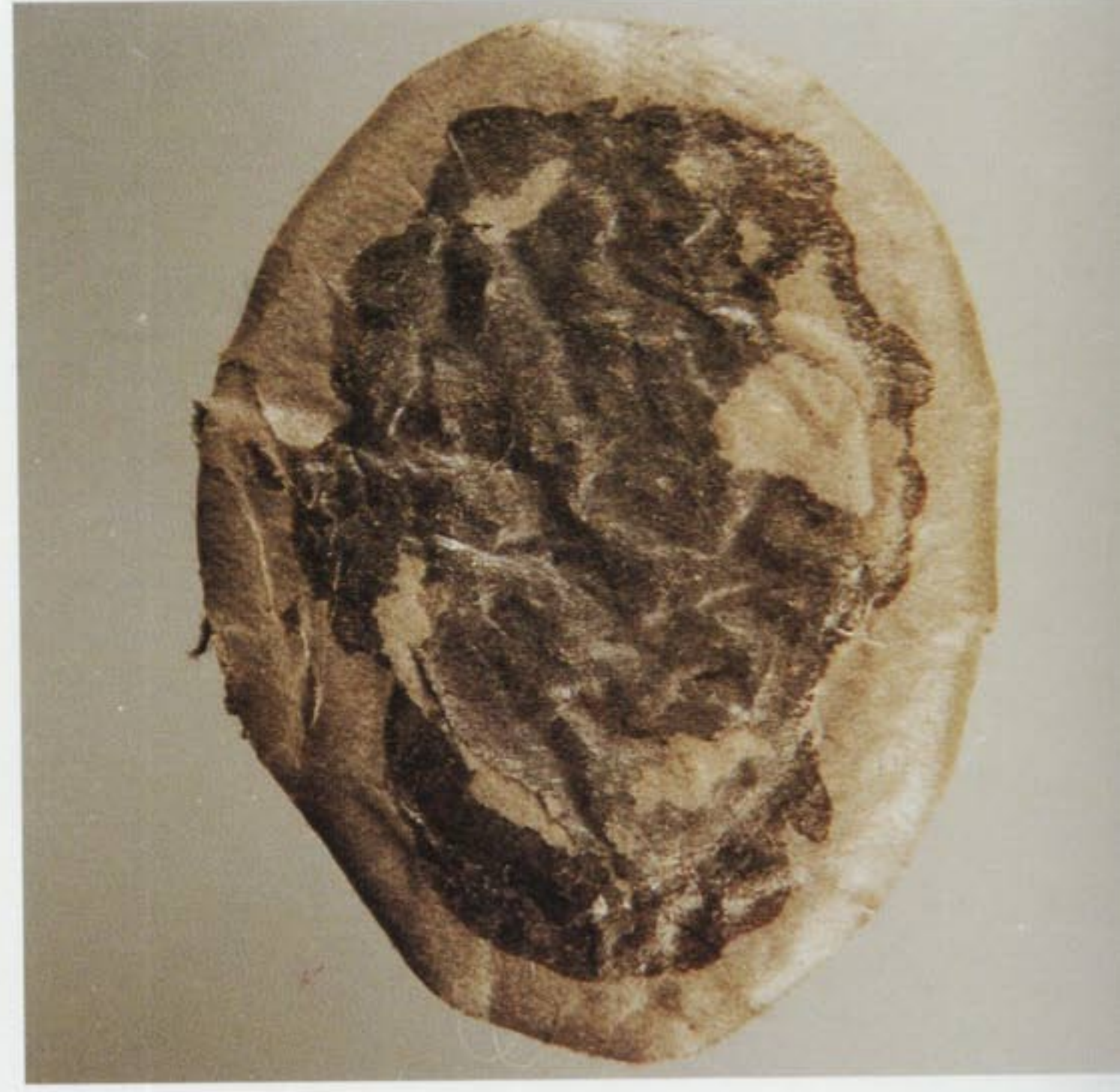
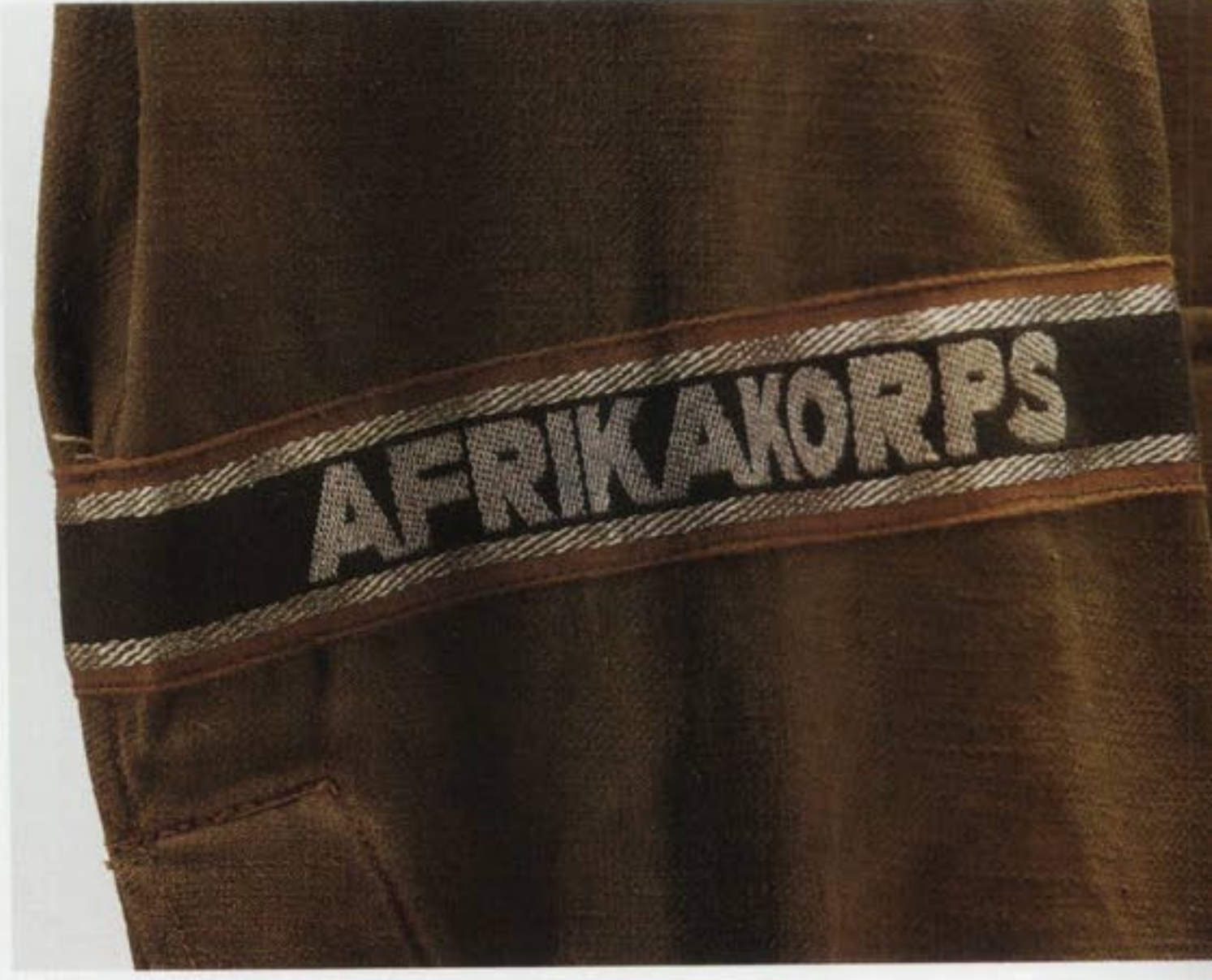
Enlisted Ranks Tropical Green Tunic “Afrikakorps”

This tropical tunic has the green waffenfarbe of a Mountain Jäger unit. Note the Edelweiss and Afrikakorps sleeve band on the right sleeve. The tunic is displayed with the standard Afrikakorps issue webbed belt and buckle. (Matthew Reinert, MHS)

The Service Tunic “Tuchrock” of a Luftwaffe Generalleutnant

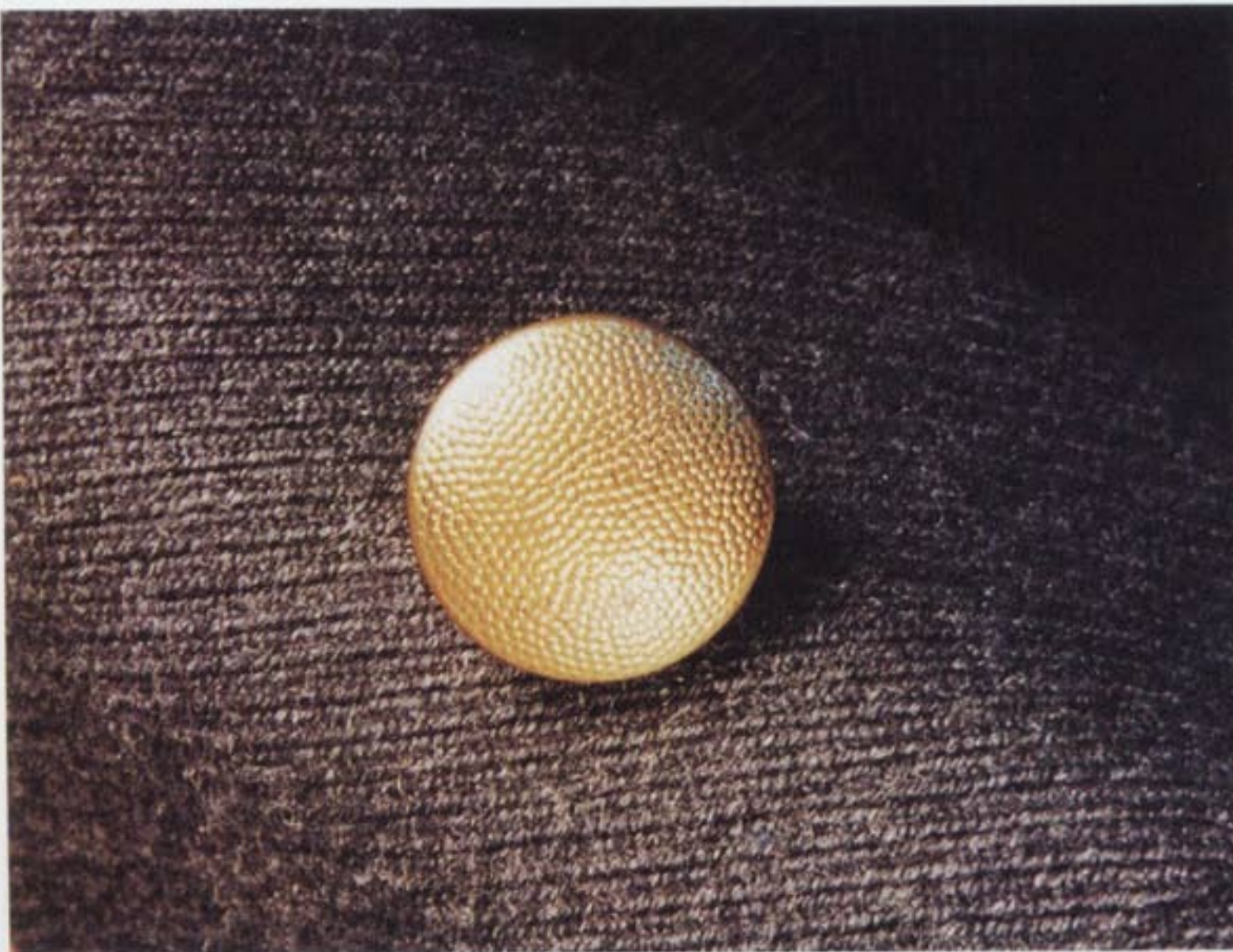
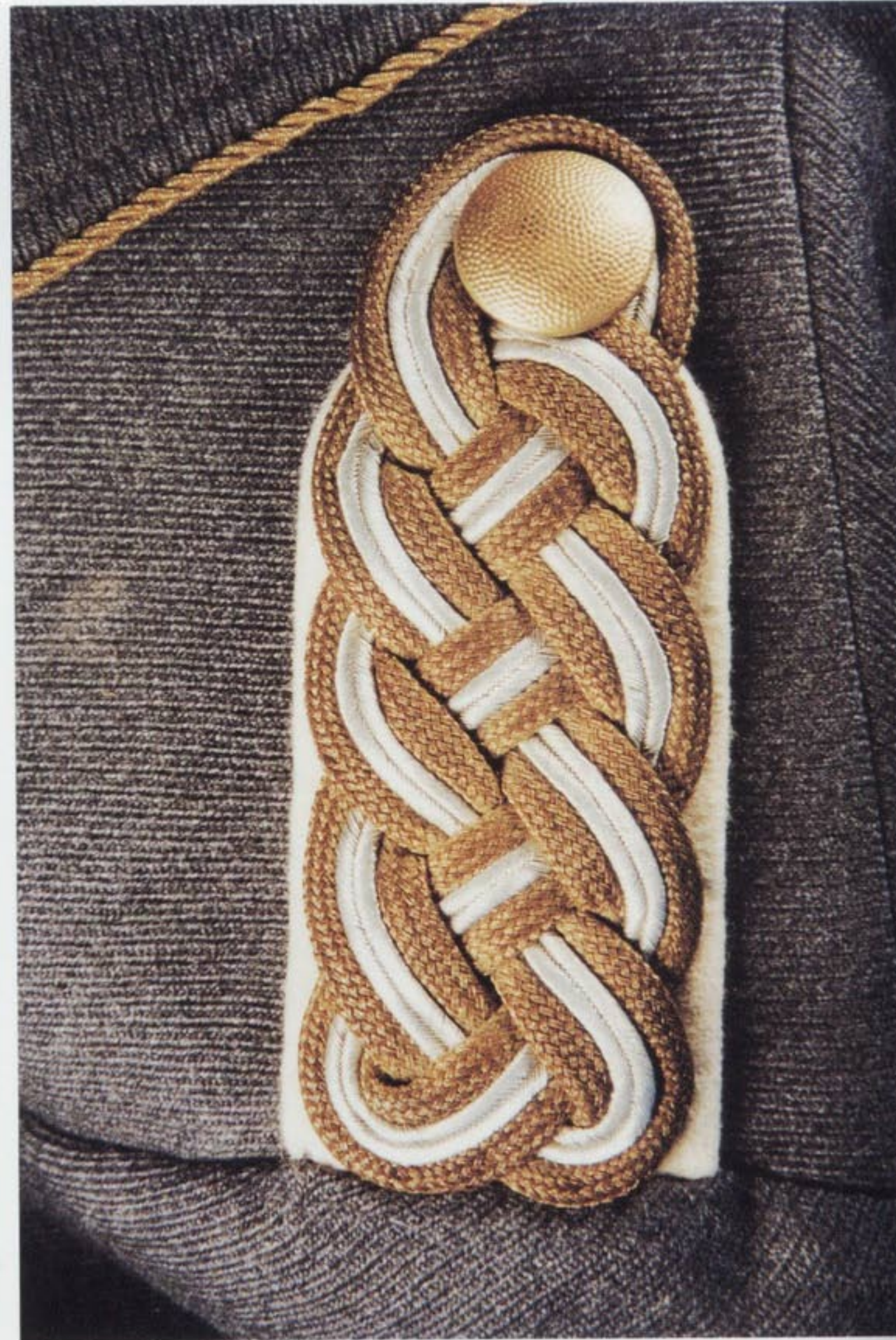
This style of open collar tunic was introduced in March of 1937. It is displayed with the General Officer's brown leather belt and gold buckle. The belt is backed with black wool.





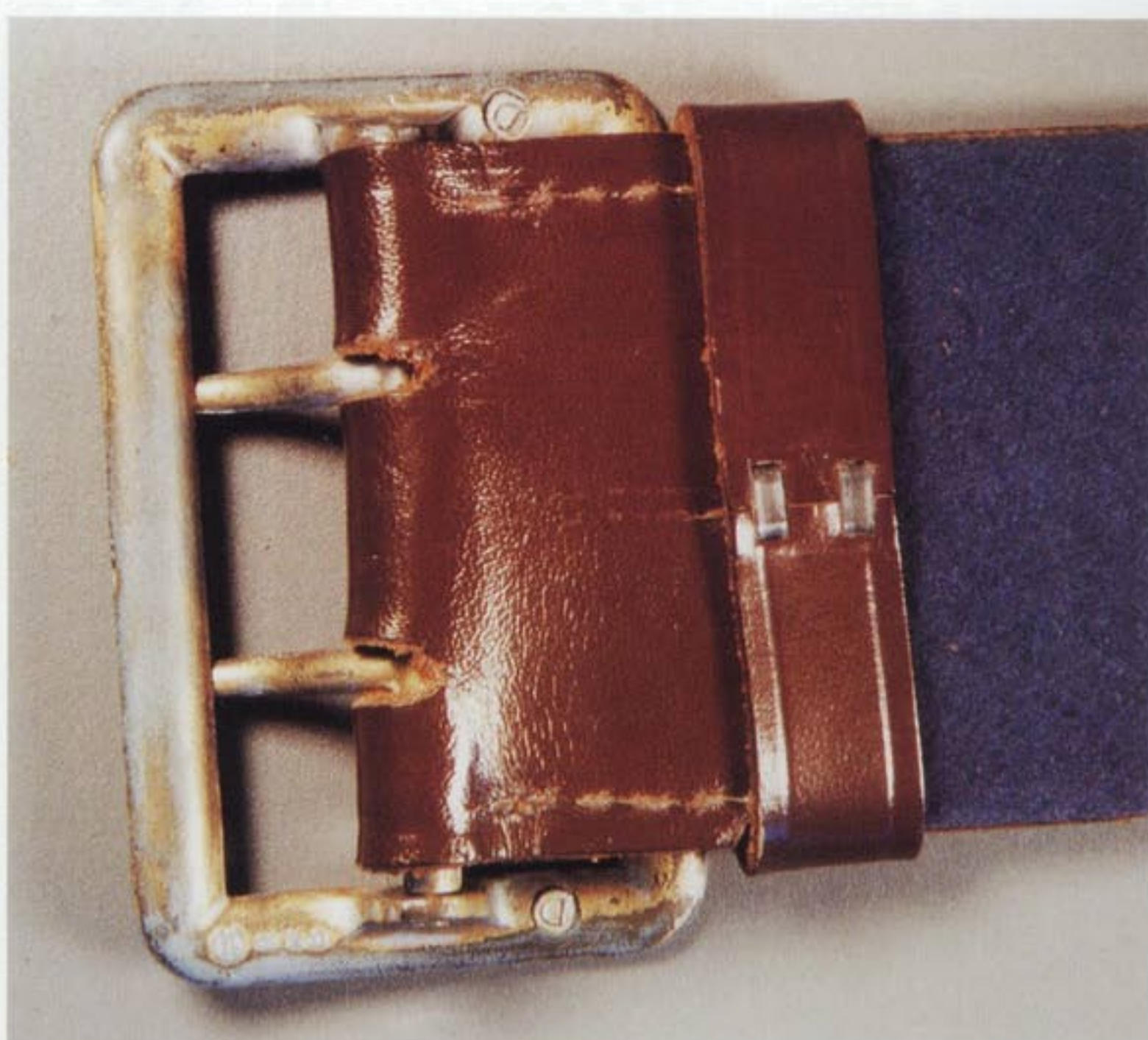
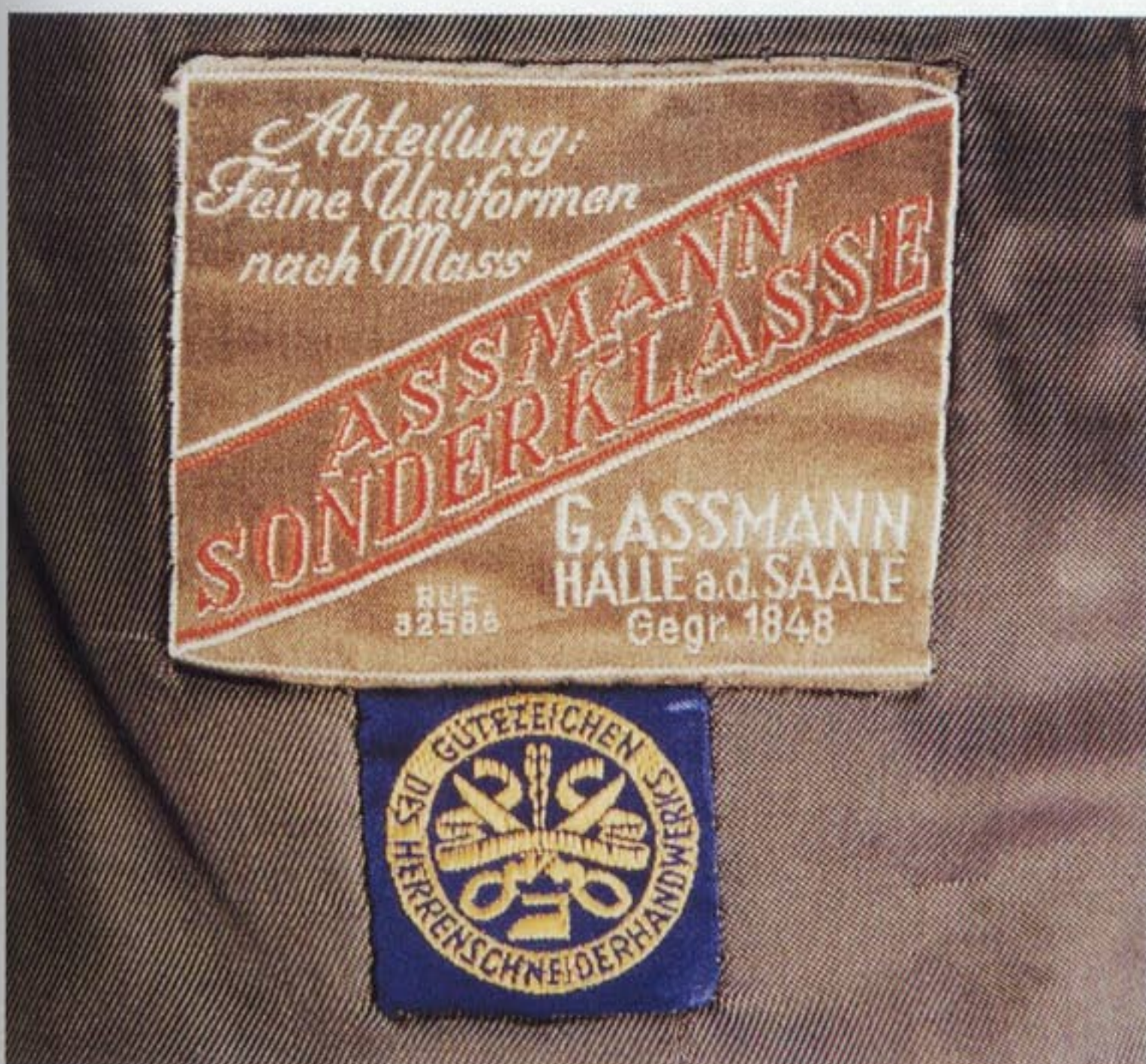

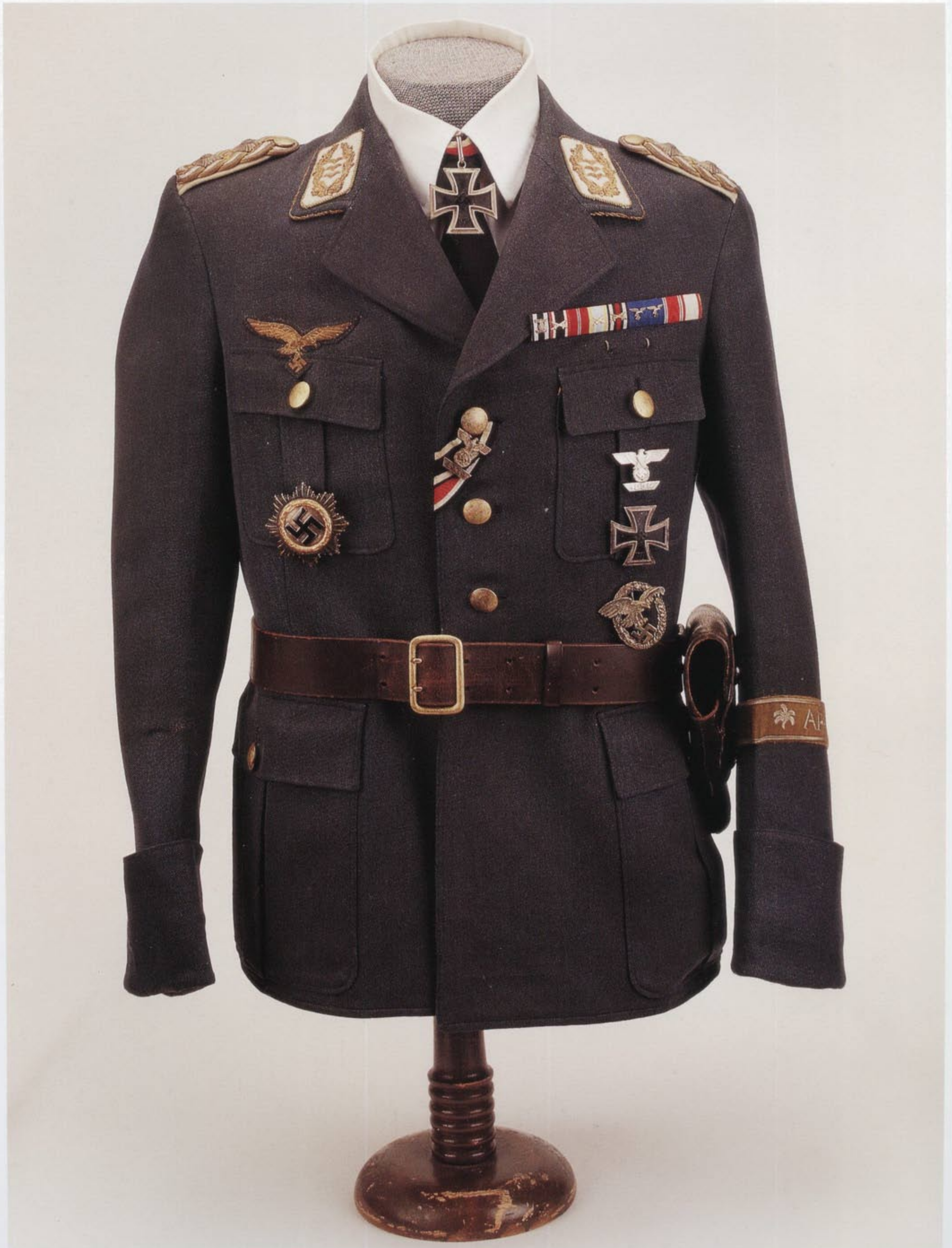

Uniform of General der Flieger Stefan Fröhlich

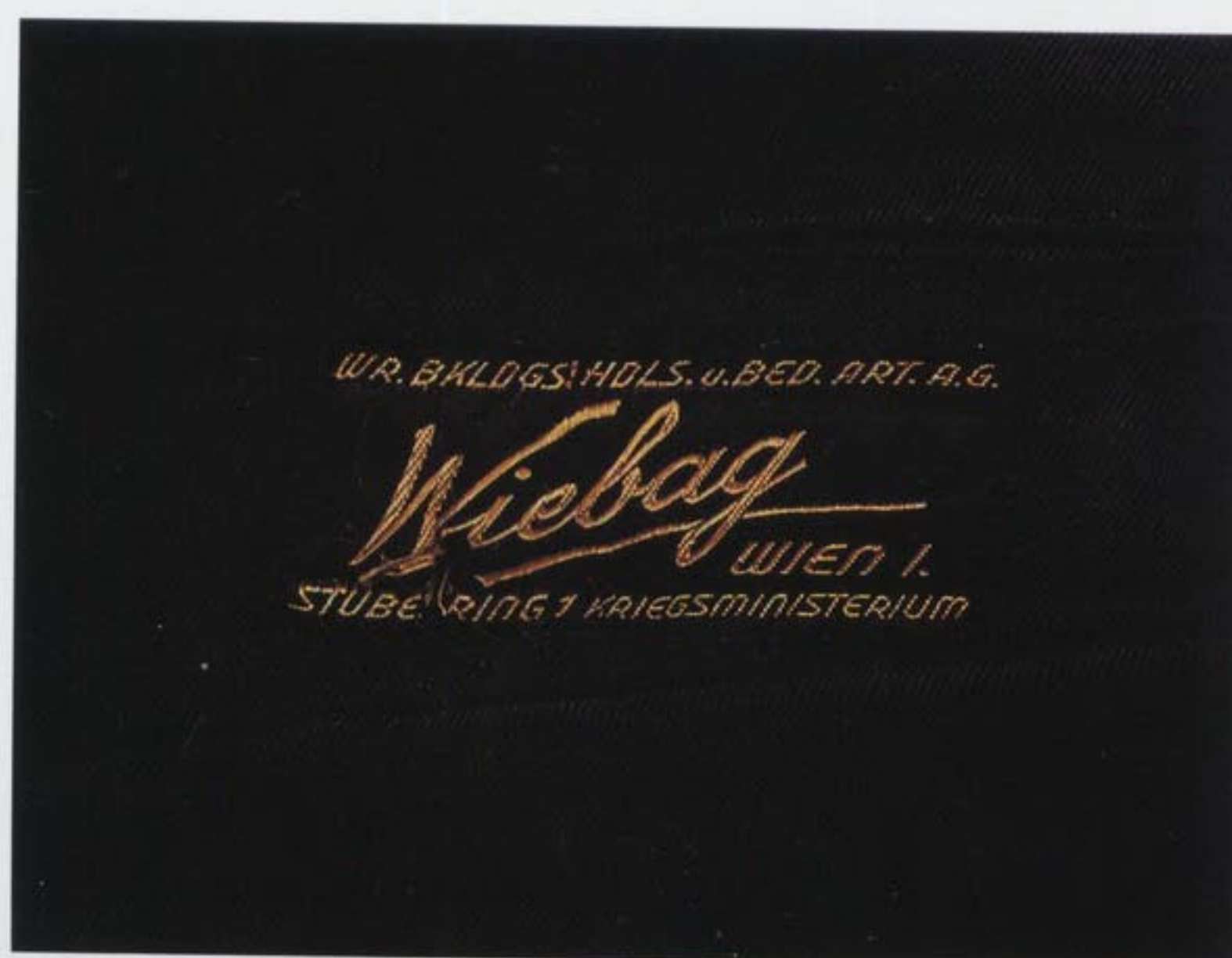
This uniform was manufactured in March 1938, by the firm of Wiebag in Wien, when Fröhlich was an Oberst. It was later upgraded as he was promoted. Fröhlich won the Knight's Cross on 4.7.40 as Generalmajor and Kommandeur of KG 76. He later served in Africa on Rommel's staff. (*Shea*)













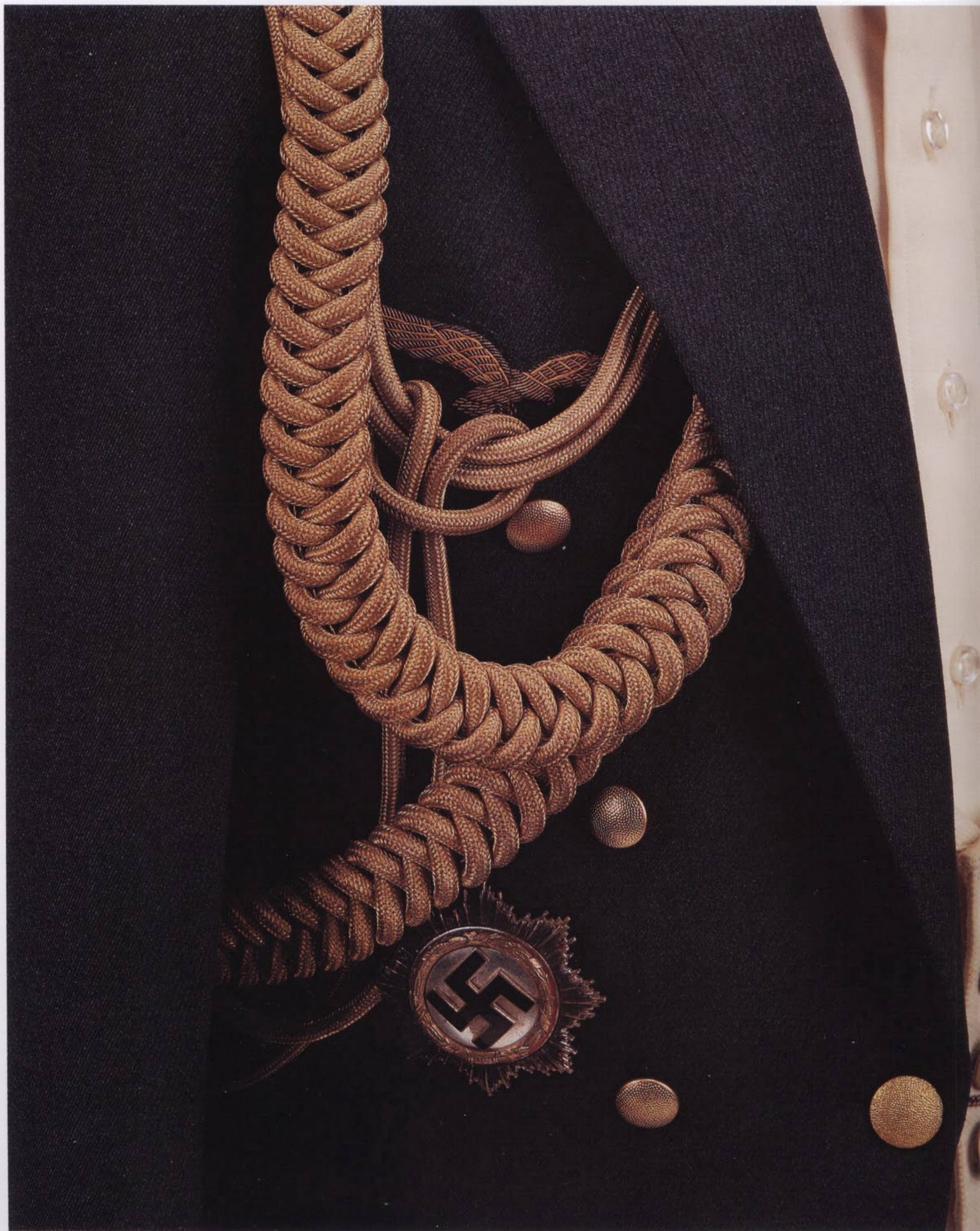

Uniform rank insignia denotes Generalmajor. Uniform was manufactured by Averbeck & Bröskamp in Berlin. (Shea)









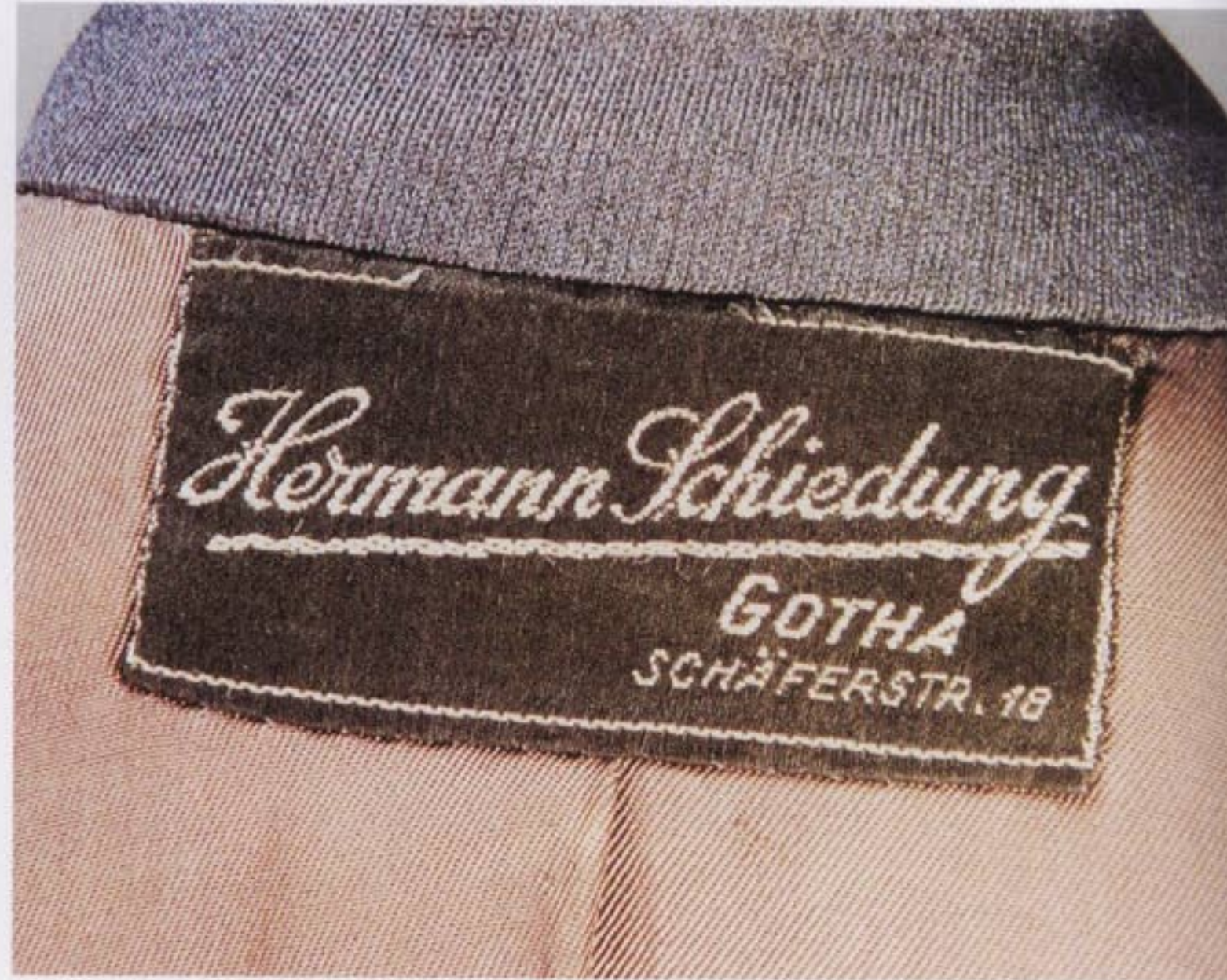
The Service Tunic "Tuchrock" of a Luftwaffe Oberleutnant of Flight

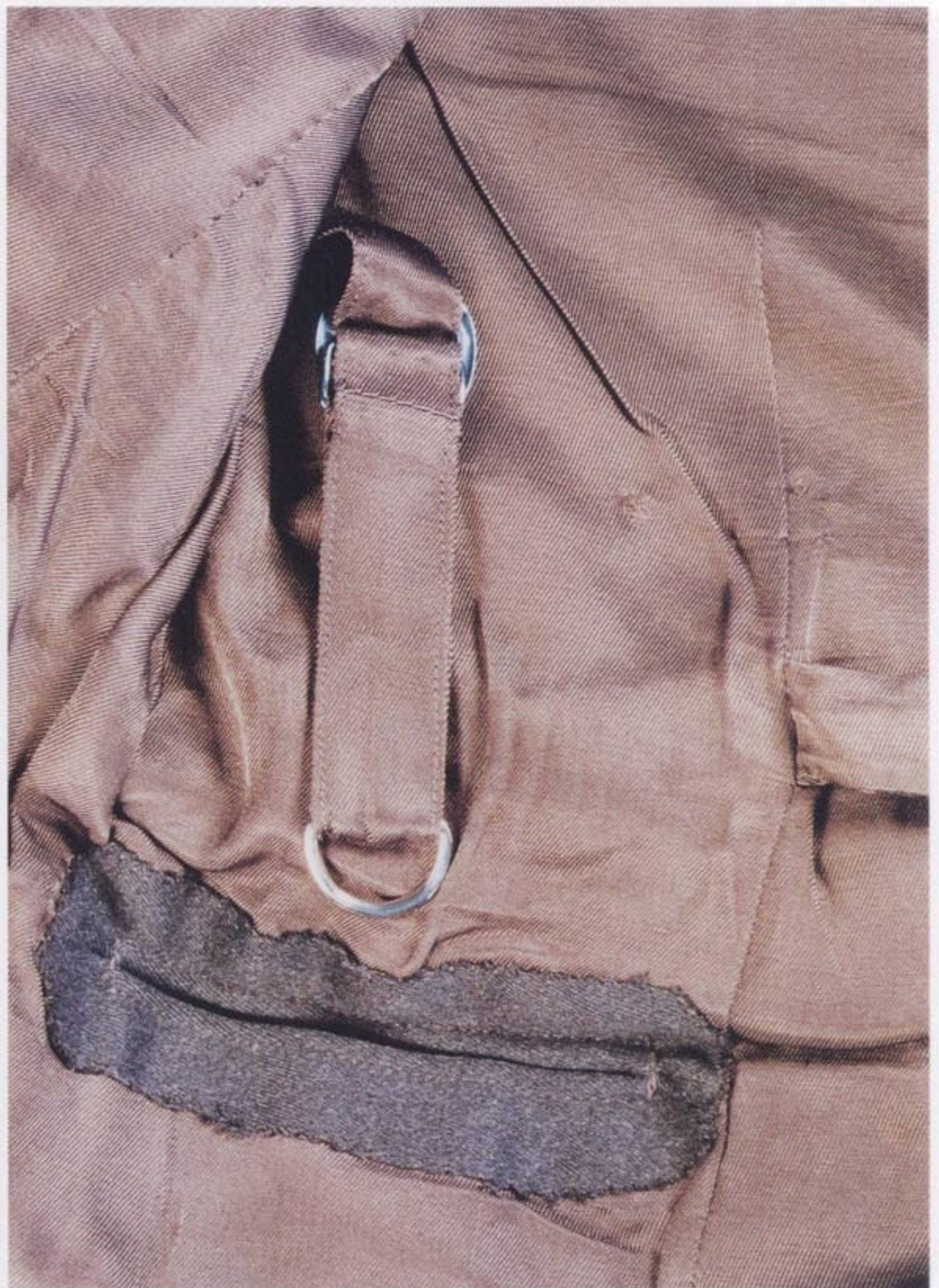
This officer's uniform is piped in yellow, indicating he is a flying officer. It is displayed with a very interesting adjutant's aiguillette with metal rings which are engraved with the names of the previous holders of the position. The tunic has a Pilot's Badge, Reconnaissance War Flight Bar, and Silver Wound Badge. Also shown is an early style black officer's belt with "droop tail" eagle and a first pattern flyer's dagger.



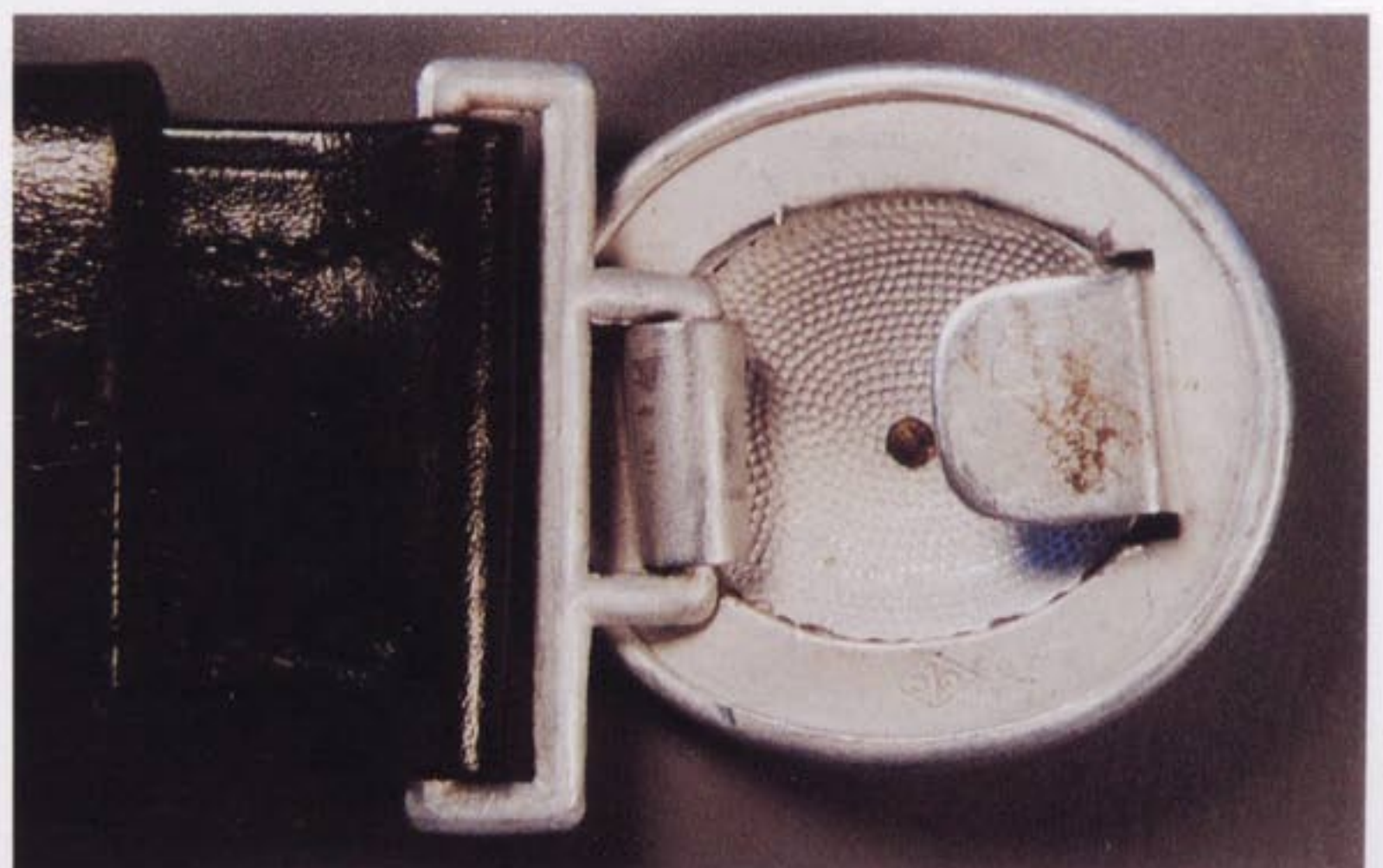






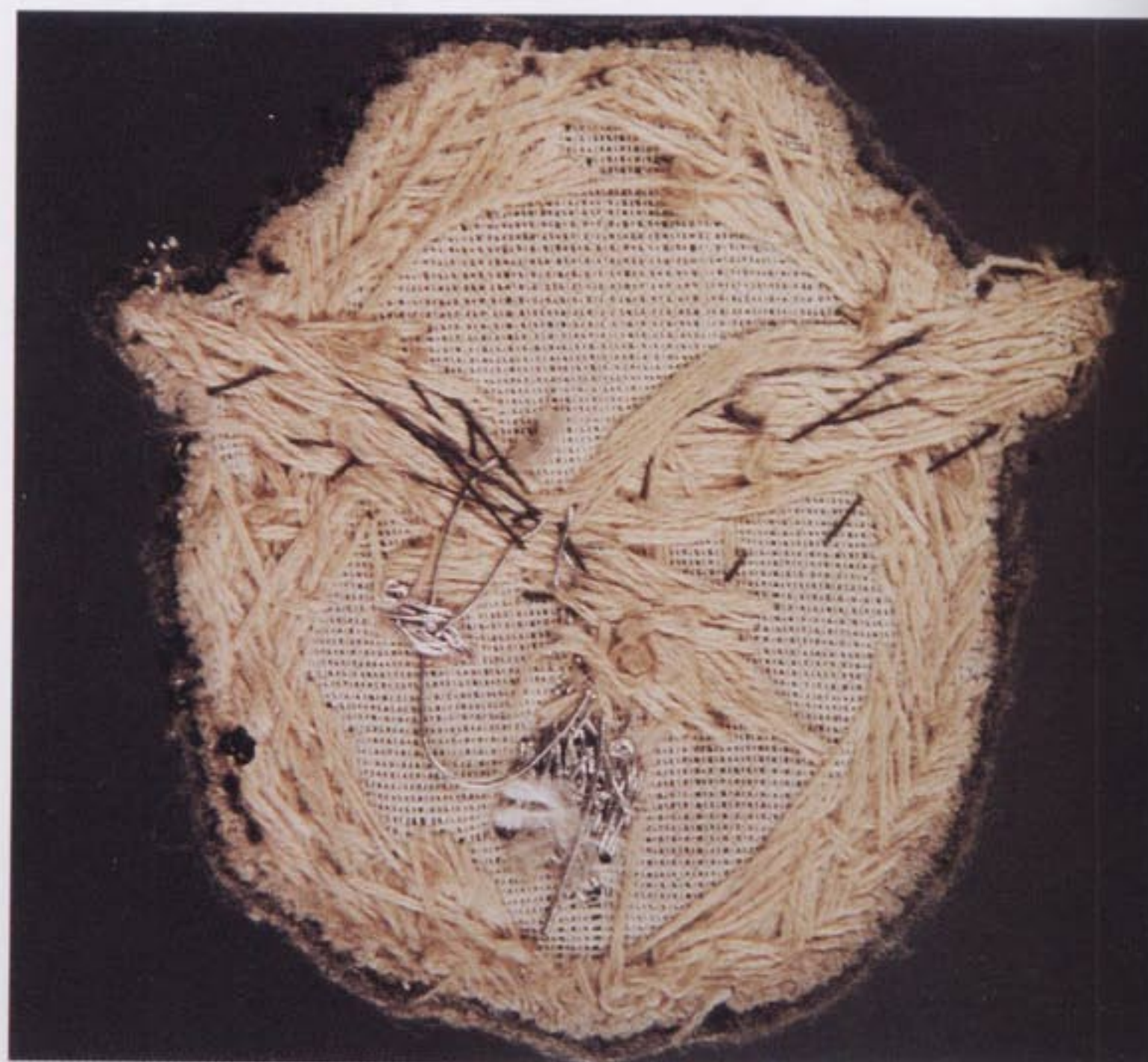

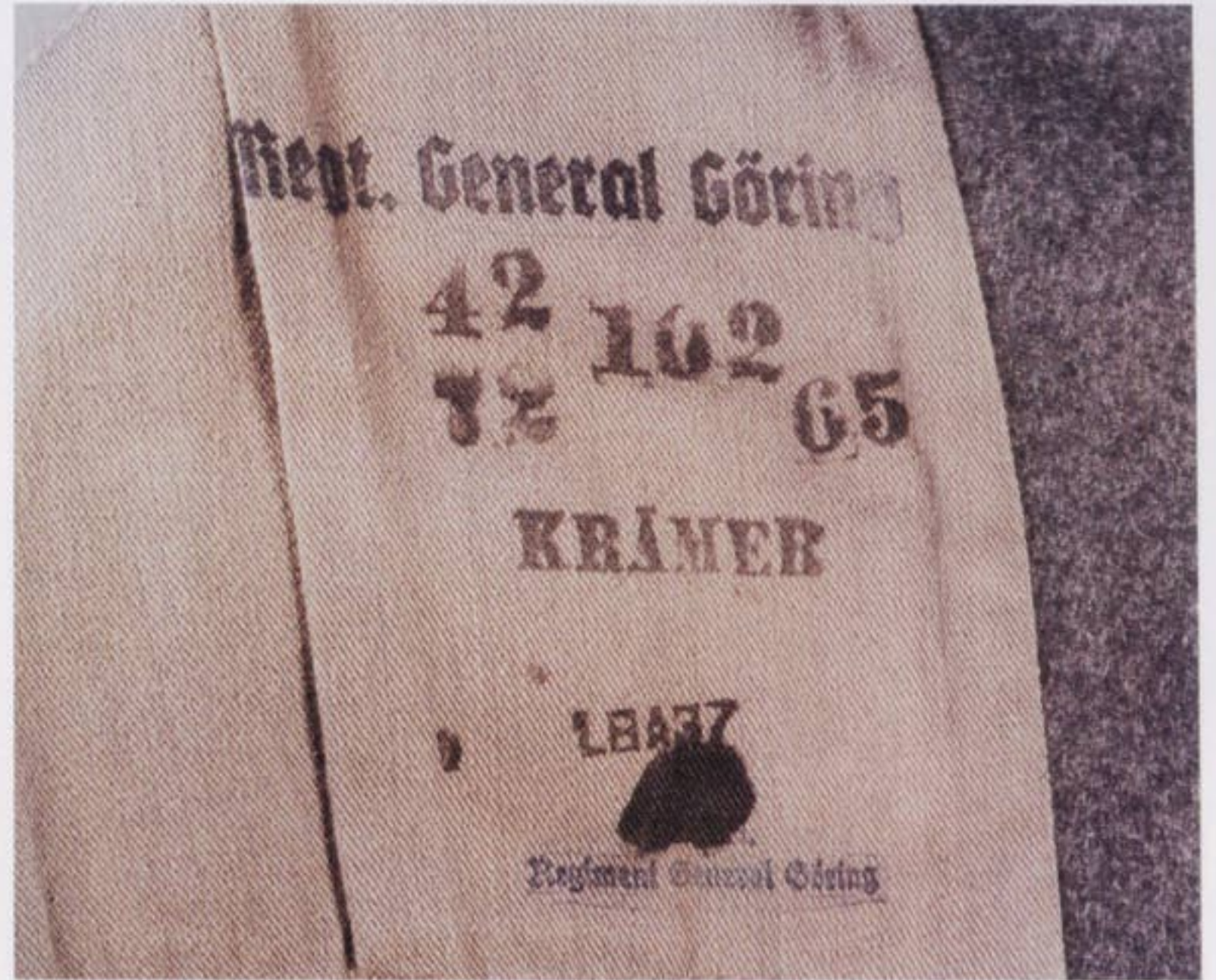




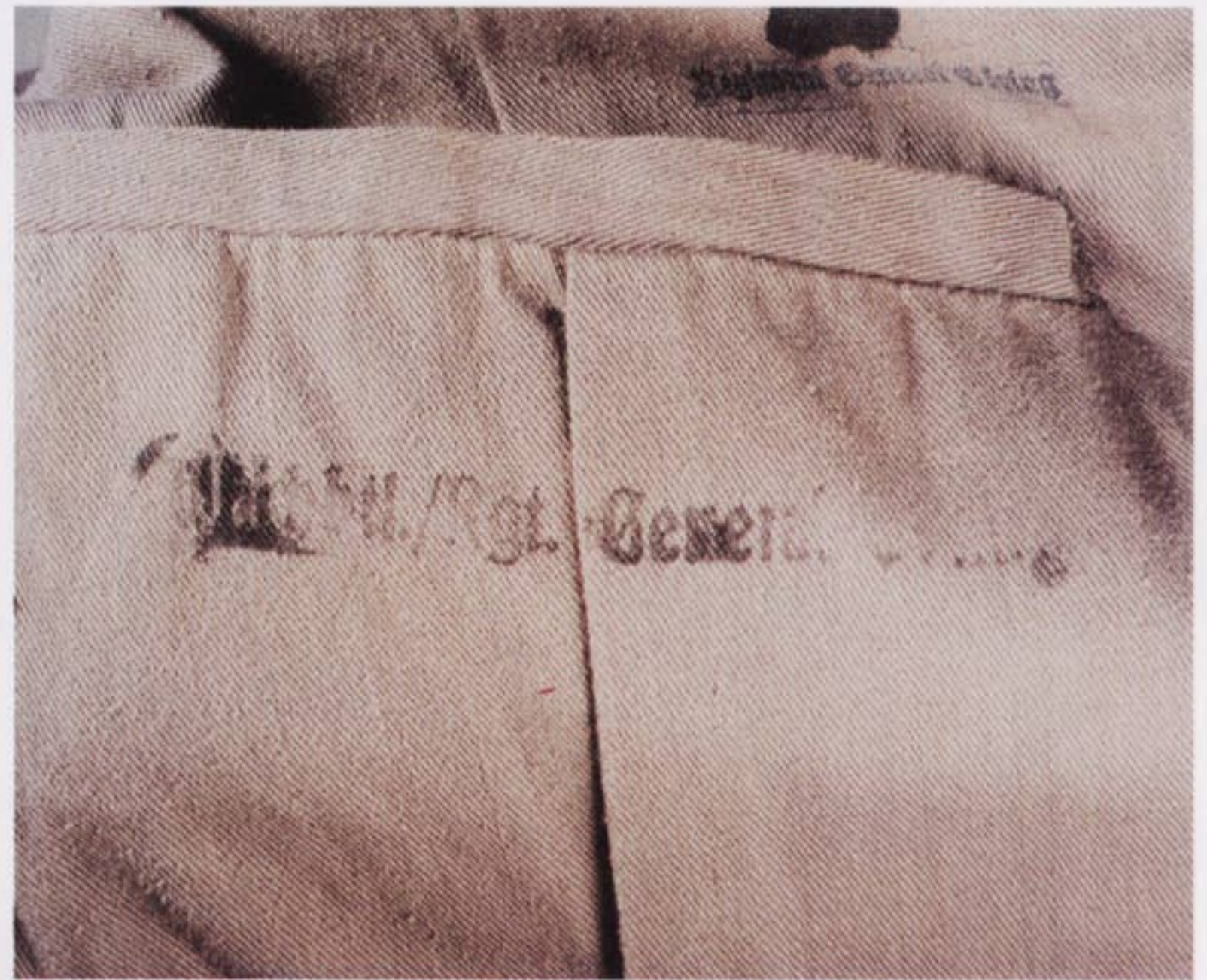

Uniforms of Admiral Karl-Jesko von Puttkamer



Von Puttkamer's blue reefer jacket. Von Puttkamer was Hitler's naval adjutant and a member of Hitler's so-called "inner circle." (*Moran*)

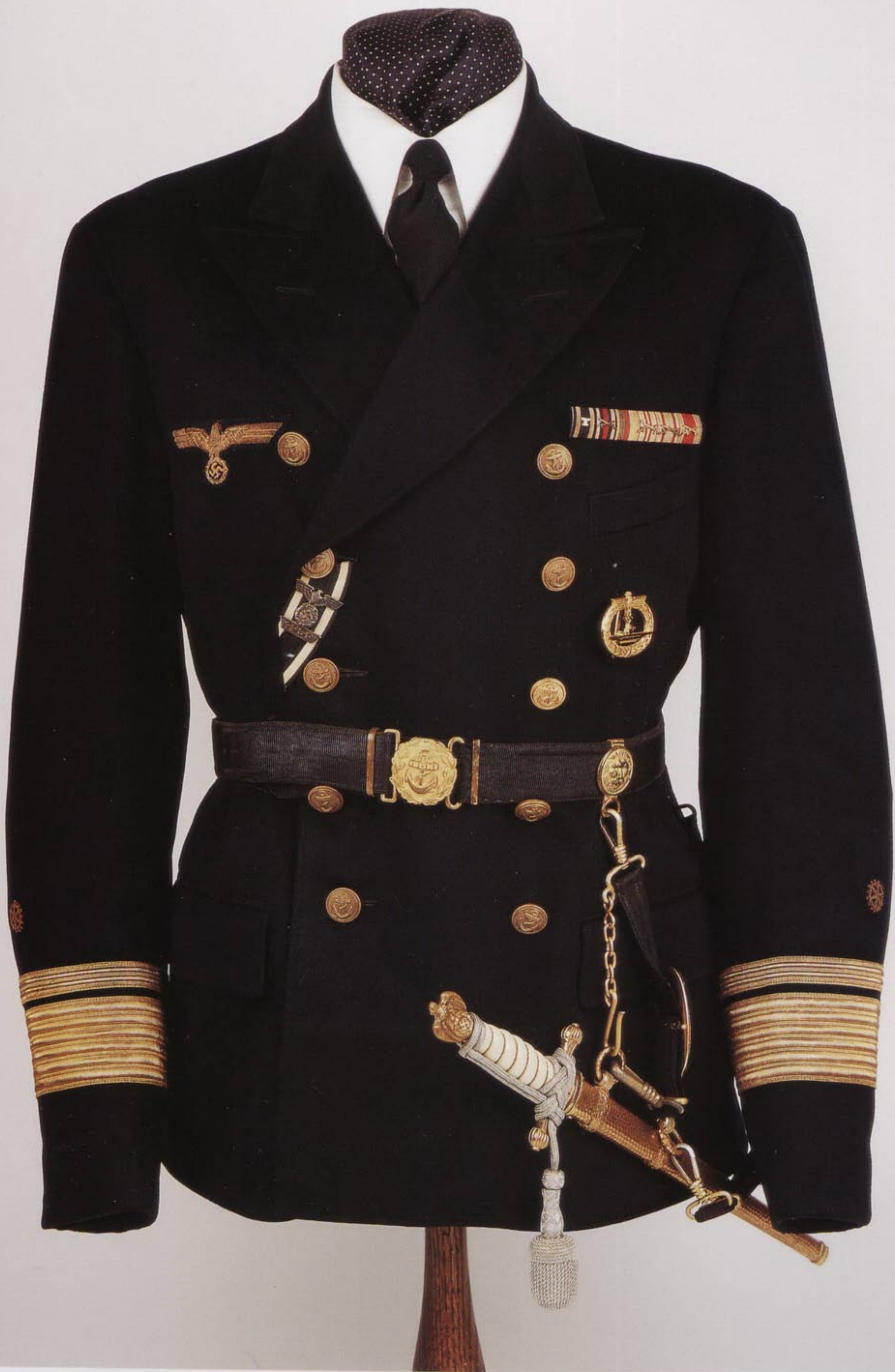

The coat is displayed with the waist belt and dagger. It is an early war uniform dated 1936.











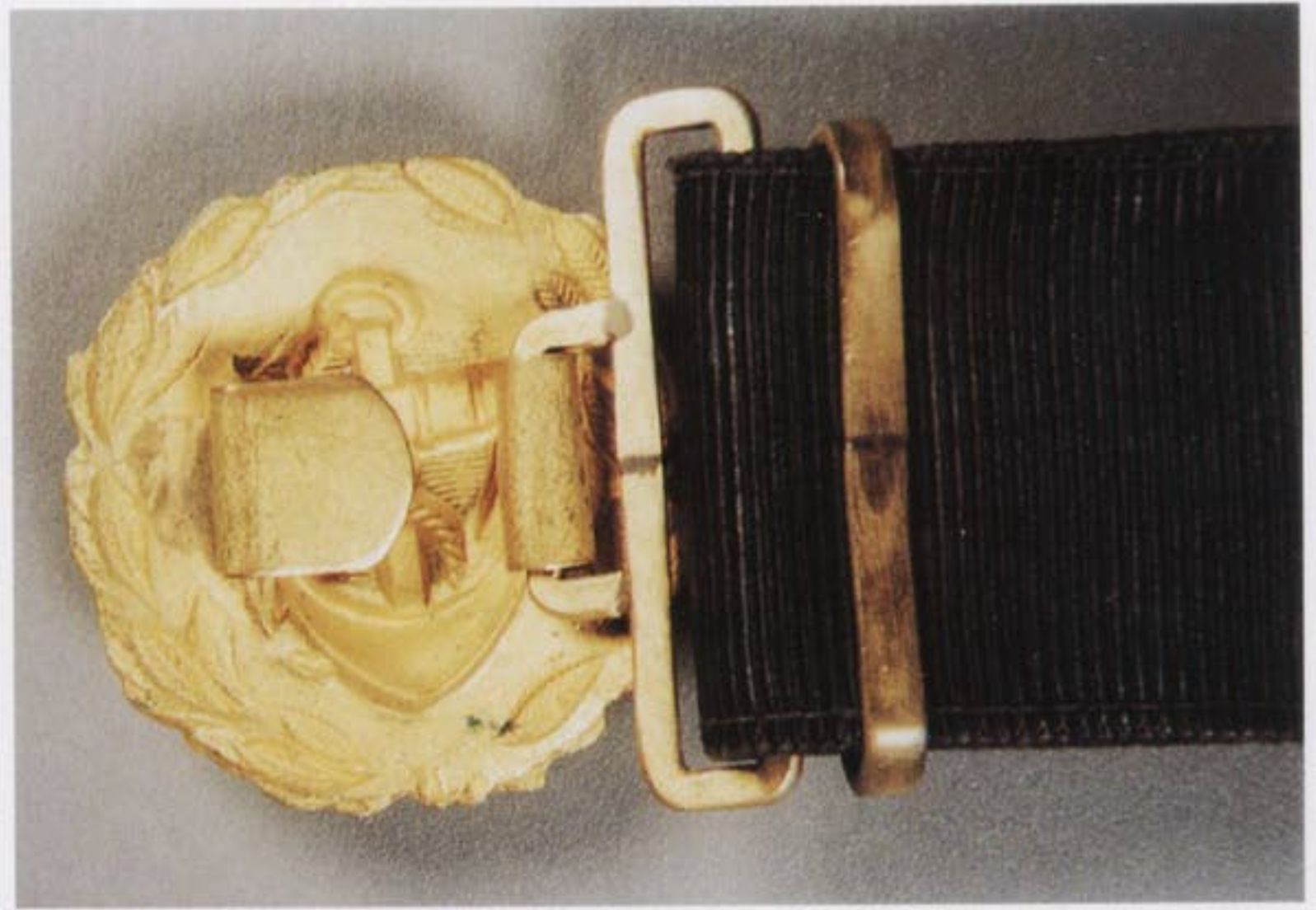


Detail of World War I Iron Cross ribbon in button hole with 1939 Spange for second award.

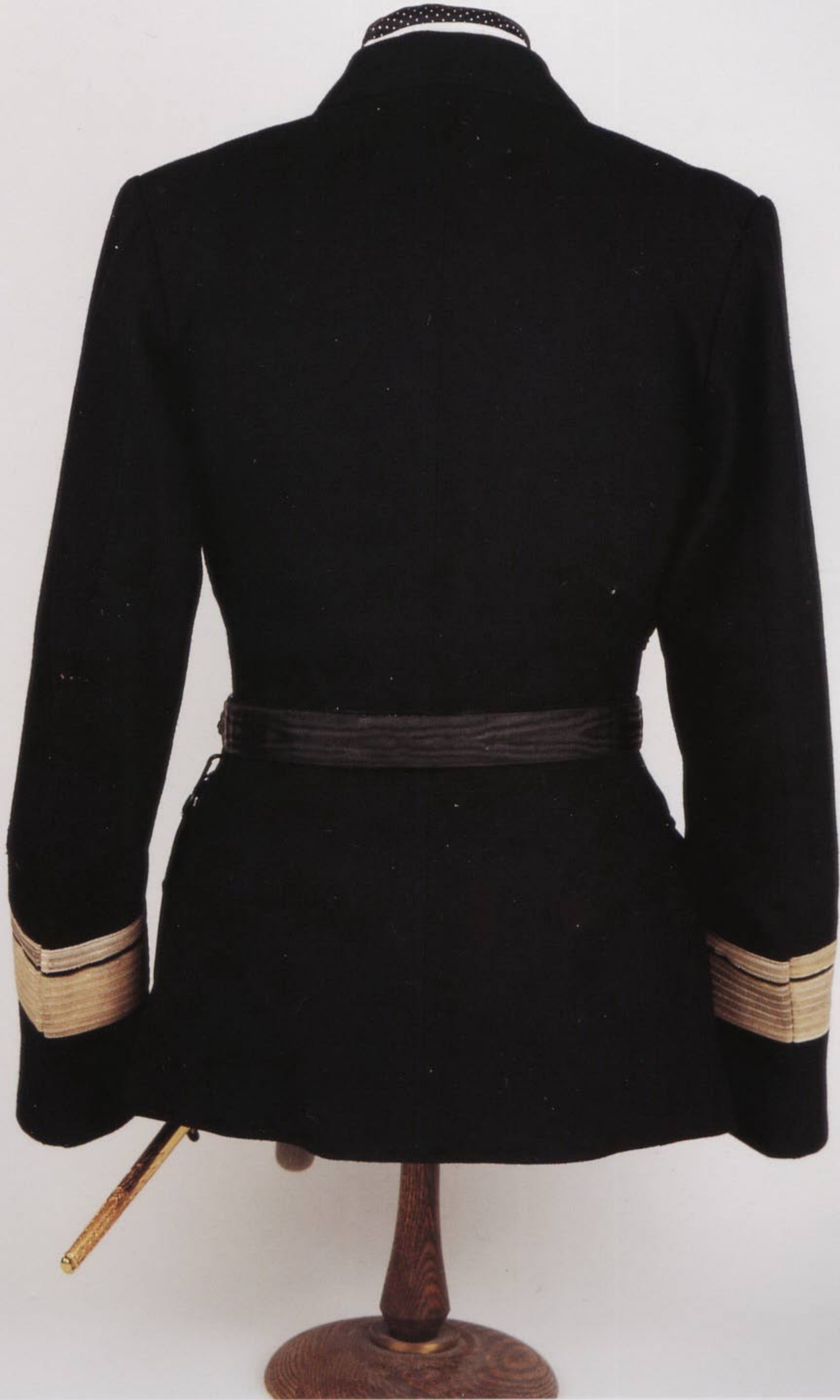
Detail of belt fittings.

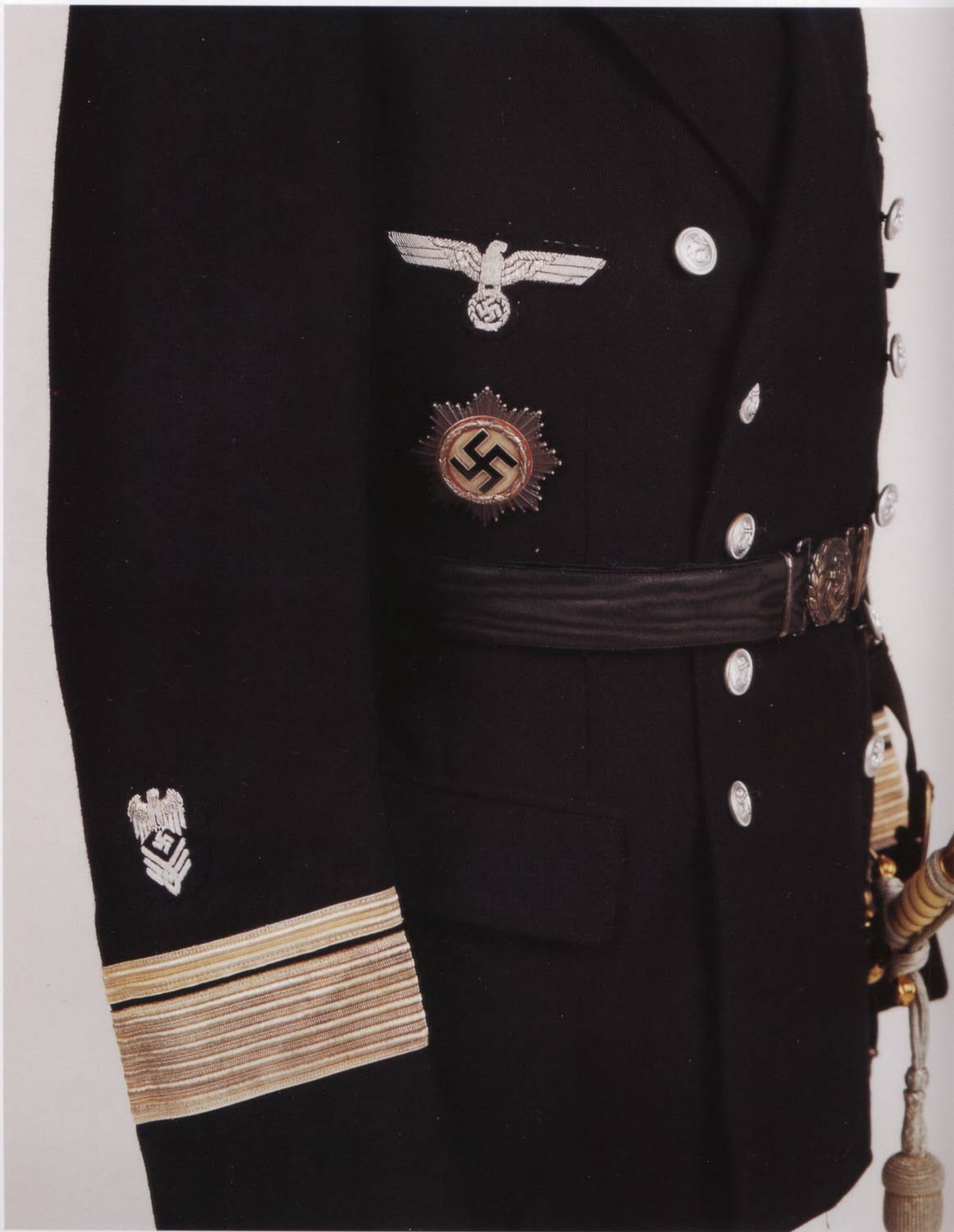


The Reefer Jacket of a Kriegsmarine Administrative Konteradmiral - Verwaltungsbeamte, Hohere Dienst Grad

This jacket has silver bullion trim which indicates that it is administrative. It features a sewn on ribbon bar, and all buttons are marked "Kriegsmarine 42."

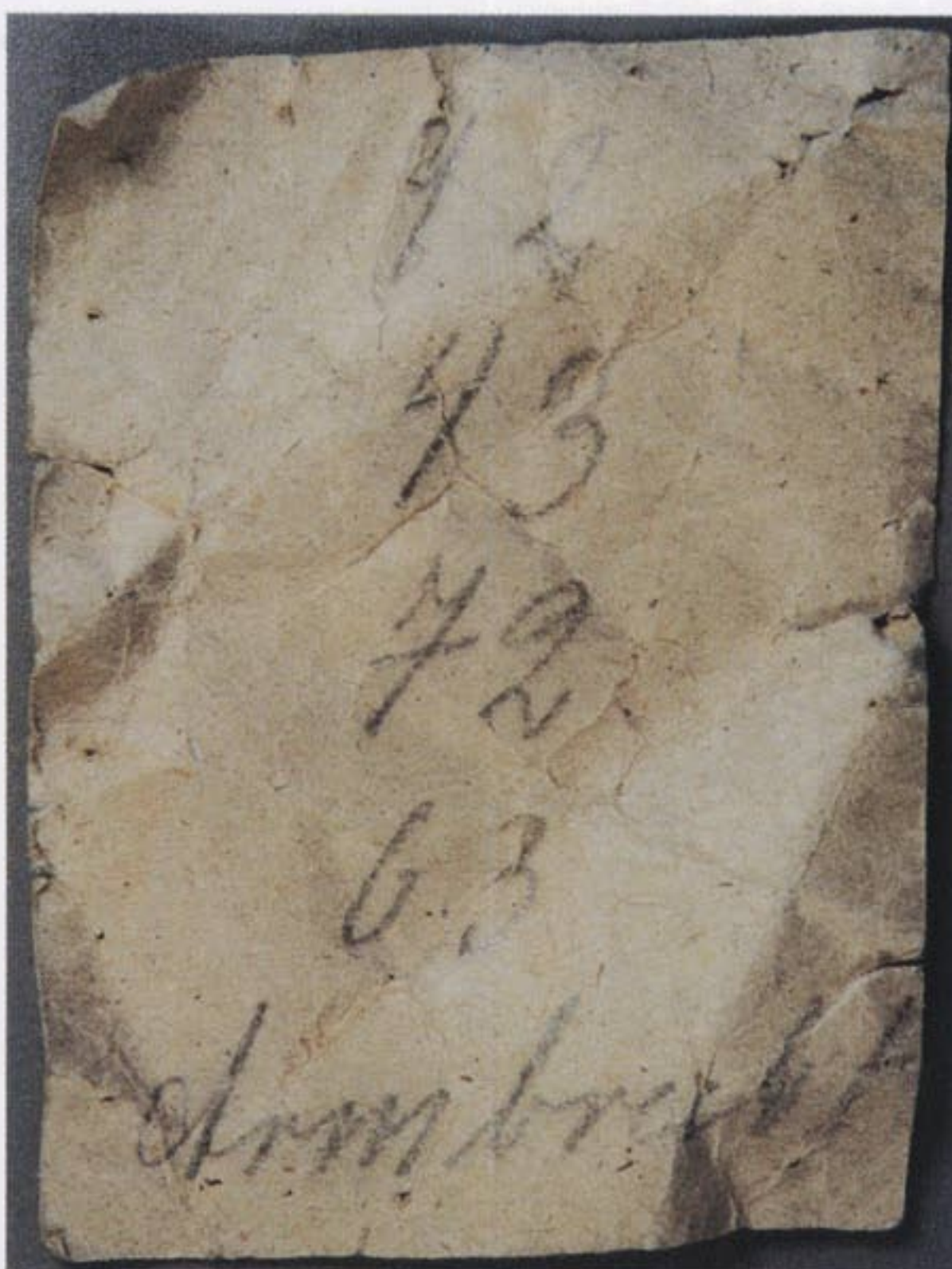










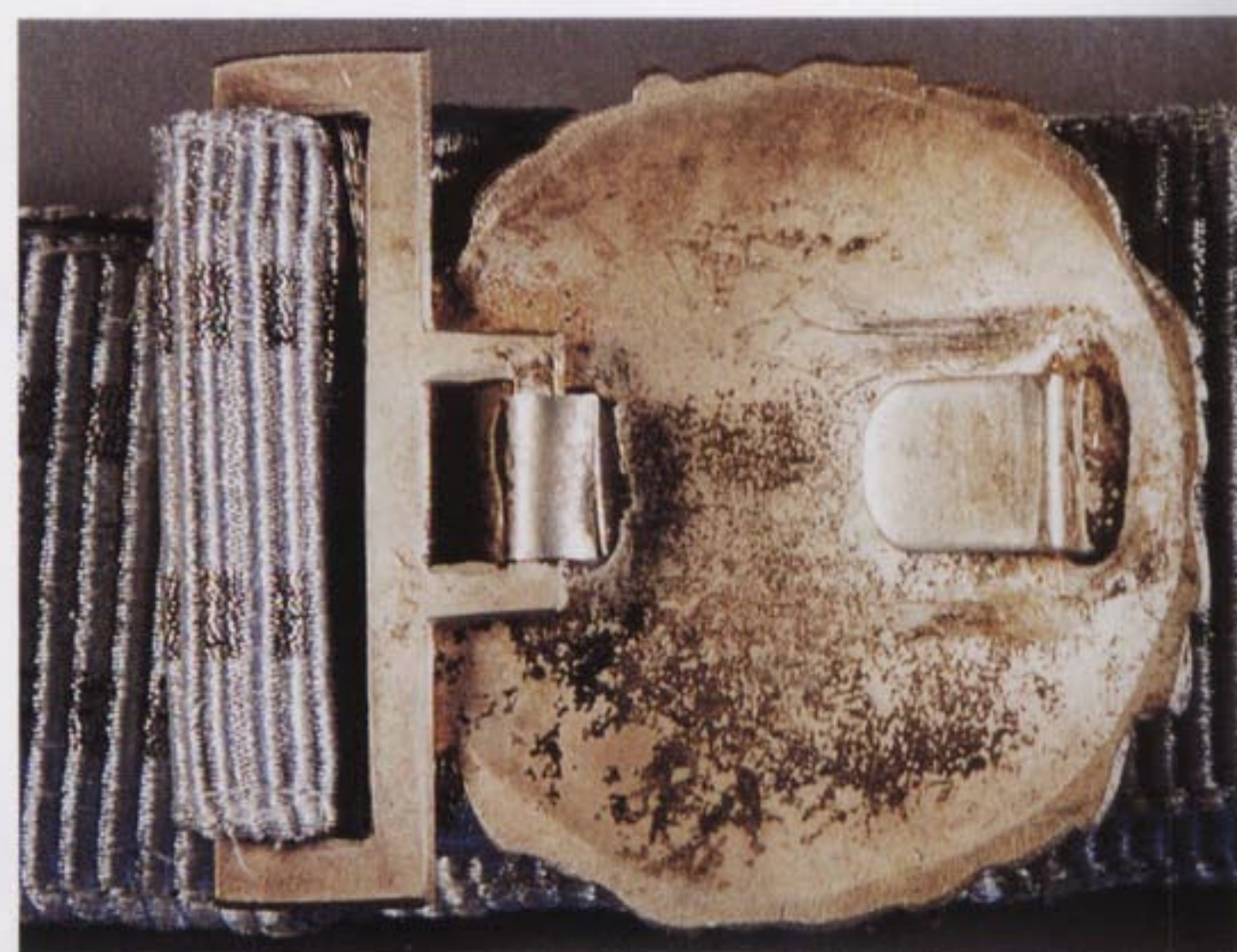

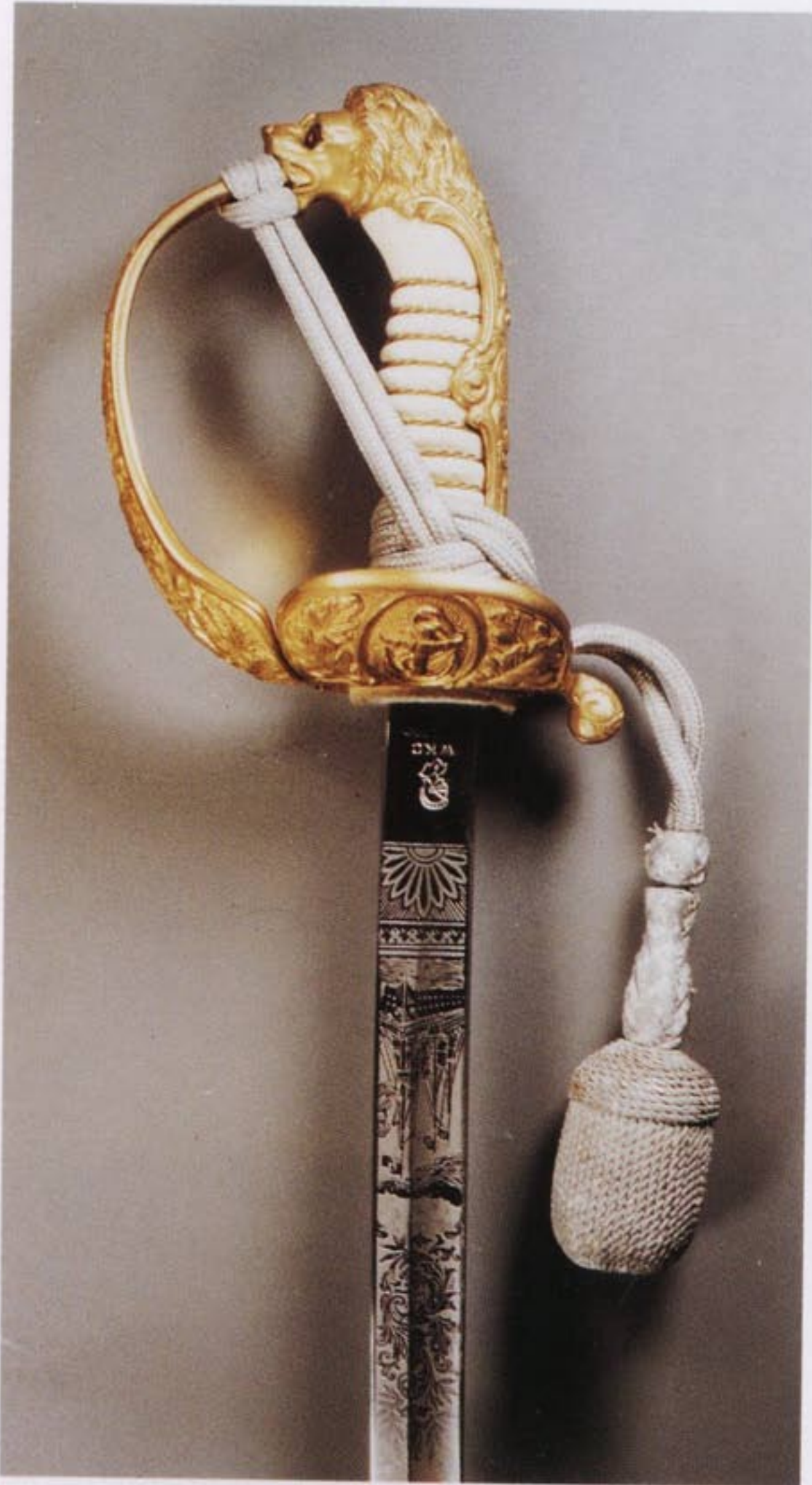

Uniform of Korvettenkapitän Heinrich Bleichrodt

SS and Police

The Uniform of an Allgemeine-SS Oberführer

This coat has the first type rank insignia worn from August of 1929 to April of 1942. The sleeve title is for SS Sub-district XXX. The Old Fighter's Chevron is on the right sleeve and the SS Kampfbinde (brassard) is on the left sleeve. The tunic is displayed with the brocade dress belt.

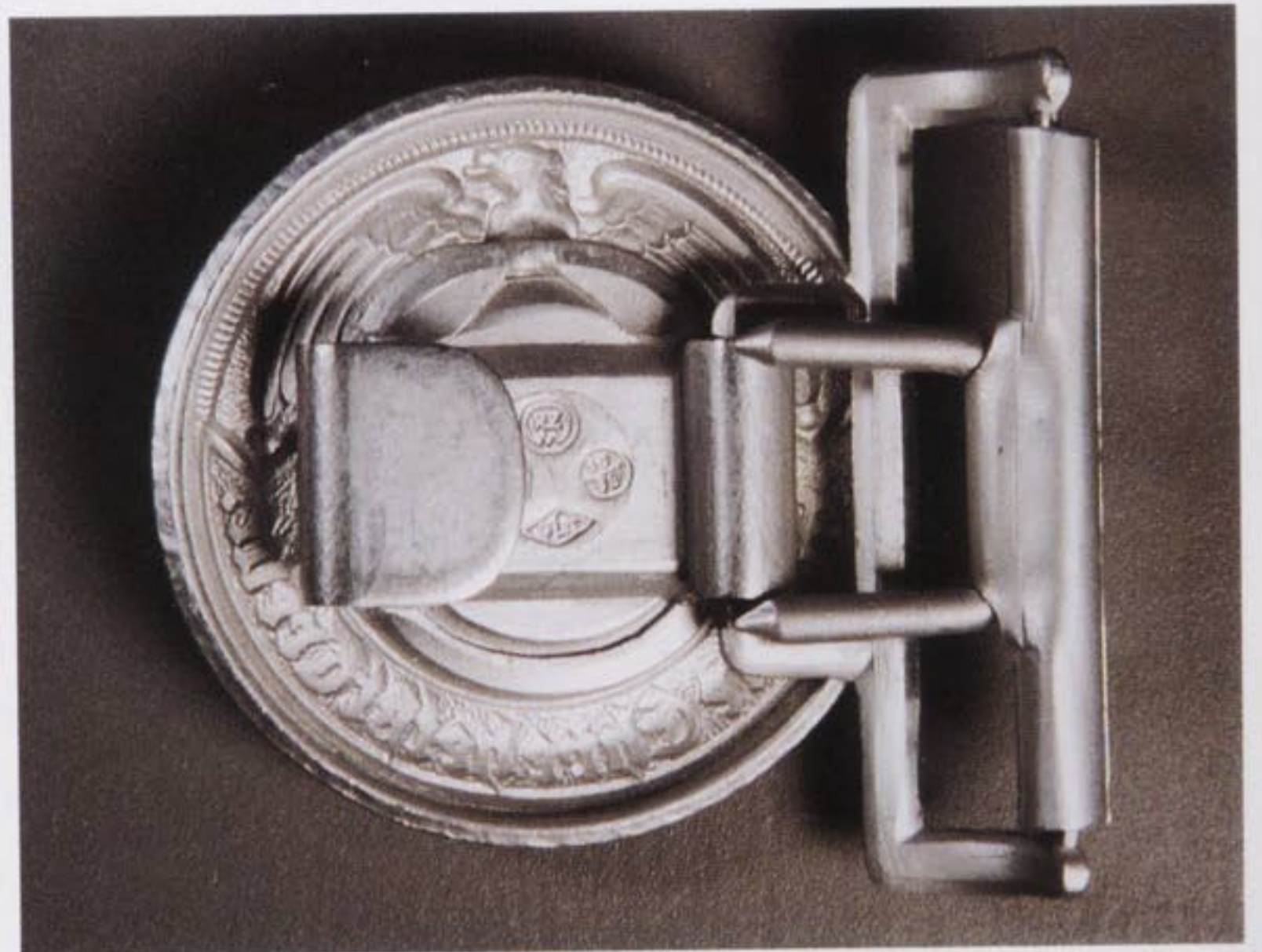

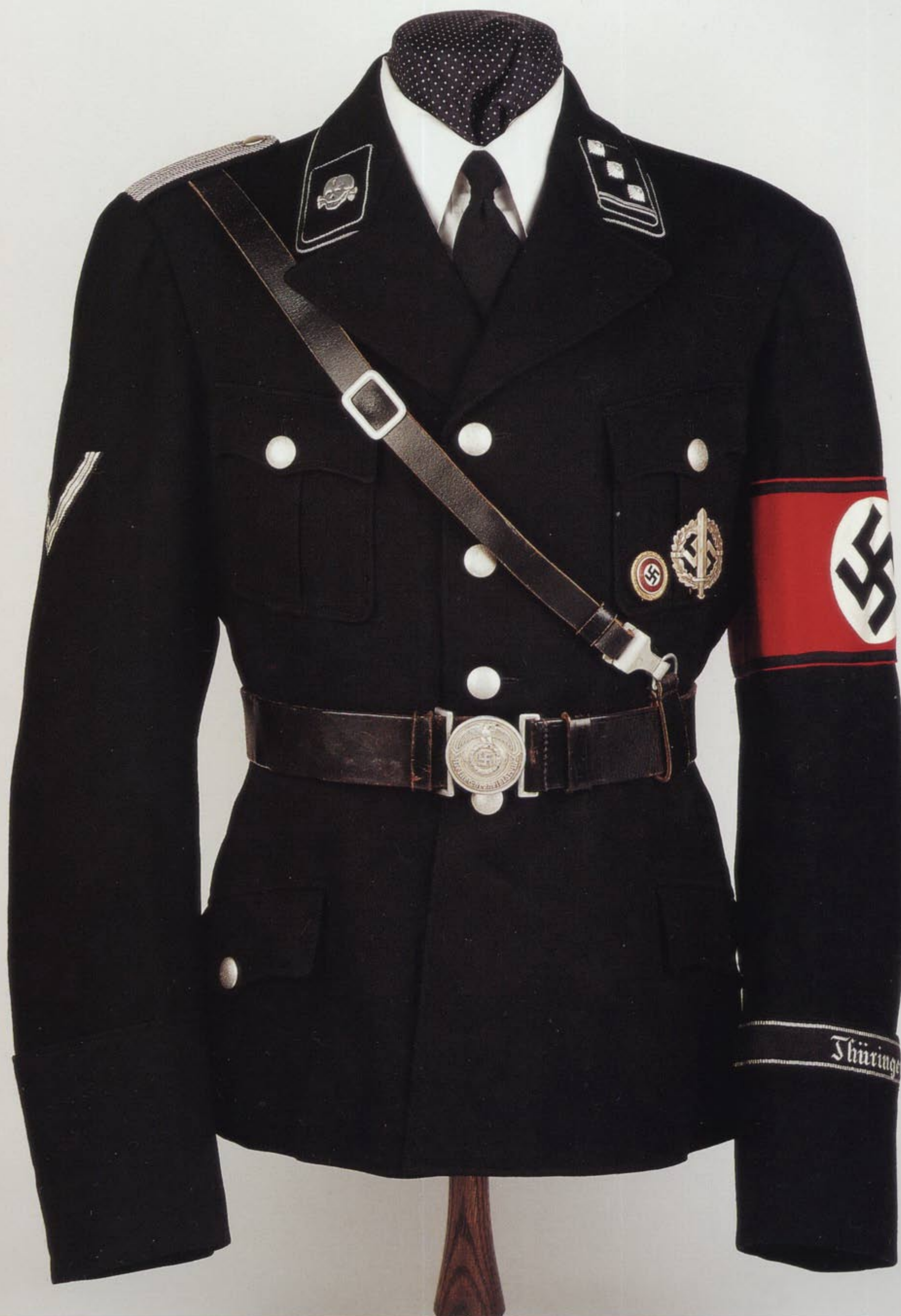

This coat is displayed with the leather officer's belt and cross strap.

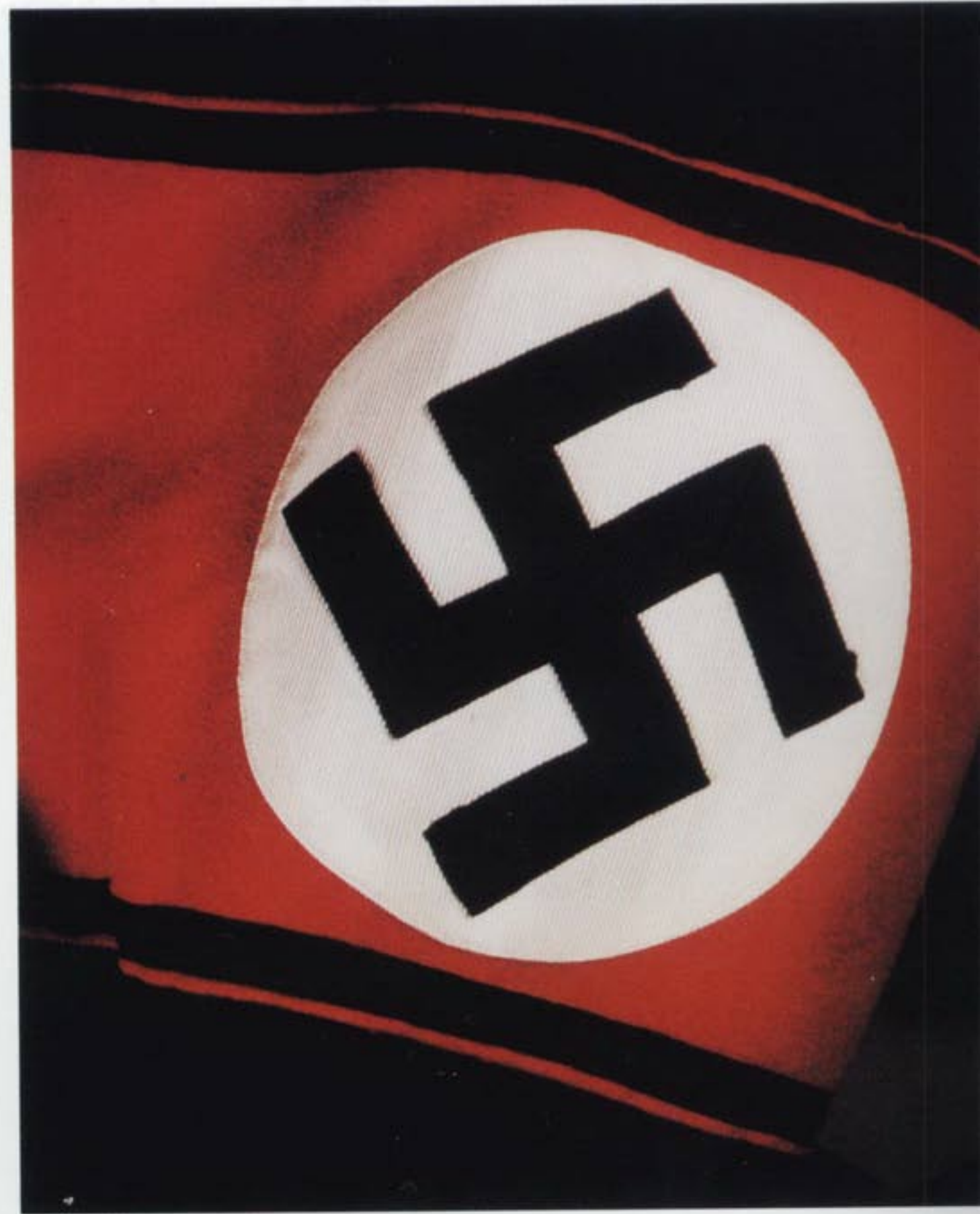
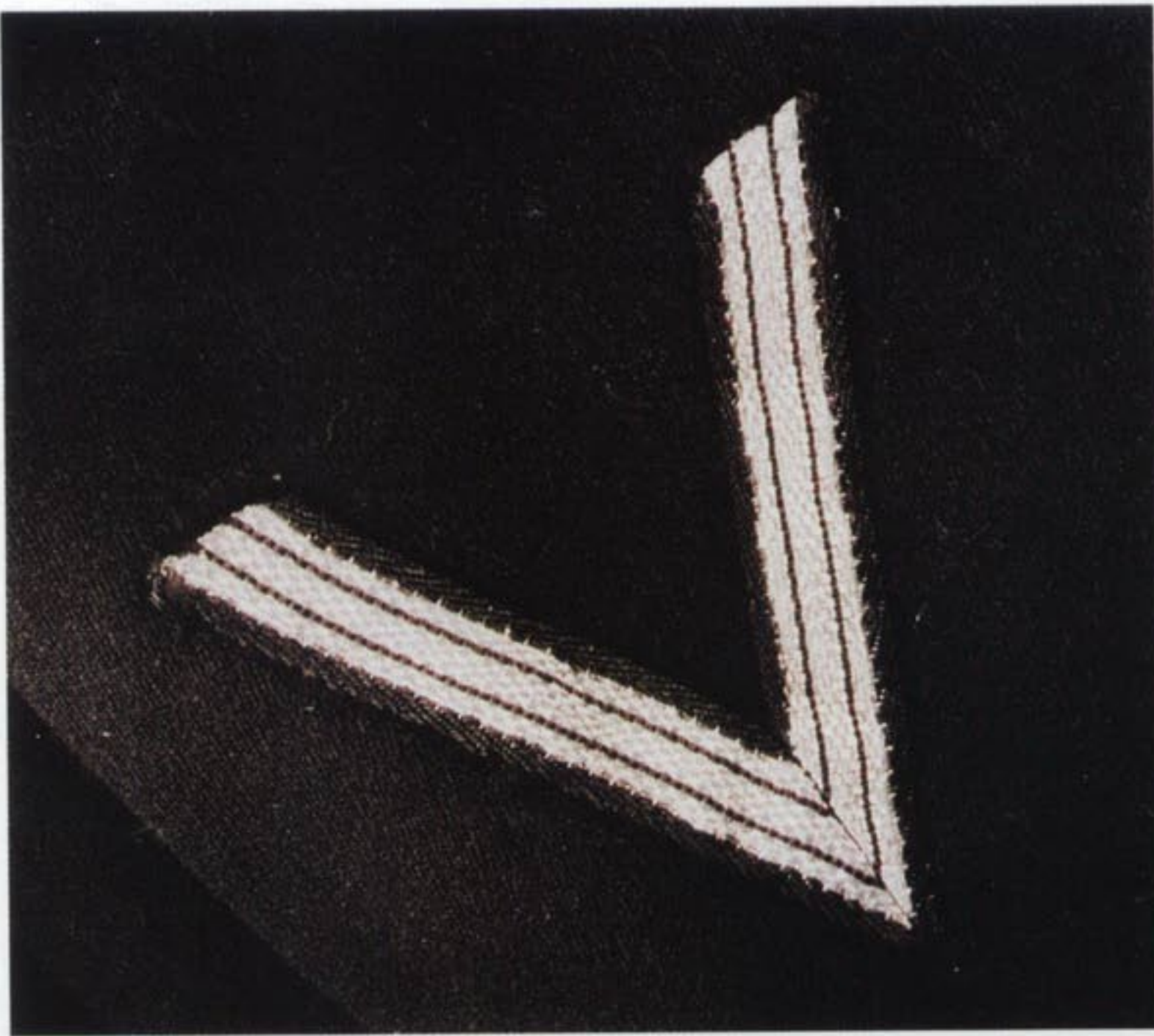










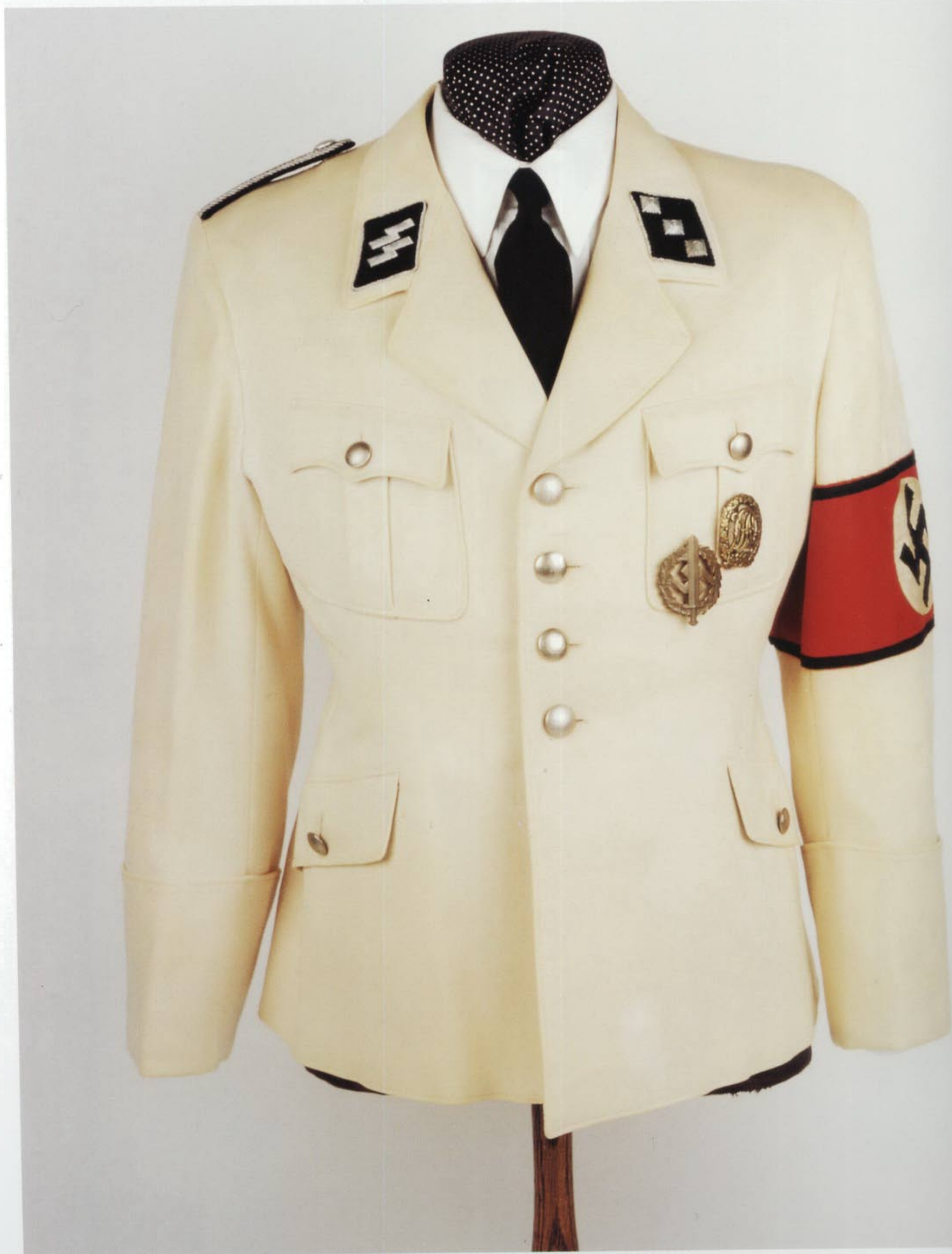

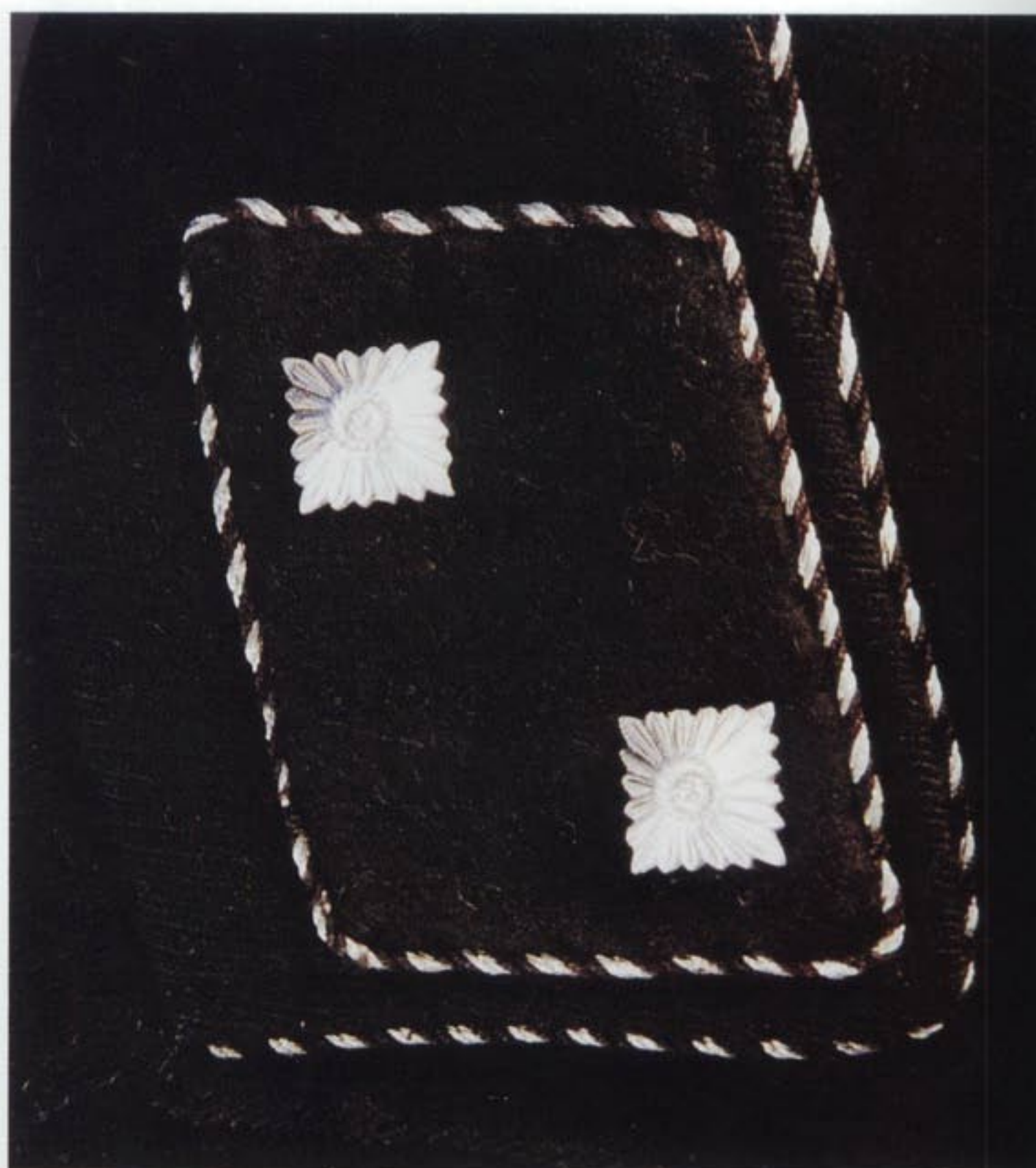

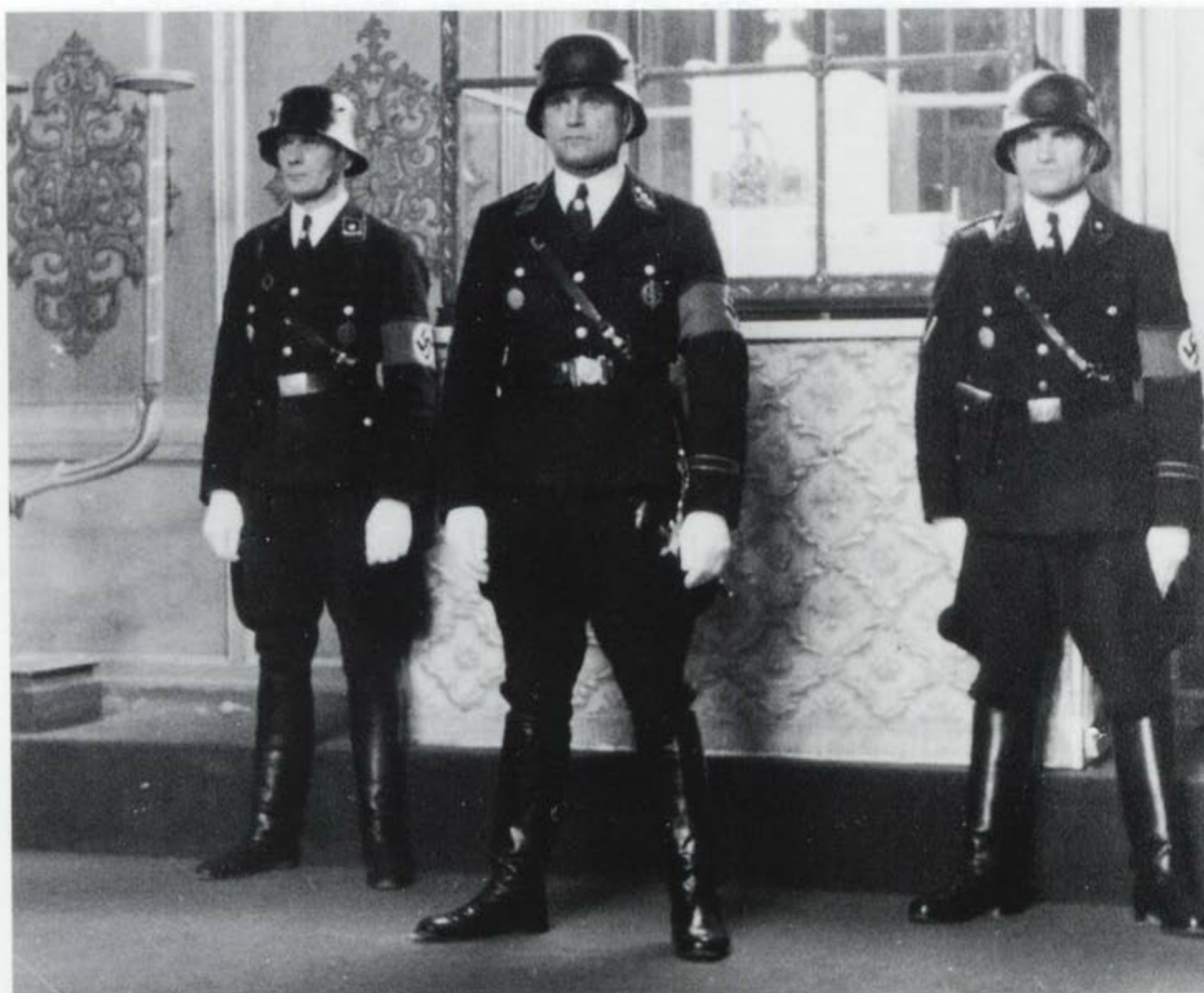

Enlisted Man's Italian 29th Waffen-SS Grenadier Division Tunic

This tunic has private purchase SS style sleeve insignia which is possibly hand embroidered or single run machine embroidered. Collar tabs are also private purchase.

Enlisted 13th Waffen-SS Handschar Division Denim (Reed Green) Tunic

This tunic has regulation collar tabs, eagle on left sleeve, and "edelweiss" mountain unit insignia on right sleeve. Note loops on left front pocket are heavily stitched and oval outline may indicate that the Anti-partisan Badge was worn. Note also the short cut lower pockets. (*Matthew Reinert, MHS*)







Enlisted 13th Waffen-SS Handschar Division Tunic

This tunic is made of course wool and is an unusually large size. The breast pockets were removed (which was common practice in the unit) loops for medals were added. The tunic features standard mountain piped shoulder boards and standard machine embroidered Croatian checkerboard insignia on left sleeve. The NCO quality sleeve eagle appears to be sewn over an earlier sleeve eagle. Note the early hand embroidered collar tabs. (Matthew Reinert, MHS)











Early Waffen-SS Denim (Reed Green) Tunic with Pleated Pockets

This tunic is constructed of heavy material and has early machine embroidered collar tabs and sleeve eagle. The insignia is tightly sewn in place. Shoulder boards are piped pink for Panzer troops. (Matthew Reinert, MHS)







Waffen-SS Officer's Overcoat

This coat was worn by an SS Untersturmführer of the 20th Waffen-Grenadier Division der SS (Estonian volunteers). (*Shea*)

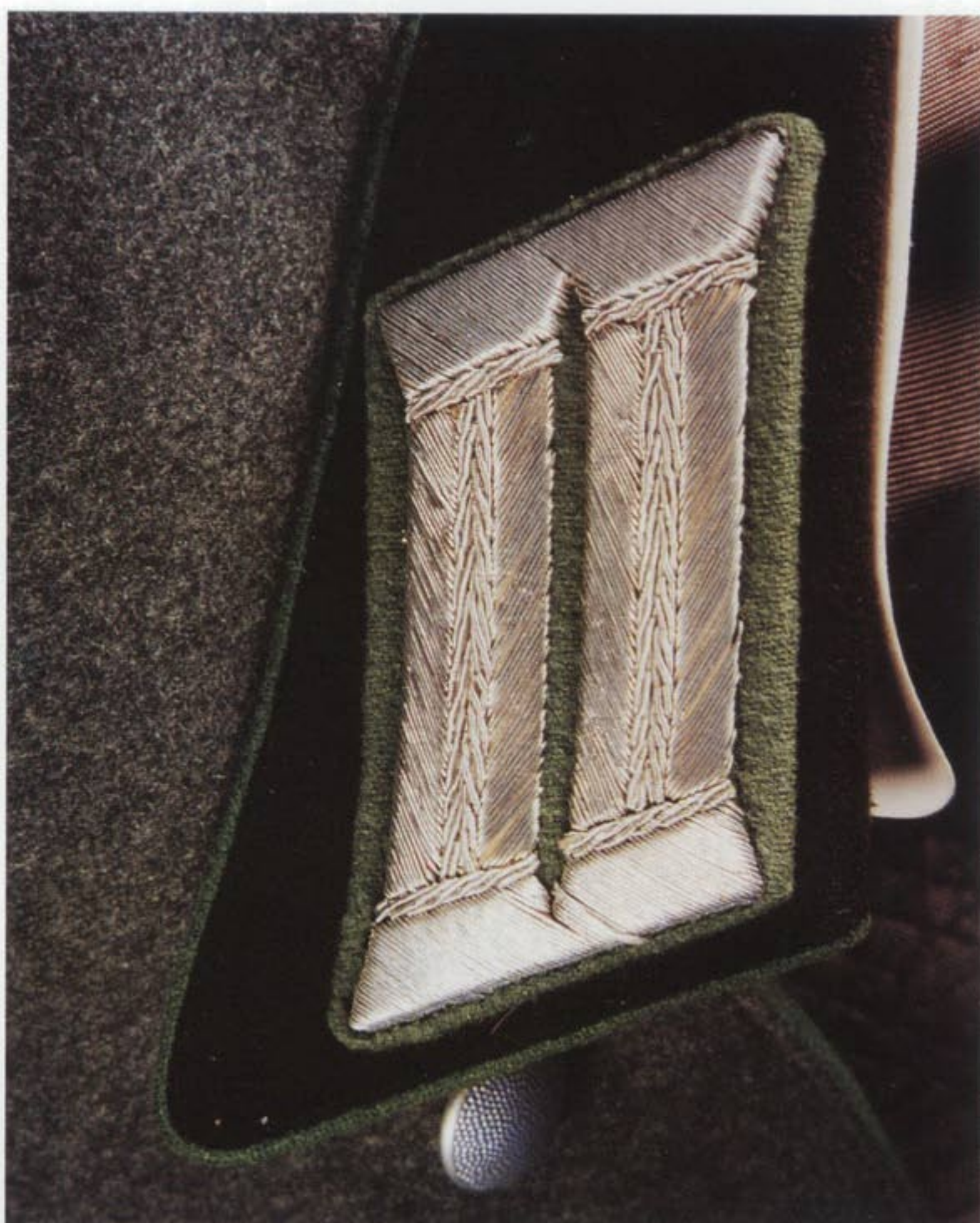
This tunic has a silver bullion hand embroidered sleeve insignia and SS-Runes on the lower left pocket. It is a very high quality garment.

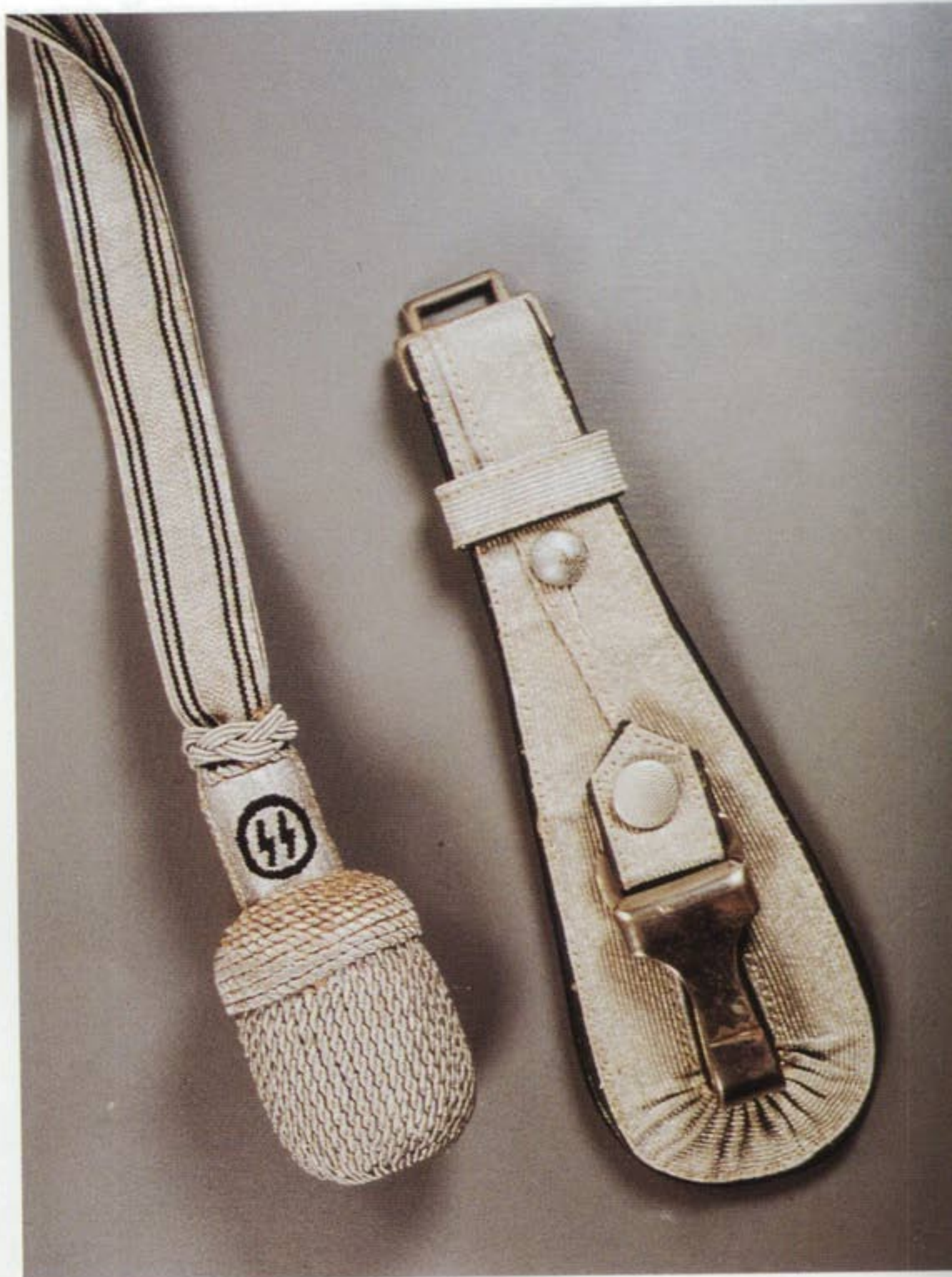

Political and HJ

Brown Shirt of Reichskanzler Adolf Hitler

This brown shirt was manufactured by the firm of Wilhem Holters, Berlin and is dated July 1935. Two unique features of the shirt are the tie release strap under the collar, and the cloth loop on the right shoulder for holding the cross strap in place. It was liberated along with other personal items from Hitler's Munich apartment in May of 1945 by 1stLt. Philip Ben Lieber. (Shea)

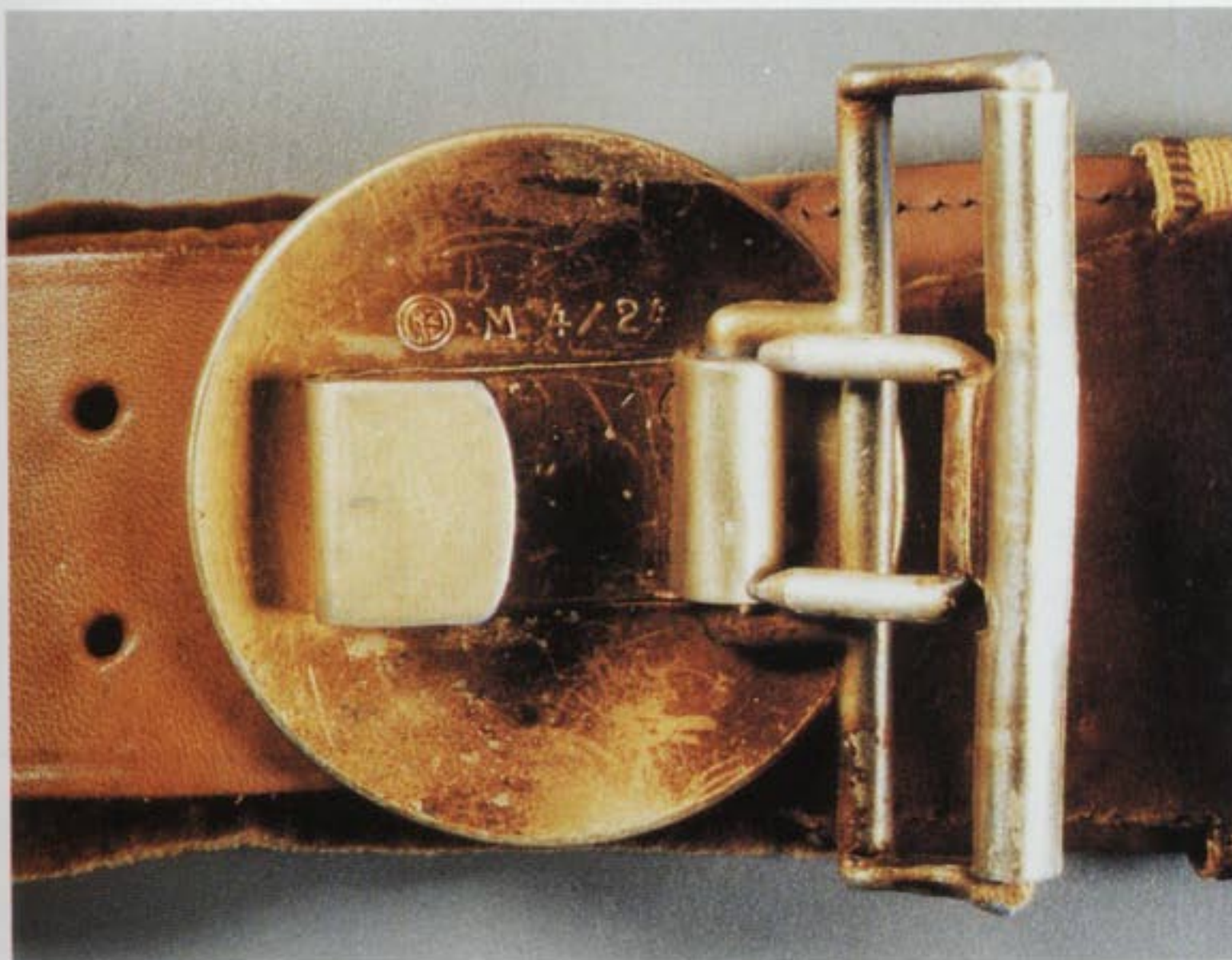
This tunic is for a Stellenleiter in the Gauleitung. It is displayed with the gold brocade belt and gold political aiguillete.

This coat was worn with dark brown trousers. Rank was indicated by collar tabs and insignia of function level was shown on the sleeve title. The color of the sleeve band piping indicated the state group "Ortsgruppe." This example was made in Italy. Also shown is the matching visor cap.













Hitler Youth Third Pattern Service Leader's Tunic

Olive brown wool tunic which features a "Nord Hamburg" Gebiet triangle with traditions bar on the left sleeve and an HJ arm band. The shoulderboards are black, piped in silver for the rank of Bannführer.



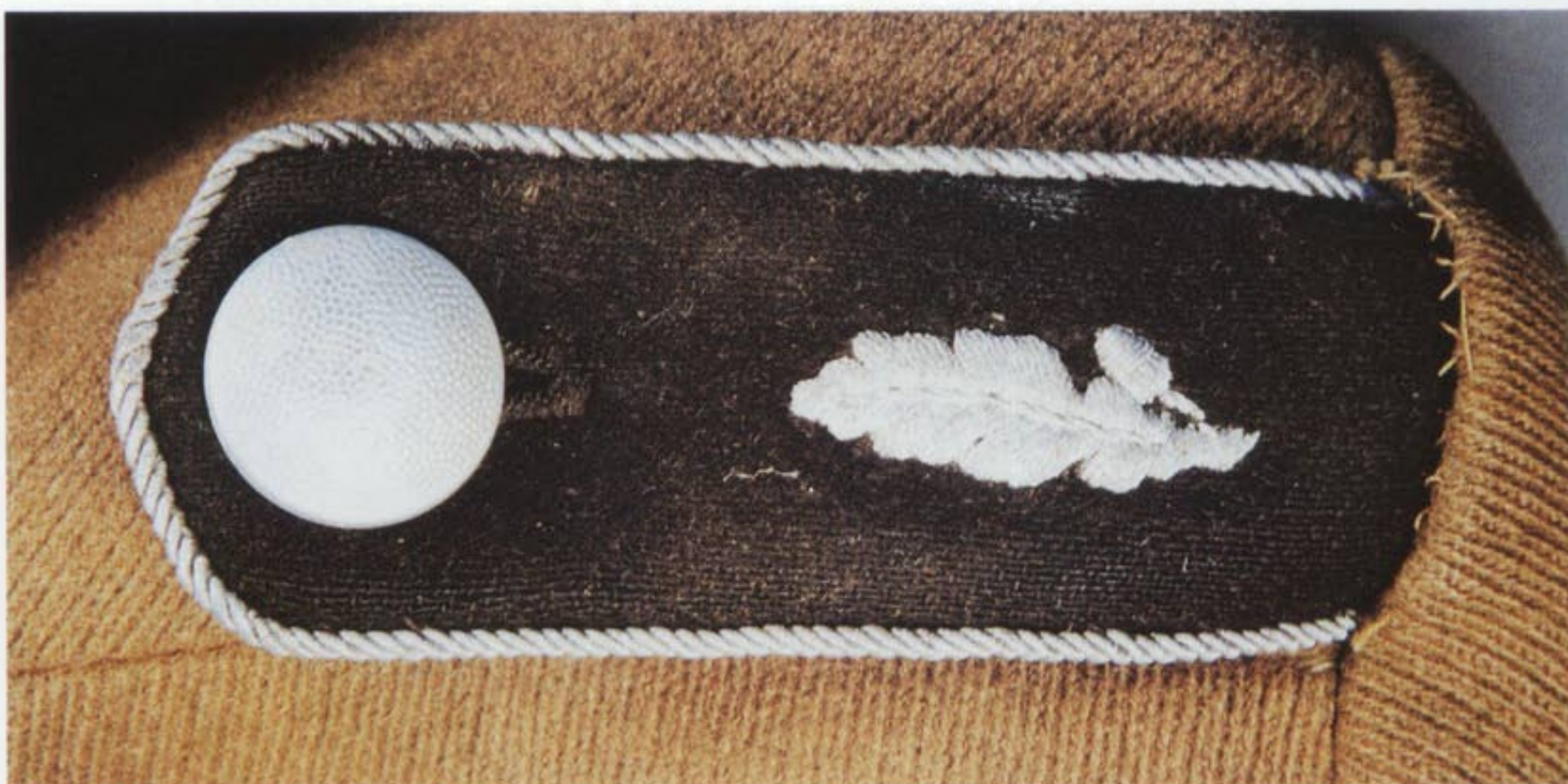

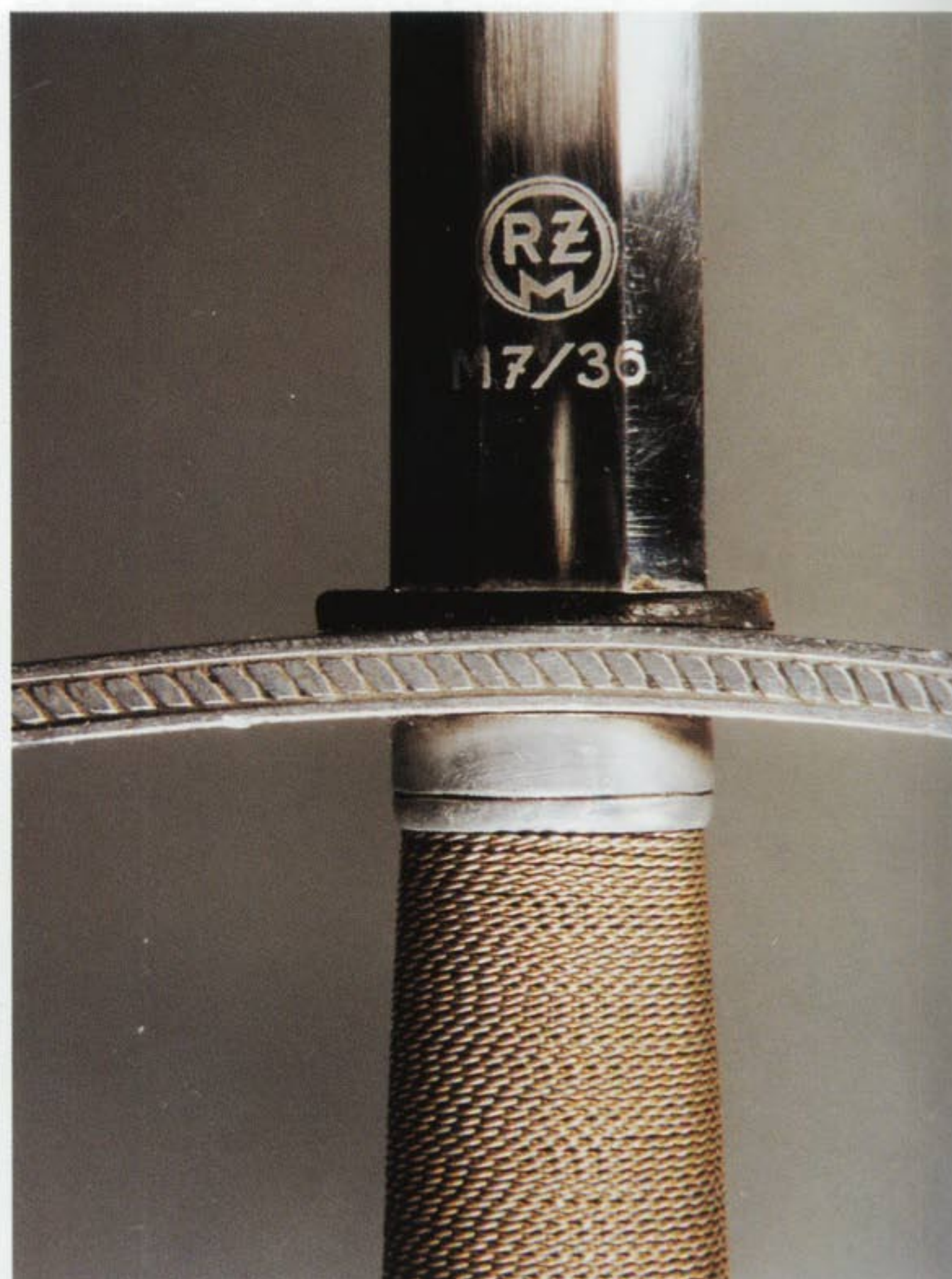
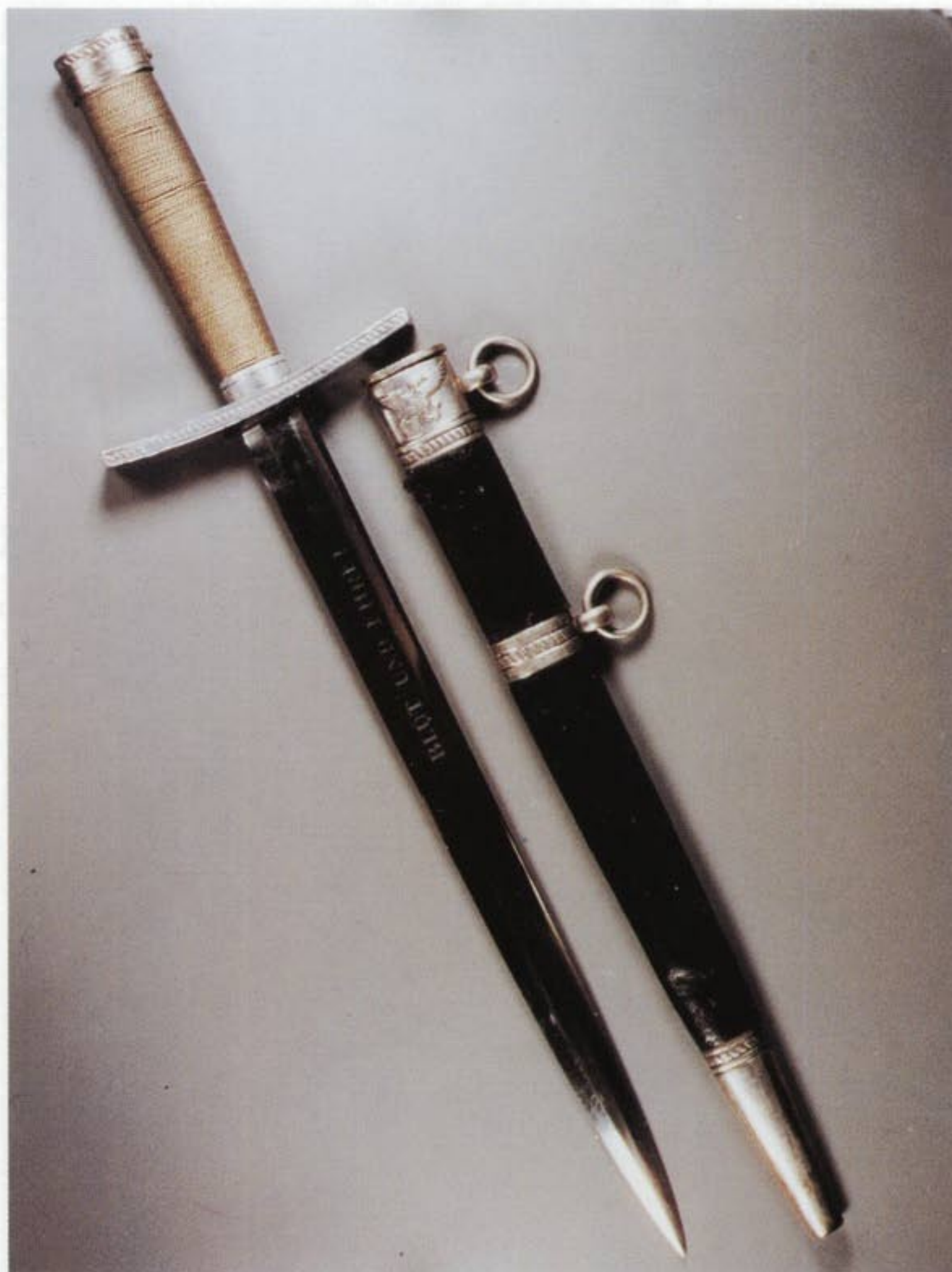


Shoulder board detail of a Hitler Youth Oberstammführer.

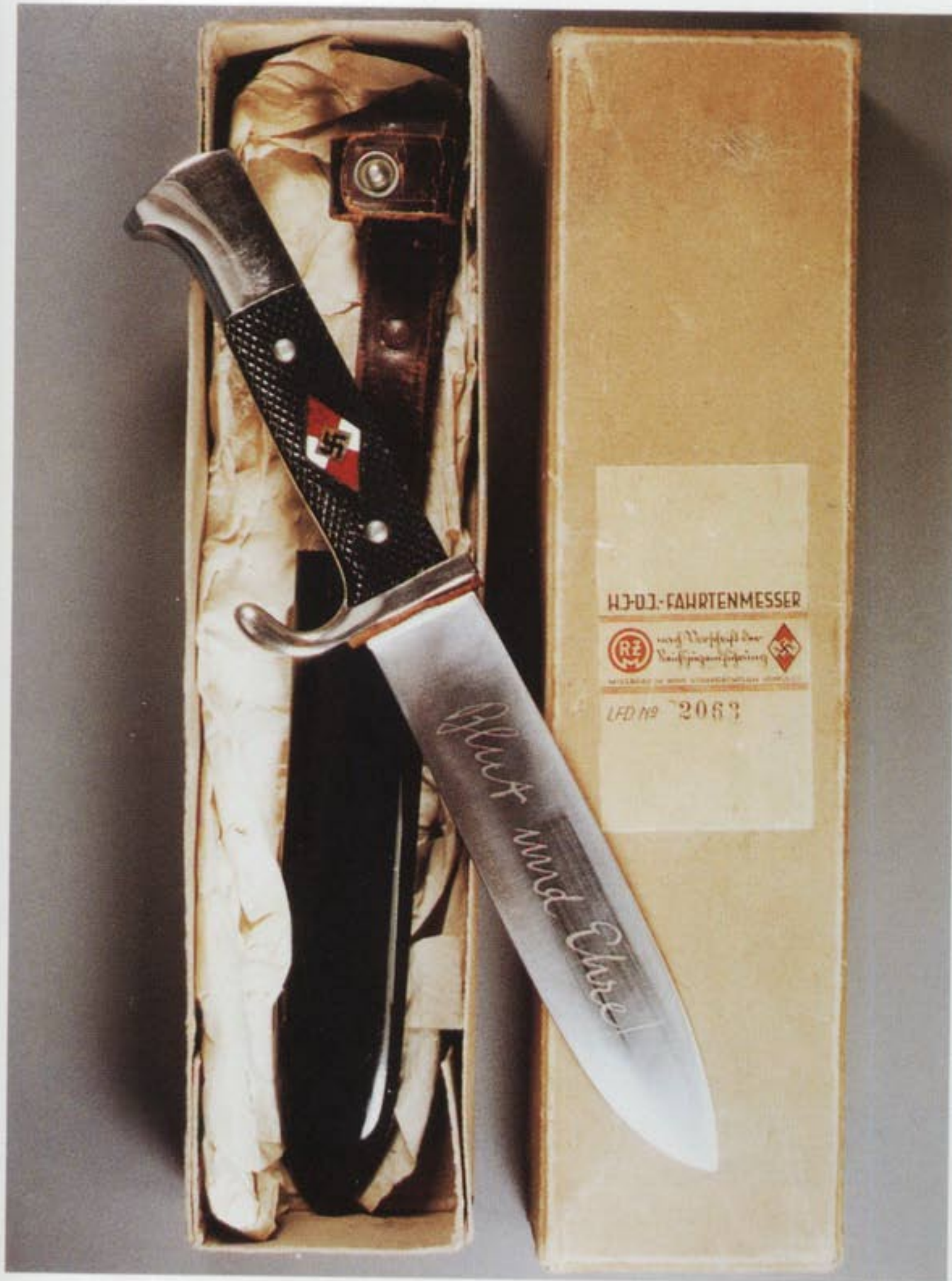

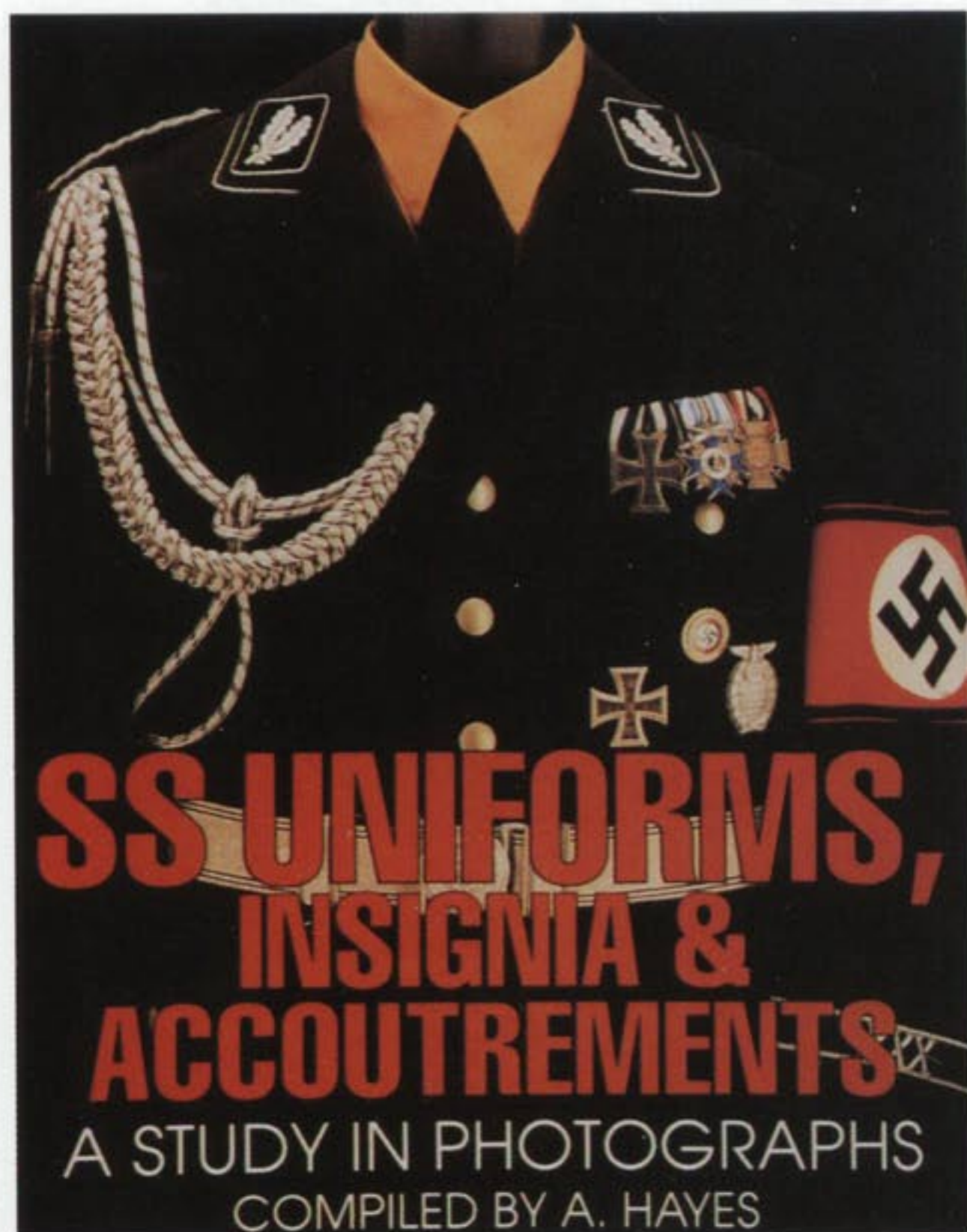

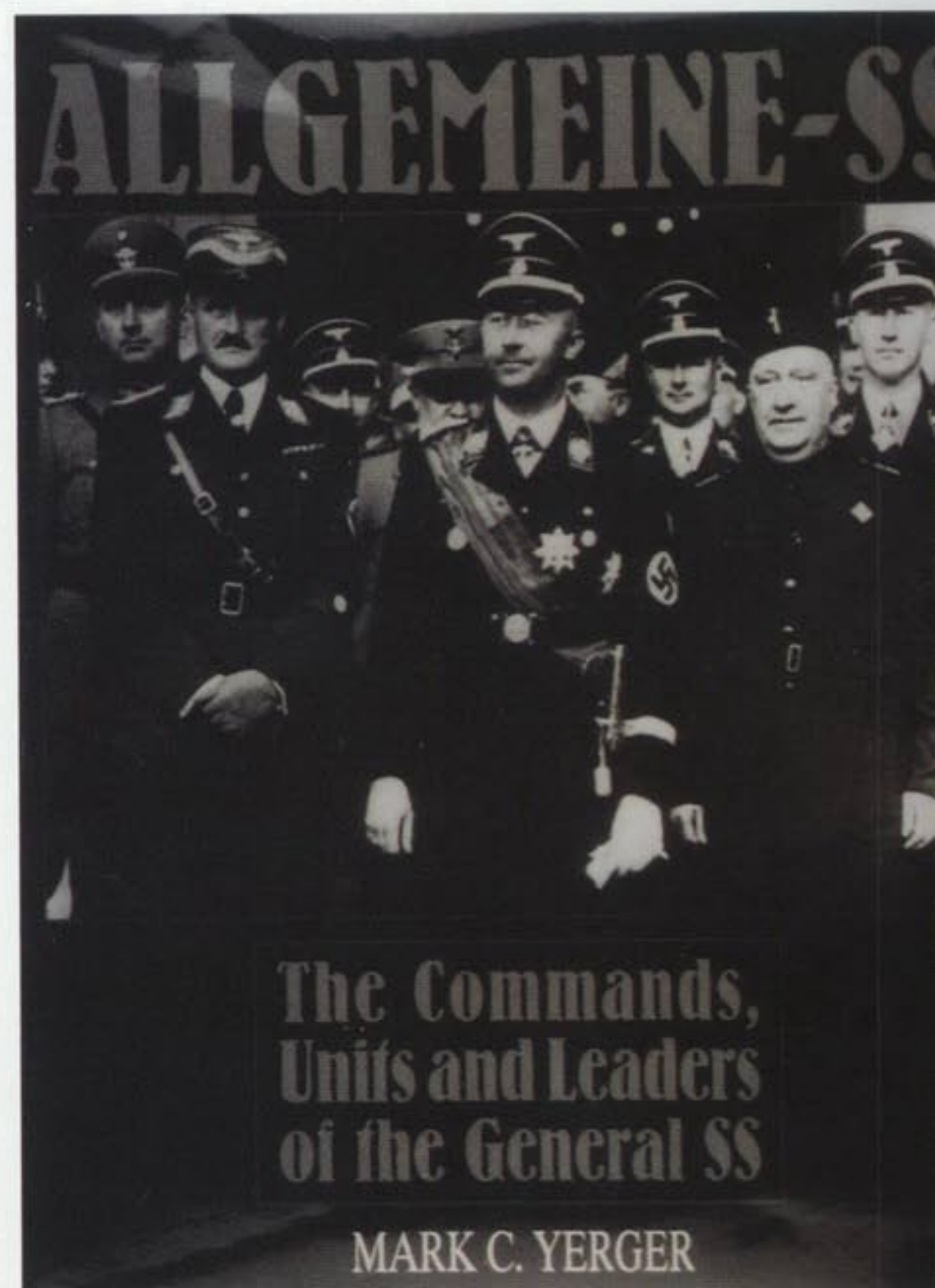
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
